Economy & State Budget Ride-Sharing	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, executive director of the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), discussed Governor Cuomo's proposed state budget and the impact a Republican president and a Republican-controlled Congress would have on the state's allocation of federal funds. Horner also talked about the debate over allowing ride-sharing programs (like Uber) in the state; he said it revolves around who would regulate them: the DMV or local municipalities (the latter already regulate taxicabs).	04/02/2017	6:30 am	30 min.
Economy & State Budget Court System	Capital Connection	Casey Seiler, Senior Editor for News with the Albany Times Union, discussed the "dysfunction" in this year's state budget process with the conflicts between the governor and the legislators. Seiler described the movement to "Raise the Age" so that 16 and 17 year olds would no longer be tried as adults in the court system; he outlined why some politicians want that provision included in the new budget instead of as stand-alone legislation.		6:30 am	30 min.

Education Ride-sharing	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief for the New York Daily News, discussed the state's new "college affordability plan," which provides free college tuition for certain income levels. Politics Education	Capital Connection	Jesse McKinley, Albany Bureau Chief of the New York Times, discussed the governor's change from leaning right to leaning left and what that means for any future political aspirations. Politics State Stipend Controversy	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief for the New York Daily News, explained that state senators get stipends (extra income) for being a senate leader or a committee chair. A newspaper investigation has revealed that other senators are getting stipends, too, for being "vice-chairs" and there's some question about the legality of that. Politics State Stipend Controversy	Capital Connection	Albany <i>Times Union</i> Capitol Bureau reporter Matt Hamilton explained the situation in the state senate involving the Independent Democratic Conference, which separated from the mainline Democrats and has a power-sharing agreement with the Republicans (the majority in the senate).
