Quarterly Issues/Programs List

KPHT provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **United Way of Pueblo:** Andrea Aragon and Lawrence Kochis talk about their mentoring programming of business people in Pueblo mentoring youth. The non profits that benefit from the United Way and how you can be a volunteer.
- **Amy Sylvester Colorado Springs Fire Department:** Following the devastation of the Black Forest wild fire which destroyed over 500 homes Amy outlined steps which can be taken by home owners in Colorado Springs & El Paso County to make their home safer. The discussion included types of building materials, vegetation, distance of evergreens from the home, rock vs mulch and construction feature of the home.
- **Co State University:** With extreme Summer drought conditions in Colorado coupled with area watering restrictions Southern Colorado Gardeners are becoming frustrated with the futility of thier efforts. We spoke to Colorado Master Gardeners about xerascaping, rock vs mulch, plants that do well in CO, irrigation, fertilization and reclamation in the Waldo Canyon burn area. - **El Pueblo:** Sherri Baca, Greg Sims, Elizabeth Riffle explain how things work inside the ranch. It's a place where kids can have a place to call home...How the facility works...162 beds and troubled kids...Dealing with kids from 10-21 years old and their parents in difficult situations...Kids with mood disorders to bi-polar kids.

- **OEM and OME:** Ken Hughlett and Kathy Russel discussed how flash flooding is a real concern in the Waldo Canyon burn area this

Spring and Summer. We spoke about emergency preparedness, personal risk, alert systems that are in place, a family evacuation plan and agencies that can help following the fires that devastated Black Forest and the new threat of flooding in that area: we repeated this information.

- **TESSA:** Tessa offers a Safehouse, Advocacy and Counseling Programs, for women, children and men in abusive potential life threatening domestic situations. Tess also provide numerous outreach, counseling and Education programs for El Paso County. We spoke with Tessa's information spokesperson and a domestic abuse survivor who has used Tessa's services were in for the interview. They outlined forms of domestic abuse, how to handle situations, when you should get help, and how to get help. We discussed the growing numbers of domestic violence in El Paso County, possible causes and solutions.

- **CDOT:** Wayne Bitman Project Engineer of the I-25 Corridor Widening
Project : As construction continues to widen I-25 to three lanes through the northern half of Colorado Springs, we invited Wayne Bitman in to give a progress report. Wayne told us of the ongoing construction, alerted us to possible closures, lane shifts and other potential comuter problems in the months to come.

- **Dave Rose:** Following devastating flooding in the Waldo Canyon Burn which affected residents in numerous El Paso County communities' killing three people, Dave and Kathy outlined why the flooding occurred, measures which are being taken to ease the effects of prolonged heavy rain in the area and steps residences should take to remain safe in emergency situations.

- **Pueblo Rape Crisis Center:** David Ortivez and Dena Rodriguez tell about the process and what they do with their 24 hour Crisis Hotline and the services they provide to the two local hospitals and how they all work together.

- **CHIP: (COMMUNITY HEALTH IMPROVEMENT PLAN)** Shylo Dennison and Matt Guy talk about there plan to make Pueblo a healthier community,Free events that are going

throughout the year and the challenge for the next 5 years,2 areas that are being targeted are obesity and teen pregnancies.

- Pueblo Community Health Center: Donald Moore the CEO and Laura Kelly talked about how they are a primary health provider. Explains what PCHC is and how you can use the facility..Helping low income and under insured Puebloans can still get quality health care.
- Health Department: (EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS) Jean Borrego and Bart Evans speak on being ready for a disaster with building kits for your home your car and informing people what they should have in their kits that you can grab and go in the event of a disaster.
- St. Mary Corwin (BREAST CANCER AWARENESS) Char Visale Brenda Galassini and Rochelle Wristen talking about National Breast Cancer Awareness Month and their facility.The higher chance of women in Southern Colorado being diagnosed with the cancer and why that is,The process of what happens after the patient receives the news that they may have Breast Cancer,How it can effect men as well,Genetic research and more.
