

KEFN—Issues/Programs List FIRST QUARTER 2007

KEFN, licensed to Eternal Family Network, is the only over the air television station that offers full-time Catholic television programming. KEFN operates non-commercially. According to The Official Catholic Directory, 2006, as of January 1, 2006 there were 555,750 Catholic residents within the Archdiocese of St. Louis, which encompasses the city of St. Louis and the ten surrounding counties in east central Missouri (the total 2000 Census population of the civil jurisdictions within the Archdiocese was 2,118,721; Catholics made up 26.23% of this number).

Unique among St. Louis area television stations, KEFN views the world through the prism of Catholic theology, faith and morals. With this viewpoint, KEFN believes that five overarching “problems, issues and needs” of the St. Louis community are unchanging: (1) The Need to Save One’s Immortal Soul; (2) Faith, Morals and Character; (3) Problems in the Secular Society including but not limited to Divorce, Abortion, Euthanasia, Poverty and Crime; (4) Children’s Intellectual and Spiritual Development; and (5) General Public Affairs from a Catholic Perspective.

ISSUE # 1—Need to Save One’s Immortal Soul

Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: daily
Type: Religious
Description: Worship and a homily in the Catholic tradition

Program: The Journey Home
Dates: Monday
Time: 7:00-8:00 pm CT
Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: Weekly
Type: Religious
Description: Host Marcus Grodi, a one-time Presbyterian minister, interviews interesting guests who discuss their roads to conversion to the Roman Catholic religion.

ISSUE #2 –Faith, Morals and Character

Program: Threshold of Hope
Date: Tuesday (live); rebroadcast at other dates and times
Time: 9:00-10:00 pm CT
Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: Weekly
Type: Religious
Description: This program is hosted by Rev. Mitchell Pacwa, S. J., who holds a Ph.D. in Old Testament studies from Vanderbilt University, has served as a college theology professor, is an expert on the Holy Land and speaks several languages. “Father Mitch” engages in an in-depth examination of Blessed John Paul II’s encyclical letter, *Fides et Ratio*. He looks at the late Pope’s attempts to use the Holy Scriptures and the Faith of the Roman Catholic Church to answer the important questions about the meaning of human life and death, of evil and good, of our final destiny

Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: Weekly
Type: Religious/Public Affairs

Description: This program is designed for teenagers and young adults. Different guests each week discuss topics relating to faith and morals applicable to all viewers, but with emphasis on adolescents and young adults

ISSUE #4—Children’s Intellectual and Spiritual Development

Frequency: Daily
Type: Educational/Informational
Description: This is a programming block which consists of various program titles which vary day to day, including “Adventures in Oddysey”, “My Little Angels”, “Awesome Bible Adventures”, “Image of God”, “The Donut Man”, “We Are Catholic”, “Knights of St. Michael”, “Rosary for Kids”, and “The Storykeepers”. All of these programs are designed to instill and grow moral values and virtue in children of varying ages; and teach children about faith and morals; the Catholic sacraments and the saints; and how to pray.

Description: Host Raymond Arroyo, News Director of the EWTN television network, anchors this weekly program, which features news reports from a Catholic perspective and interviews with prominent Catholic figures.

Cardinal Justin Rigali - Vigil Mass for Life, Basilica of the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, 21 January 2007

In his homily, at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception, Washington DC, Cardinal Rigali, of the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, shed light on the issues motivating the March for Life scheduled for the next day, 22 January 2007. He explained how Roe v. Wade, rather than increasing our freedom, mocks it. But there is cause for rejoicing in the decreasing popular support for that Supreme Court decision.

Pope Benedict XVI - Homily, Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, 7 January

On Sunday morning, 7 January [2007], the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, in the Sistine Chapel the Holy Father presided at

the solemn Rite of Baptism of 13 babies. "In Baptism God himself acts, Jesus acts through the Holy Spirit", the Pope said. "God is present here today. He takes on your children and makes them his own".

Pope Benedict XVI - Homily for the Solemnity of the Epiphany: 6 January

On 6 January 2007, in St. Peter's Basilica, the Holy Father presided at Holy Mass to celebrate the Solemnity of the Epiphany. In his homily, the Pope addressed the question of how we proclaim Christ, the Light of the world, in today's world.

Cardinal Tarcisio Bertone - Habemus Papam Exhibition

On 7 December 2006, the Secretary of State, Cardinal Tarcisio Bertone, presided at the inauguration of the Exhibition: "Habemus Papam": Pontifical elections from St. Peter to Benedict XVI", which consists of a large collection of artworks that illustrate this theme and focus on the Papal Conclave. The Cardinal underlined God's guidance of the Conclave, to assure continuance of the papal succession.

Father Edward McNamara - Office of Readings the Evening Before

Father McNamara, professor of liturgy at the Regina Apostolorum Pontifical Athenaeum, answers questions of general interest on liturgical norms. This week, the question concerns when the Office of Readings (in the Liturgy of the Hours) may be anticipated on the evening before.

Pope Benedict XVI - Making Room for Christ

On 3 January 2007, at the first General Audience of the New Year held in the Paul VI Audience Hall, the Holy Father reflected on the joyful event of Christ's birth, but also on "the power of darkness that attempts to dim the splendour of the divine light" and the consequent rejection of God by many in the world today.

ZENIT - Benedict XVI Blesses Lambs for Palliums

Pope Benedict XVI's blessing of two lambs, 21 January 2007, from whose wool the palliums worn by metropolitan archbishops will be woven, provides the occasion for a succinct explanation from ZENIT, of the meaning of the pallium.

Father Frank Pavone - Homily: Thursday, Week II, Ordinary Time

In his homily of 18 January 2007, in EWTN's televised Mass, Father Pavone, defined the true meaning of peace, the true peace won for us by Christ on the cross, reconciling us with the Father. But this peace is lost whenever human lives are "oppressed or downtrodden," as in the killing of unborn children, legalized by Roe v. Wade.

Father John Flynn - Gender and Education

Advocates of separate education for boys and girls received support from a report published recently in England. In December 2006, Ofsted, the government's inspectorate for children and learners in England, published a report titled, "2020 Vision." The document looked ahead to see what personalized teaching and learning might look like in schools 20 years into the new millennium. For ZENIT, Father Flynn summarizes this and other recent studies on the subject.
