- "Health Watch" features of varying lengths focusing on health-related issues, the latest in medical research and treatments, and other health related topics.
- "Money Watch" features of varying lengths focusing on the latest in the economy along with tips and ways to save money.

Public Service Announcements – The station airs PSAs in rotation from various organizations that include topics such as Suicide Prevention Month, Breast Cancer Awareness, and The Valarie Fund.
