We'll offer Glitter Tattoos, Spray "Alli" tattoos, and face painting. Food (Burgers and dogs) will be available, and we'll also be selling balloons and TShirts. Also on site will be the Fluvanna SPCA with dog/puppies, cats/kittens for adoption.

Admission is by donation, and our donation table will have decals, stickers, Alli Fun Day bracelets, Water Bottles and cups for donation tiers of \$5, \$10, \$15 (\$30 for the set of all).

All proceeds from the event are going to scholarships for Fluvanna Youth Soccer Association (FYSA) to cover the costs of player registrations, and to a scholarship to a graduating female athlete at Fluvanna County High School. The FSPCA is not part of our scholarship plans this year, but Allison loved and rescued animals all the time, so we wanted them there to have an opportunity to show the pets they have available and maybe get a few to some new homes.

A little story about Allison, she was a 2011 FCHS graduate and enrolled at Radford University. She was a Jefferson All District soccer player, and played soccer from the age of 5 with FYSA and SOCA. Her FCHS number 11 was retired at the school last Spring. She was a member of Crossroads Community Church and went on a few IMPACT mission trips with their youth group, and several local mission adventures. She was not only a player, but she also coached with FYSA in the U10 level and won the championship both seasons she coached (Fall 2010 and Spring 2011). On August 25, 2011, the eve before we were to take her to her freshman year at Radford, she went out to say good-bye to a friend, she called at 9:55 and said she was on her way home, sadly she never made it. I do personally have to add that after investigation it was discovered that she was NOT drinking or speeding and she was NOT on her cell phone either receiving or making any calls or texts. Something got in her way, and animal or another car, we

won't know, and she ran off the road. It was just a tragic accident. It's important to me as her mom, that I add that, I hope you understand.

Alli was loved by so many people in the Fluvanna/Albermarle/Lousia area, she touched more lives in her 18 years than most people do by 68, and these communities gave our family so much support and love as we have grieved, I thought this was a great way to give back and honor Allison's memory at the same time.

"This is a show that was really chosen by the students," Chapel said. "So many of them expressed interest in doing this show, and I think a lot of it has to do with the way it resonates with them and the fact that they have also kind of grown up with the show."

Both when he saw the show in New York and as he has delved into it further to prepare for this production, Chapel said he has been impressed with how the play deftly weaves the original play's themes in with its modern songs and score. "This is a play that still has references to late 19th Century Germany, and a sort of modern rock concert, all rolled up into one."

Chapel said he has been careful to stay true to the vision of the Broadway production without copying it. "After having seen the production in New York and re-watching it at Lincoln Center, I sat down with a somewhat blank canvas in terms of staging, so that not every scene is exactly the same as it was on Broadway, but making sure we are doing justice to what is a terrific show, and sending the same message."

It's a message, he said, that connects with his student cast and other young people around the world, for obvious reasons. "I think it really speaks to young people in that it is about the pressures of not failing in whatever they do, and having high pressures from their parents. Also, this is a show about kids growing up, and about the awakening of their sexual desires. That is a major part of the show. More than anything, *spring awakening* is, in essence, sexual awakening."

Given these themes, Chapel said, this is a show intended for mature audiences only. "If the Broadway production were a movie, it would have earned an R rating. And our production would as well. This is a wonderful show, but it does have sexuality, it has violence and it has profanity. I think it is very important that our audiences understand that clearly going into it."

Spring Awakening will offer U.Va. Drama Department audiences a first chance to experience the newly-renovated Culbreth Theatre, which features new seats and increased accessibility. Chapel hopes, a taste of what is to come later this spring. "It will be kind of fun for our audience to go into a quasi-new theater, and it is all part of the excitement of the upcoming Ruth Caplin Theatre opening."

The \$13.5 million, 300-seat, thrust-style theater will open April 18 with the George S. Kaufman/Moss Hart classic screwball comedy *You Can't Take it With You*, which closes the 2012-2013 season.

The next show in the season is *God's Ear*, a touching look at love, life, and loss from playwright Jenny Schwartz. *God's Ear* comes to the Helms Theatre from February 21-23, February 26-28 and March 1-2 at 8:00 p.m.

"CASA Volunteers are ordinary people who do extraordinary things for children," according to the organization. CASA Volunteers come from all walks of life, and include people of all ages.

Last Fiscal Year, Piedmont CASAserved 213 children whose cases were before the courts of the 16th Judicial District of Virginia due to abuse or neglect by their caregivers. At the beginning of the current Fiscal Year, CASA was already serving **40 more children** than it was the same time last year. Over the past month CASA has had a waitlist of as many as 22 children, including a newborn and toddlers.
