NFL UNDER THE HELMET

Terrell Davis Pilots an F-16

Terrell Davis of the Denver Broncos spends the day with the crew of an F-16. Concepts and terminology new to most kids (the concept of "G force," the introduction to piloting a jet, the physical demands of piloting, etc.) were introduced. Ultimately, Davis experiences the flight of and piloting of the F-16.

[Educational Theme: Introduction to a positive career opportunity—pilot.]

[Educational Theme: Physical fitness (being in shape) is not just required in sports.]

Warren Sapp—A Day in Training Camp

A camera crew spends the day at an NFL training camp with Warren Sapp of the Tampa Bay Bucs. Segment mixes action footage from camp with scenes from Sapp's interview.

[Educational Theme: Emphasis is placed on teamwork and putting in hard work early for the big pay-off later. Perfecting the basics, effort, and time leads to becoming a champion.]

Head Coaches—Sounds of Camp

Words of both positive and negative reinforcement from coaches to players during camp.

Many quips lead to practice performance generating game-time performance.

[Educational Theme: Hard work and "perfect practice" pays great dividends.]

Peyton Manning—Back in the Day

Footage shows Peyton Manning of the Indianapolis Colts playing football, from getting his start in the game as a kid to his record-setting rookie season in the NFL. Manning talks about his development as a player and the influence of his father (former NFL quarterback) and his brother. Manning emphasized, "Today it seems like too many kids are inside watching TV, and on the Internet, and things like that... I think it is so much better to be outside playing... throwing the ball around, being outside playing, that's the best way to grow up."

[Educational Theme: The need to be outside playing, physical activity is important for growth in kids.]

[Educational Theme: Family relationships are important to one's development.]

A 12-Year-Old Interviews Eddie George

A 12-year-old interviews Eddie George of the Oilers. Scenes include George playing catch with the boy. George notes that it is easier if he stays in good physical shape all year round.

[Educational Theme: Always try to be your best. There is a need to stay physically fit.]

Jake Plummer—Back in the Day

Segment shows Jake Plummer of the Arizona Cardinals from early age and his development into an NFL quarterback. Plummer stated, "...parents sometimes can make the games more important than the kids make it, and my parents were great because they didn't say 'Get ready; you gotta go to bed tonight. You got a game tomorrow.'...it was just something that I liked to do and my parents wanted to promote that." He also spoke of learning lessons for life through participation in football.

[Educational Theme: Keep a perspective on competition; excessive pressure is not necessary; keep the fun in the game.]

[Educational Theme: By participation in sport, you learn lessons for life.]

Crouch/McNabb--Playbook

Segment follows the development of two rookie quarterbacks in the NFL, focusing on their playbooks. Stress was given to the need to study and know the contents of an NFL playbook. One quarterback stated that he did not study his playbook and was cut from the team.

[Educational Theme: Study, study, and keep studying. Extra time and effort studying leads to success.]

Play Football

After school programs involving students, NFL players, and Vice President Al Gore. Numerous role-model NFL players give their take on the importance of after school activity programs. Players make statements of the benefits of participation in such programs; staying out of trouble as well as developing positive personal traits (character, teamwork, communication, etc.)

[Educational Theme: After school playground programs lead to learning and positive individual development.]

[Educational Theme: Community awareness and service.]

NFL UNDER THE HELMET

Jim Harbaugh Rides the Fast Track

Jim Harbaugh of the San Diego Chargers has an interest in what he calls the “most exciting thing in sports.” This segment tells of his part-ownership and involvement with Indy car racing. The segment provides a variety of facts related to racing, including the use of computers and a comparison of speeds on and off the track. He comments that a racing crew is a “finely tuned machine—it’s not just one guy driving the car.” He also tells of the thrill and excitement of the activity—he is in it to be part of the team... not just the money.

[Educational Theme: Teamwork works in many areas of sport and life.]

[Educational Theme: Pursuit of things based on interest brings excitement... money does not have to be the driving force in interest.]

Zach Thomas—Back in the Day

Segment shows Zach Thomas of the Miami Dolphins and how he became a pro football player. Always a “tough guy” (Zach was run over by a pick-up truck at the age of 2 ½) he was a natural in football. At first he played for fun and then found that he could draw attention through football. His football experiences as a youth is where he first learned about teamwork. Now, he tries to play like he did as a kid—as if he was back on the playground, for the fun of it.

[Educational Theme: Keep; in the fun in the game; in whatever you do.]

[Educational Theme: Learning about teamwork, and other life lessons, through sport.]

David Boston/Byron Boston—Father/Son Combination

Segment shared this unique father/son combination in the NFL—a player and a referee. David Boston of the Arizona Cardinals caught his first NFL ball as a receiver with his father having a “close watch.” Byron Boston was one of the referees for the game. The piece focused on their unique relationship as “co-workers” in the NFL. Typically, the father always has advice for the son. Not so typically, the son was not critical of the father. Focus was on the relationship between the father and son.

[Educational Theme: Strong relationships enhance family cohesiveness.]

NFL Rookie Symposium

Every rookie in the NFL attended this orientation for first year players. The focus of the symposium was education for life off of the field. The piece showed the concern the NFL has for its inexperienced players. Players were taught the “do’s and don’t’s” of life in the NFL off of the field. Topics included: alcohol, drug abuse, violence, money, the media, STDs/AIDS, etc. The key phrase of the symposium—“Good choices...well thought out decisions...and consequences.

[Educational Theme: Life-long learning is needed for continued growth in real life.]

[Educational Theme: Wise decision making practices leads to success.]

[Educational Theme: There is a need for positive role models...even in the NFL.]

[Educational Theme: Success can be cut short through poor decisions (there are consequences to our actions).]

BEAST MACHINES

Beast Machines takes the Maximals, the infamous team of cybernetic robot/animals to a new realm where they struggle to free their homeworld of Cybertron from the clutches of a powerful ruler. After the defeat of Megatron, the Maximals which include: the leader Optimus Primal, the impetuous feline Cheetor, the calculating spider Blackarachnia and the wise-cracking rodent Rattrap, awake back on Cybertron, with no recollection of how they arrived. Instead of a celebration for the success of the Beast Wars, our heroes find themselves being hunted by a new mysterious breed of Transformers: Vehicons.

These Vehicons are under the force control of Megatron who has returned with a vengeance, taking Cybertron under his control. With Megatron in command, the Maximals are forced into hiding underground where their bodies undergo a strange reformation altering their beast/robot bodies. The Maximals must perfect this new art of metamorphosis as they struggle to free Cybertron from Megatron's grasp. One survivor of Megatron's invasion, Nightscream, joins the Maximals in their quest to free Cybertron.

BEAST WARS

Imagine..a long time ago, somewhere in the universe, far from the sun that would later create Earth, an essence came into existence, that would give birth to a race of living robots known as..The Transformers. These robot tribes inhabited the planet Cybertron, a prehistoric Earth.

As our heroes protect their adopted world, great changes are happening within themselves, as unusual powers, forms and abilities have begun to be discovered. Both the Maximals and Predacons continue to grow in size and ability, and as a result they begin to struggle personally and within relationships. Both groups use bio-genetic engineering to fuse their robotic body structures with native animal life forms. The result of this fusion is wild animals that can change into robot warriors. Excitement, action, and humor abound as each side begins to realize that their struggle is not just for survival. They are at a great turning point in Transformers history-a saga that will be known, now and forever, as the Beast Wars.

BIG GUY & RUSTY THE BOY ROBOT
