

WLNY- New York Quarterly Issues/Programs List – 3rd Quarter October 10, 2021

Attached are the listings of broadcast segments and stories that reflect Channel 55's significant programming treatment of ascertained community issues during the preceding three-month period.

Time period of day, day of week, source and format descriptions follow the first appearance of the broadcast name. Date references refer to broadcast days. All times given are approximate.

Programs

CBSN New York - hosted by Dick Brennan. Monday – Friday, 9 p.m. – 10 p.m.

Public Service Announcements - WLNY-TV 55 is airing and sponsoring PSAs. PSAs in rotation stem from various organizations that include topics such as Suicide Prevention Month, The Valarie Fund, and Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Health: Topics in this category include: vaccination requirements.

WLNY- New York: 7/31 CBS2's Aundrea Cline-Thomas reports that the Broadway League announced all 41 theaters will require audience members be fully vaccinated. "Fully vaccinated" means that everyone involved won't be eligible to attend or participate until 14 days after receiving either their second dose of a two-shot vaccine, or 14 days after a single dose vaccine.

Government & Politics: Topics in this category include: marijuana sales and ban on evictions.

WLNY- New York: 9/1 CBS2's Marcia Kramer tells us that after only a week in office, New York Governor Kathy Hochul calls the legislature back to Albany for a rare special session. The lawmakers addressed the ban on evictions and the sale of marijuana.

Education: Topics in this category include: classroom capacity

WLNY- New York: 8/1 CBS2's Cindy Hsu reports that the New York City Council has announced a proposal to put a limit on classroom capacity in city schools. The move is designed to help with social distancing in classrooms and to improve the learning process. Approval would decrease the number of students per classroom to an average of 14 to 21. Last year, high schools reportedly had roughly 26 kids per class.

Crime: Topics in this category include: anti-Muslim attack and increase in gang violence.

WLNY- New York: 7/13 Marcia Kramer reports that gang gun violence is plaguing the city. Commissioner Dermot Shea says the Bronx in particular. It hasn't been this bad since 1996. 7/27 Dick Brennan tells us that a man suspected in two anti-Muslim attacks has struck again. This time threatening a 38-year-old woman in Queens. In the latest incident, the suspect allegedly pulled a knife on the victim and made anti-Muslim statements. Police said the same man harassed four other people in two separate incidents back on June 20th
