

KEFN—Issues/Programs List FOURTH QUARTER 2008

KEFN, licensed to Eternal Family Network, is the only over the air television station that offers full-time Catholic television programming. KEFN operates non-commercially. According to The Official Catholic Directory, 2006, as of January 1, 2006 there were 555,750 Catholic residents within the Archdiocese of St. Louis, which encompasses the city of St. Louis and the ten surrounding counties in east central Missouri (the total 2000 Census population of the civil jurisdictions within the Archdiocese was 2,118,721; Catholics made up 26.23% of this number).

Unique among St. Louis area television stations, KEFN views the world through the prism of Catholic theology, faith and morals. With this viewpoint, KEFN believes that five overarching “problems, issues and needs” of the St. Louis community are unchanging: (1) The Need to Save One’s Immortal Soul; (2) Faith, Morals and Character; (3) Problems in the Secular Society including but not limited to Divorce, Abortion, Euthanasia, Poverty and Crime; (4) Children’s Intellectual and Spiritual Development; and (5) General Public Affairs from a Catholic Perspective.

ISSUE # 1—Need to Save One’s Immortal Soul

Program: Holy Mass
Dates: weekdays
Time: 7:00-8:00 a.m. (live); 6:00-7:00 pm (repeated) daily.
Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: daily
Type: Religious
Description: Worship and a homily in the Catholic tradition

Program: The Journey Home
Dates: Monday
Time: 7:00-8:00 pm CT
Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: Weekly
Type: Religious
Description: Host Marcus Grodi, a one-time Presbyterian minister, interviews interesting guests who discuss their roads to conversion to the Roman Catholic religion.

ISSUE #2 –Faith, Morals and Character

Program: Threshold of Hope
Date: Tuesday (live); rebroadcast at other dates and times
Time: 9:00-10:00 pm CT
Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: Weekly
Type: Religious
Description: This program is hosted by Rev. Mitchell Pacwa, S. J., who holds a Ph.D. in Old Testament studies from Vanderbilt University, has served as a college theology professor, is an expert on the Holy Land and speaks several languages. “Father Mitch” engages in an in-depth examination of Blessed John Paul II’s encyclical letter, *Fides et Ratio*. He looks at the late Pope’s attempts to use the Holy Scriptures and the Faith of the Roman Catholic Church to answer the important questions about the meaning of human life and death, of evil and good, of our final destiny

Description: Topics such as marriage, relationships, abortion, euthanasia, etc. are discussed on this program.

Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: Weekly
Type: Religious/Public Affairs

Description: This program is designed for teenagers and young adults. Different guests each week discuss topics relating to faith and morals applicable to all viewers, but with emphasis on adolescents and young adults

ISSUE #4—Children’s Intellectual and Spiritual Development

Program: Faith Factory
Date: Weekdays
Time: 3:00-4:00 pm CT
Duration: 1 hour
Frequency: Daily
Type: Educational/Informational

Description: This is a programming block which consists of various program titles which vary day to day, including “Great Bible Discovery Series”, “Image of God”, “Animated Stories from the New Testament”, “We Are Catholic”, “Rosary for Kids”, “My Catholic Family”, “Good Morning Jesus”, “Object Lessons”, “Bed Bug Bible Gang” and “The Friar”. All of these programs are designed to instill and grow moral values and virtue in children of varying ages; and teach children about faith and morals; the Catholic sacraments and the saints; and how to pray.

Description: Host Raymond Arroyo, News Director of the EWTN television network, anchors this weekly program, which features news reports from a Catholic perspective and interviews with prominent Catholic figures.

EWTN Presents "Catholic Canvas" An Unprecedented Look Inside the Vatican Museums

Irondale, AL (EWTN) – EWTN Global Catholic Network, with the support of the Primavera Fine Art Foundation, was given unprecedented access to the Vatican Museums to film a 10-episode original series called "Catholic Canvas."

"We were granted four days of filming inside the Sistine Chapel – a privilege that has never been granted to any other network," said EWTN President Michael Warsaw. "The Sistine Chapel is the backbone for the series because it conveys so beautifully in art the stories of our salvation."

Rome Producer Mary Shovlain explains the concept behind the series.

"Catholic Canvas is a journey through salvation history as seen in the art of the Vatican Museums," she said. "We begin with the Angels – the first to be created, the first to fall – which sets the stage for a journey through the Old Testament, from the creation to the fall of man, to our need for redemption and the promise of a redeemer, Christ."

Entire episodes are dedicated to Mary, to the Epiphany, to Christ's earthly ministry, His Passion, death and resurrection, St. Peter, and the Saints. "Of course, our journey ends, as will all of our journeys, with a look at the Last Judgment," Shovlain said.

Primavera Chairman and Co-founder Earnest Bentley is thrilled with the program that resulted with the help of his Foundation's support.

"Primavera Fine Art Foundation is committed to creating a renaissance of fine theological art in the Church," Bentley said. "As our Art Advisor has said, 'Every great work of art is a window between time and eternity. When we learn to contemplate art or come in contact with it, we actually come in contact with God, a little piece of His glory.'"

"For this reason, the Foundation believes bringing the treasures of the Vatican Museums into the viewers' living room is both a privilege and an opportunity to share with EWTN in this work for the Church."

Episode 1, a visual feast called "The Angels," will be hosted by Elisabeth Lev, Professor of Christian Art and Architecture at Duquesne University's Italian campus. Lev's expert commentary provides viewers with an in-depth explanation of the artistic genius behind the representation of the Cherubim and Seraphim as represented in

Costanza's Sarcophagus, Rafael's Madonna of Foligno, and many other masterpieces.

At the conclusion of each show, viewers also have the opportunity to see Father Mark Haydu, L.C., International Director of the Vatican Museums' Patrons of the Arts who gives a short presentation about one of the many gorgeous restoration projects being financed by the Patrons.

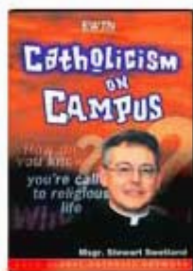

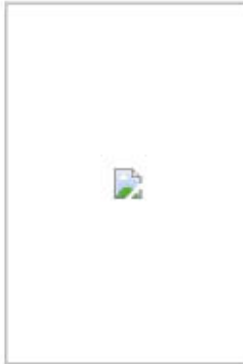
