Scandals in State Govt Economy Ethics Reform	Capital Connection	Casey Seiler, State Editor and Capital Bureau Chief for the <i>Albany Times Union</i> , reviewed the federal criminal complaint which alleged millions of dollars in "favors" were exchanged by aides to the governor, and the impact the scandal is having on economic development in the state. Seiler also reflected on the blown opportunity that the governor and legislators had in crafting comprehensive ethics reform in comparison to the "wimpy" reform that was actually passed.	10/02/16	6:30 am	30 min.

Dinapoli criticized economic development money being channel through non-profit agencies instead of being "on the books" as regular state spending.
