

## **KEFN—Issues/Programs List SECOND QUARTER 2006**

KEFN, licensed to Eternal Family Network, is the only over the air television station that offers full-time Catholic television programming. KEFN operates non-commercially. According to The Official Catholic Directory, 2006, as of January 1, 2006 there were 555,750 Catholic residents within the Archdiocese of St. Louis, which encompasses the city of St. Louis and the ten surrounding counties in east central Missouri (the total 2000 Census population of the civil jurisdictions within the Archdiocese was 2,118,721; Catholics made up 26.23% of this number).

Unique among St. Louis area television stations, KEFN views the world through the prism of Catholic theology, faith and morals. With this viewpoint, KEFN believes that five overarching “problems, issues and needs” of the St. Louis community are unchanging: (1) The Need to Save One’s Immortal Soul; (2) Faith, Morals and Character; (3) Problems in the Secular Society including but not limited to Divorce, Abortion, Euthanasia, Poverty and Crime; (4) Children’s Intellectual and Spiritual Development; and (5) General Public Affairs from a Catholic Perspective.

### ISSUE # 1—Need to Save One’s Immortal Soul

J., who holds a Ph.D. in Old Testament studies from Vanderbilt University, has served as a college theology professor, is an expert on the Holy Land and speaks several languages. “Father Mitch” engages in an in-depth examination of Blessed John Paul II’s encyclical letter, *Fides et Ratio*. He looks at the late Pope’s attempts to use the Holy Scriptures and the Faith of the Roman Catholic Church to answer the important questions about the meaning of human life and death, of evil and good, of our final destiny

## **RECENT**

### **ZENIT - The Fatima Pope**

Pope John Paul II survived an attempt on his life in 1981 and said a "maternal hand" had saved him. A quarter-century after the attack, journalist and writer Renzo Allegri reconstructed the event in a book entitled "Il Papa di Fatima" (The Fatima Pope), published in Italian by Mondadori. In this interview with ZENIT, Allegri explains the connection between John Paul II and Fatima.

### **Father Edward McNamara - Singing the Consecration**

Father McNamara, professor of liturgy at the Regina Apostolorum Pontifical Athenaeum, answers questions of general interest on liturgical norms. Added this week is the answer to a question regarding whether singing the consecration is acceptable. One of the changes brought about by Vatican II's liturgical reform was the possibility of a sung consecration. Until then, "the Latin rite was practically the only one that did not sing the words of the consecration."

### **Pope Benedict XVI - Urbi et Orbi: Easter Sunday 2006**

On Easter Sunday morning, 16 April 2006, after celebrating Holy Mass in St. Peter's Square, Pope Benedict XVI imparted to the faithful the traditional Message and Blessing Urbi et Orbi (to the city and to the world), broadcast live via television and radio to many nations across the globe.

### **ZENIT - Lots of Data Point to Fewer Births**

In a message sent 28 April 2006 to participants in a meeting of the Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences, Benedict XVI cited an "urgent need" for reflection in the area of demography. Experts agree that an increase in life expectancies is being met with a drop in birthrates. Societies are aging and "many nations or groups of nations lack a sufficient number of young people to renew their population," the Holy Father wrote. The root of the problem is moral and spiritual, rather than economic.

### **LOR - Summary of Deus Caritas Est**

This is a summary, supplied by L'Osservatore Romano, of the first encyclical of Pope Benedict XVI, Deus Caritas Est, whose purpose was to recover the meaning of the word "love." Though the word has become tarnished through misuse, "we cannot simply abandon it, we must take it up again, purify it and give back to it its original splendor..."

### **Alberto Rum - Under the Banner and Protection of Mary**

For the Feast of St. Louis de Montfort, 28 April, this article highlights the close association in Saint Louis' spirituality of devotion to the Blessed Mother with devotion to the Blessed Sacrament. Illustrating this association is a Eucharistic-Marian hymn.

### **Pope Benedict XVI - Pastor of God's Church**

At the General Audience in St Peter's Square on 19 April 2006, the anniversary of Pope Benedict XVI's election, the Holy Father commented on his first moments as Pope and reflected on the lingering joy of the Resurrection in the Octave of Easter.

### **PAL - Final Declaration of the 12th General Assembly**

On the occasion of its 12th General Assembly [2006], the Pontifical Academy for Life celebrated an international Congress on the theme: "The human embryo in the pre-implantation phase: Scientific aspects and bioethical considerations". At the conclusion of the Congress, the Academy offered to the Ecclesial Community and to the general public, certain considerations on the theme of
