The focus of news coverage this quarter continues to be the Maui wildfires and the Lahaina fire that killed at least 100 people, left an estimated 4 unaccounted for, and destroyed five square miles of historic Lahaina town.

Maui started off this quarter with the controversial return to tourism on Oct. 8, excluding the burn zone in Lahaina. Maui continues to have the highest RevPAR in the state, but visitor numbers and spending are down. The visitor industry launched an educational campaign to inform visitors on respectful behavior following the fires.

Displaced students also returned to their home campuses, with Kamehameha III Elementary students attending a shared campus at Lahaina Intermediate until a temporary campus is built near the Kapalua Airport.

This quarter saw the reassignment, return, and departure of Kaleo Manuel from the Commission on Water Resource Management following his controversial reassignment following the Lahaina wildfires.

The county completed its Return to Lahaina phase with the reopening of residential zones under the direction of the Maui Emergency Management Agency. MEMA's interim director Darryl Oliveira returned to the Big Island after an 89-day contract ended. Amos Lonokailua-Hewitt came out of retirement from the Maui Fire Department to take on the MEMA post in the new year.

The Council for Native Hawaiian Advancement hosted its event on Maui with keynote speakers sharing their vision for Lahaina and issues surrounding wildfire recovery.

Coverage continues to include live streaming of important press conferences, interviews with key legislators, community leaders and residents impacted by the disaster.
