

**CONTINUED ELIGIBILITY FOR CLASS A TELEVISION
LICENSE for KBBV-CD, Channel 19, Bakersfield, CA**

4Q—2022 (October 1, 2022 through December 31, 2022)

Section (f)(2)(A) of the Community Broadcasters Protection Act (“CBPA”) and Section 73.6001 of the Commission’s rules set forth the continuing eligibility requirements for Class A licensees.

To maintain its eligibility for a Class A license, a Class A station must continue to broadcast at least 18 hours per day, and must broadcast at least 3 hours per week of locally produced programming. The FCC has defined “locally produced programming” as programming “produced within the predicted Grade B contour of the station or within the predicted Grade B contours of any of the stations in a commonly owned group,” or “programming produced at the station’s main studio.” 47 C.F.R. §73.6000.

KBBV-CD (the Station) broadcasts a minimum of 18 hours a day, the station does average at least 3 hours per week of programming each quarter produced within the market area (Bakersfield) served by the station.

Based thereon, station KBBV-CD meets each of the continuing eligibility requirements. The Station broadcasts 24 hours a day, 7 days a week during this time period. Further, as detailed in the attached programming schedule, the Station broadcasts at least 3 hours per week of locally produced programming. Locally produced programs for a typical week are shown high-lighted in yellow on the attached Program Schedule.

In sum, at all relevant times, KBBV-CD has met the locally produced programming requirement, and broadcast more than 18 hours per day. Accordingly, KBBV-CD continues to be eligible for Class A status.
