KEFN—Issues/Programs List THIRD QUARTER 2006

KEFN, licensed to Eternal Family Network, is the only over the air television station that offers full-time Catholic television programming. KEFN operates non-commercially. According to The Official Catholic Directory, 2006, as of January 1, 2006 there were 555,750 Catholic residents within the Archdiocese of St. Louis, which encompasses the city of St. Louis and the ten surrounding counties in east central Missouri (the total 2000 Census population of the civil jurisdictions within the Archdiocese was 2,118,721; Catholics made up 26.23% of this number).

Unique among St. Louis area television stations, KEFN views the world through the prism of Catholic theology, faith and morals. With this viewpoint, KEFN believes that five overarching "problems, issues and needs" of the St. Louis community are unchanging: (1) The Need to Save One's Immortal Soul; (2) Faith, Morals and Character; (3) Problems in the Secular Society including but not limited to Divorce, Abortion, Euthanasia, Poverty and Crime; (4) Children's Intellectual and Spiritual Development; and (5) General Public Affairs from a Catholic Perspective.



Pope Benedict XVI - Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, 2006

On 29 June 2006, the Solemnity of Sts. Peter and Paul, the Holy Father presided at the Eucharistic Concelebration in St. Peter's Basilica, together with the participation of a delegation of the Ecumenical Patriarch of Constantinople, Bartholomew I. The Pope reflected on three passages from the Gospels, which show the role conferred on Peter by Christ.

Pope Benedict XVI - Andrew, the Protoclete

At the General Audience in St. Peter's Square on 14 June 2006, continuing his Catechesis on the Church's apostolic ministry, the Holy Father reflected on the Apostle Andrew, the Protoclete, who has a Greek name and, according to some ancient traditions, preached the Gospel among the Greeks until his crucifixion.

Pope Benedict XVI - James, the Lesser

At the General Audience on 28 June 2006, in St. Peter's Square, continuing his Catecheses on the Church's apostolic ministry, the Holy Father commented on St. James, "the son of Alphaeus" but often identified as "James the Lesser" and "James, the brother of the Lord".
