KEFN-CA—Issues/Programs List FOURTH QUARTER 2014

KEFN-CA, licensed to Eternal Family Network, is the only over the air television station that offers full-time Catholic television programming in the St. Louis metropolitan area comprising portions of eastern Missouri and southern Illinois. KEFN-CA operates non-commercially. It is estimated that there are more than 500,000 Catholic residents within the Archdiocese of St. Louis, which encompasses the city of St. Louis and the ten surrounding counties in east central Missouri. Across the river in southern Illinois, it is estimated that there are over 100,000 Catholics in the Diocese of Belleville, which includes St. Clair County, one of the two major counties in the "Metro East" area of the St. Louis metropolitan area, and over 140,000 Catholics in the Diocese of Springfield, which encompasses Madison County, the other "Metro East" county.

Unique among St. Louis area television stations, KEFN-CA views the world through the prism of Catholic theology, faith and morals. With this viewpoint, KEFN-CA believes that five overarching "problems, issues and needs" of the St. Louis community are unchanging: (1) The Need to Save One's Immortal Soul; (2) Faith, Morals and Character; (3) Problems in the Secular Society including but not limited to Divorce, Abortion, Euthanasia, Poverty and Crime; (4) Children's Intellectual and Spiritual Development; and (5) General Public Affairs from a Catholic Perspective.
