

Corruption in State Govt. Economy	Capital Connection	John Kaehny, Executive Director of Reinvent Albany, described the purpose of his organization, which is to promote open ("transparent") and accountable New York State government. He discussed how the corrupting influence of money could be curtailed in state government, and whether real ethics reform is possible. He expressed criticism of the "Buffalo Billion," an economic development program for Buffalo, NY, consisting mainly of taxpayer-funded subsidies for a solar panel manufacturing plant. He pointed out that a similar program of taxpayer-funded subsidies is slated to be implemented in Rochester and Utica.	07/05/15	6:30 am	30 min.
Corruption in State Govt. Voter Registration Reform	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Legislative Director for the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), reviewed the just-ended session of the state legislature, discussing the arrest and indictment of both the Senate and Assembly leaders and how those events have affected the passage of bills. He talked about "dark money," political campaign contributions that can't be traced back to individuals. He also advocated for the need to change the voter registration process to shorten (or eliminate) the lag time between registering and voting.	07/12/15	6:30 am	30 min.
Gun Control Corruption in State Govt. Animal Abuse	Capital Connection	New York State Republican Assemblyman Jim Tedisco discussed the proposals to modify the gun-controlling Safe Act. He suggested the legislative session should be shortened, to save the taxpayers' money (less time equals less pay for the legislators) and to lessen the temptation for corruption. He described his proposal for a statewide animal abuse registry, similar to the sex offender registry. If such a bill becomes law, those who are convicted of abusing animals would not be allowed to own pets.	07/19/15	6:30 am	30 min.
Police shootings	Capital Connection	Albany County District Attorney David Soares explained how the state Attorney General has come to have jurisdiction and be the special prosecutor for all police shootings, and how the governor's executive order affects the county district attorneys around the state in terms of evidence collection.	07/26/15	6:30 am	30 min.
Gun Control	Capital Connection	Leah Gunn Barrett, executive director of New Yorkers Against Gun Violence, declared that gun deaths are a "public health threat." She explained the rationale behind "universal" background checks for those who want to purchase firearms. Politics Economy	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , discussed what the governor is doing to strengthen his support among residents of New York City and what that means for any possible future political ambitions. Capital Connection	Albany <i>Times Union</i> State Editor and Capital Bureau Chief Casey Seiler described the allegations of harsh interrogations and beatings at Clinton Correctional Facility following the escape of two prisoners. Politics Economy	Capital Connection	Ed Cox, Chairperson of the New York State Republican Party, talked about how the Republicans might fair in the next presidential election year – not only in terms of the presidential candidate but also in the US Senate and the state Senate. Education	Capital Connection	New York State Education Commissioner Mary Ellen Elia discussed what "Common Core" really is and the reasons why the standards are being changed. She talked about the need to address the issue of "teaching to the test," which has its pros and cons. She explained how charter schools work in giving students a choice. Economy	Capital Connection	New York State Comptroller Thomas Dinapoli commented on the recent stock market down-turn and the effect on people's retirement accounts (including the state pension fund). He described how the pension fund is invested to withstand the ups and downs of the market.
