



Economy/ Education	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Legislative Director for the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), reviewed the contents of the new budget passed by the New York State legislature, including funding for universal Pre-K in New York City but not any other area of the state. He also discussed the opposition from parents and teachers to the Common Core teaching standards.	04/06/14	6:30 am	30 min.
Economy/ Education	Capital Connection	New York State Comptroller Thomas DiNapoli discussed the newly-passed state budget, which included campaign finance reform that only covers the election for controller, an increase in education spending, and changes to public employee benefits. Politics/ State Corruption	Capital Connection	Casey Seiler, State Editor for the Albany <i>Times Union</i> , reflected on the Moreland Act Commission now that it has disbanded. Politics/ Taxation	Capital Connection	Karen Scharff, co-chair of the Working Families Party and Executive Director of Citizens Action, outlined how and why the Working Families Party was created and what types of candidates it supports. Politics/ State Corruption	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany bureau chief for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , outlined the grand larceny charges against a New York City Councilman with ties to the state legislature. Education	Capital Connection	New York State Education Commissioner Dr. John King, Jr., discussed the implementation of the Common Core curriculum and reacted to criticism of the program. He presented his ideas to achieve socio-economic integration of schools through inter-district partnerships; he cited the cooperation of the Rochester City School District and school districts in surrounding towns to create an urban/suburban student exchange. Education	Capital Connection	New York State School Boards Association Executive Director Tim Kremer gave his assessment of the recent school budget votes, citing that 98% of the budgets in the state passed. He explained his support for the Common Core curriculum standards, but admitted the program was implemented too fast.
