Issue: Rural Housing

Date: 7/1/22 Time of day: 7:15am

Duration: 20 minutes

Brief description of programming: Nivory Gordon, Jr., State Director of USDA Rural Development, joined Morning Show Host Jerry Baker, via phone to address the topic of home ownership and the many ways that the USDA can help make dreams come true in regard to that. According to Jones, these funds will provide more than 4,000 new homes in these 3 counties with new access to broadband internet service.

Issue: Crisis Intervention

Brief description of programming: Cherokee County Sheriff's Department spoke with our news department about a Crisis Intervention Class, with the training taking place at the Gadsden State Cherokee in Centre. The 40 hour training was conducted by members of the Tuscaloosa Police Department, CED Mental Health, NAMI, Dr. John Holbrook, and Probate Judge Tim Burgess. Most Cherokee County Deputies have been certified in CIT to better enable them to handle calls that involve mental health crisis.

Brief description of programming: Information was passed along that Alabama Power is currently offering customers up to \$200 as a reimbursement when a smart thermostat is purchased.
