KPHT Quarterly Issues/Programs List

KPHT provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- Advocate for Abused Children: Wilene spoke of Safe Passage (tm)s mission to provide a safe environment in which children can tell their story of abuse. Safe Passage is at the center of an inter-agency collaborative effort that minimizes the trauma to victims of child abuse by centralizing services in one, child-friendly location. We act as Team Leader, coordinating the responses of our Team Partners in the medical, investigative, social service, legal, and mental health arenas. This holistic approach keeps investigations child-focused and insures that children and caregivers receive the broadest range of support in the least intrusive manner possible. Annually Safe Passage serves more than 1000 children and non-offending caregivers
- Affordable Care Act: How the Affordable Health Care Act helps with prevention of sicknesses and disease. What (tm)s available for free. What you insurance must pay without charges or co-pays to you to help in prevention
- Child Advocacy Group: We outlined Safe Passage (tm)s important role in our community, giving abused children a voice and enables the healing process by acting as the single source of contact for medical, investigative, and legal services. Safe Passage serves children from birth to the age of 18, as well as developmentally disabled adults, who are victims of sexual or physical abuse and/or are witnesses to homicide or domestic violence
- **Communications Systems:** New Communications system and Marijuana use in Pueblo County. What effects is marijuana having on law enforcement. What has the first 2 months unveiled in the area since the legalization of the drug and what he feels is coming for the future. He is very much against the legalization and explained the problems that are already surfacing. Many out of town retail marijuana dispensaries are wanting to use Pueblo as a grow area and the marijuana will be sold out of Pueblo and we won (tm)t be getting the taxes but dealing with the problems generated.
- COS Business Development: The Colorado Springs Sports Corporation was created in 1978 as the United States Olympic Committee relocated from New York City to Colorado Springs and staged its inaugural National Sports Festival, and later the Olympic Sports Festival, at the foot of Pikes Peak. Since then, "The Sports Corp" has grown and prospered over three decades to become a driving force in the agenda for amateur and Olympic sport.
- Find Women Jobs: The Women's Resource Agency coaches women on how they can become financially independent and achieve employment success. They also educate at-risk adolescent girls to make healthy life choices, attain educational goals, and enter adulthood as successful members of our community.
- Hazardous Waste: Pueblo is in the process of applying for a Federal Superfund Site Cleanup that is stirring quite a controversy over the stigma of the label. Mr. Coomes

explained why this isn (tm)t necessary for Pueblo by previous experience in the field all over the world as an expert witness of soil sampling and whether or not this is just a County Officials getting funding at any cost to the community.

- Home Fire Mitigation: With Spring on the horizon and the memory of the wild land fires of the past two summers fresh in our minds, we felt it was important to air a previously recorded show dealing with at home fire mitigation. How to cut back vegetation, trees, shrubs,, what types of ground cover is best, rock vs. mulch and the safest building materials for house siding, roofs and decks.
- Homeless Families: Partners In Housing, gives homeless families with children the hope and opportunity to achieve self-sufficiency through supportive services and transitional housing. We can also serve a limited number of homeless adults without children. Supportive services are a critical part of our program, teaching families the skills they need to succeed. PIH's program includes case management, life skills classes, and individualized budget and credit counseling.
- Homeless Youth: Urban Peak Colorado Springs emergency shelter, is a 20 bed facility for youth ages 15 through 21. Beyond basic needs, youth at shelter receive intensive case management, health services, and education & employment support, which are all designed to empower each individual youth build toward self-sufficiency based on their own identified goals and needs. Shawna outlined programs, services, facilities, gave a history of the program in the Springs and offered a plea for help.
- Quit Smoking: Quitting tobacco use and what free help that (tm)s available locally and nationally. Also what can take the place of tobacco use and your family help.
- Spring Gardening Tips: In Colorado (tm)s typically sandy soil and semi-arid climate gardening can be an impossible task without the proper knowledge of what to plant, where to plant, soil enrichment and how much to water. We explored those subjects with these two extension service professionals we also explored the various programs available to the general public through the service.
