- A. **Animal Conservation:** The year started with excitement surrounded the new exhibits at the Zoo. The quarter ended with controversy as the city elected to not renew its contract with the Zoological Society.
- B. **Children's Advocacy:** CASA continues to seek assistance with restocking funds and volunteer staff.
- C. Education: Numerous scholarship fundraisers took place this quarter. El Paso has made a commitment to improve youth and adult education as we continue to face criticism for national rankings.
- D. Immigration: This continued to be a source of debate for how to address the surging number of migrants attempting to come to America through the Borderland as the previously leveled off numbers began to rise again. This subject has become a political topic of debate amplified in Texas by the bussing actions and installation of razor wire fencing from Governor Gregg Abbott.
- E. **Politics:** Texas was a part of Super Tuesday. Plus the activity of candidates for Mayor increased as Mayor Oscar Leeser is ineligible to run for re-election.
