Corruption in State Government	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , pondered whether there could be investigations into the governor's office in the wake of the convictions of the two top legislative leaders in the state, and also talked about the special elections which will be held to replace those two politicians.	01/03/2016	6:30 am	30 min.
Corruption in State Government	Capital Connection	Jimmy Vielkind, Albany Bureau Chief for Politico New York, an online news service, talked about the upcoming special election to replace seat once held by the Majority Leader of the State Senate, who was force out of office and convicted on corruption charges. Education Homelessness Politics	Capital Connection	Casey Seiler, State Editor for the <i>Albany Times Union</i> , shared reaction to the governor's State of the State address, including the allocations for education spending. State Government Reform	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Executive Director of the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), pondered whether the governor and the legislature would take advantage of the "historic" opportunity to push for true ethics reform in state government. He outlined possible areas of reform: limits on legislators' outside income, public funding of political campaigns, the Limited Liability Corporation (LLC) loophole in campaign financing, and term limits.	01/22/2016	6:30 am	30 min.

Corruption in State Government	Capital Connection	Yancey Roy, Albany Bureau Chief for <i>New York Newsday</i> , gave an update on the ongoing investigations of state politicians by the special prosecutor. He also commented on the proposed state regulation which would require lobbyists to report their contacts with newspaper editorial boards and other media. He wondered how conversations with reporters and editors could be viewed as the same as contact with legislators, when only the latter make laws.	01/29/2016	6:30 am	30 min.
Corruption in State Government	Capital Connection	Ken Lovett, Albany Bureau Chief for the <i>New York Daily News</i> , commented on a new poll that suggests 90% of New York State residents think corruption is a big problem in Albany, but only 20% say cleaning up the corruption should be a top priority of the legislature. He pointed out how hard it is to prove special deals and conflicts of interest by politicians.	02/07/2016	6:30 am	30 min.
Corruption in State Government	Capital Connection	U.S. Attorney Preet Bharara of New York's Southern District discussed the job of a prosecutor and the goal of pursuing justice. He talked about his role in the convictions of former state Assembly Speaker Sheldon Silver and former Senate Majority Leader Dean Skelos on federal corruption charges. 		governor and the New York City mayor. Lovett also pointed out that the special prosecutor, U.S. Attorney Preet Bharara, seems to have caused politicians in Albany to change their behavior; they've started "self-policing" themselves, as Lovett termed it.			
Economy Politics	Capital Connection	Ed Cox, Chairman of the New York State Republican Committee, discussed the economic impact of the governor's proposed minimum wage increase to \$15 per hour. State Constitutional Convention Environment Education	Capital Connection	Blair Horner, Executive Director of the New York Public Interest Research Group (NYPIRG), pondered whether the idea of a constitutional convention should be brought before the voters. He highlighted water contamination around the state caused by old pipes and the use of road salt; he noted this had a definite impact on drinking water quality. Economy Politics	Capital Connection	New York State Republican Assemblyman Jim Tedisco explained his "Truth in Spending" proposal, which would require that all state government expenditures would be accounted for and listed; no hidden spending would be permitted. Education Economy	Capital Connection	Nancy Zimpher, Chancellor of the State University of New York (SUNY), outlined the new “diversity, equity and inclusion” policy, which calls for a Chief Diversity Officer on each campus. She described the pathway in which students at community colleges in the state can easily transfer to SUNY colleges. She recommended that K-12 schools pair up with colleges to train future teachers (like the relationship between universities and hospitals for training doctors). And she discussed the “Start Up New York” program, in which new businesses partner with the SUNY system with the goal of creating jobs.	03/27/2016	6:30 am	30 min.
