

Politics	Capital Connection	New York State Democratic Assemblywoman Deborah Glick discussed the plan of the Working Families Party to take Cynthia Nixon's name off the ballot as a gubernatorial candidate and to replace her with Gov. Andrew Cuomo, who won the Democratic primary. In order to remove Nixon's name from the ballot, the Working Families Party is placing Nixon as an Assembly candidate to oppose Glick, even though Nixon has not expressed a desire to serve in the Assembly.	10/07/18	6:30 am	30 min.
Politics Corruption in State Govt Racism Marijuana	Capital Connection	Keith Wofford, the Republican candidate for New York State Attorney General, described his background and why he's running for the office. He discussed ways of cleaning up corruption in state government, addressed the rhetoric of racism and identity politics in the country, and discussed the benefits of medical marijuana while pointing out the negative effects of recreational marijuana use.	10/14/18	6:30 am	30 min.
Marijuana Education	Capital Connection	Larry Sharpe, Libertarian candidate for governor of New York, pointed out that marijuana should be regulated like onions (treated like any other crop). Alternative Energy	Capital Connection	Mark Dunlea, the Green Party candidate for New York State Comptroller, thinks the state pension fund should be divested of companies involved with fossil fuels, and he advocated a state carbon tax on those who burn fossil fuels.
