Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- **A. Immigration**: The end of 2023 saw a dramatic increase in the number of asylum-seeking migrants apprehended at the United States-Mexico border.
- **B.** Education: Issues relating to education at all levels in our community, including teacher shortages, higher education attainment, and a local focus on first-generation college students.
- **C. Health care**: Access to affordable and locally available health care, including behavioral health.
- **D. Government Spending**: The end of the year saw an influx of new investment in infrastructure projects from every level of government impacting local roads, highways and international ports of entry.
- **E.** Water: The impact of the ongoing drought on the Colorado River is impacting communities we serve as state and federal investment seeks to mitigate the impacts on local agriculture.
