

## **KEFN—Issues/Programs List FIRST QUARTER 2006**

KEFN, licensed to Eternal Family Network, is the only over the air television station that offers full-time Catholic television programming. KEFN operates non-commercially. According to The Official Catholic Directory, 2006, as of January 1, 2006 there were 555,750 Catholic residents within the Archdiocese of St. Louis, which encompasses the city of St. Louis and the ten surrounding counties in east central Missouri (the total 2000 Census population of the civil jurisdictions within the Archdiocese was 2,118,721; Catholics made up 26.23% of this number).

Unique among St. Louis area television stations, KEFN views the world through the prism of Catholic theology, faith and morals. With this viewpoint, KEFN believes that five overarching “problems, issues and needs” of the St. Louis community are unchanging: (1) The Need to Save One’s Immortal Soul; (2) Faith, Morals and Character; (3) Problems in the Secular Society including but not limited to Divorce, Abortion, Euthanasia, Poverty and Crime; (4) Children’s Intellectual and Spiritual Development; and (5) General Public Affairs from a Catholic Perspective.

He looks at the late Pope’s attempts to use the Holy Scriptures and the Faith of the Roman Catholic Church to answer the important questions about the meaning of human life and death, of evil and good, of our final destiny

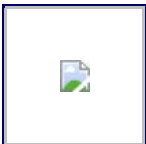

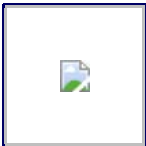

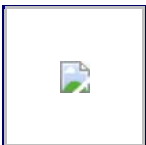
### **PASSION CRUCIFIX - Item: [CRU19](#)**

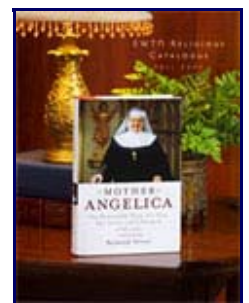

#### **ZENIT - Marriage as a Public Good**

Marriage's role as a public institution is increasingly under attack. In the midst of pressures for legalization of same-sex marriage, formal recognition of de facto couples, and the continuing problem of divorce, the traditional view of marriage is no longer clear to many people. Drawing from a volume of essays by leading scholars, ZENIT summarizes defenses of traditional marriage as serving the public good.

#### **Pope Benedict XVI - Message for Lent 2006**

The Holy Father's first Lenten Message of his pontificate, he addressed the problem of poverty in the world. Encouraging a form of "globalization that is focused upon the true good of mankind," the Pope urged "political leaders and those with economic and financial power to promote development based on respect for the dignity of every man and woman."

#### **Cardinal Javier Lozano Barragán - 14th World Day of the Sick, 11 February: Adelaide, Australia**

On 11 February 2006, in Adelaide, Australia, Cardinal Javier Lozano Barragán, President of the Pontifical Council for Health Pastoral Care and Papal Envoy to the celebrations for the 14th World Day of the Sick, presided at Holy Mass in the St. Francis Xavier Cathedral. In his homily, the Cardinal attributed much mental sickness in the world to "the negation of God and ethical-religious relativism."

#### **Pope Benedict XVI - Homily at the Vatican's Church of St. Anne**

On 5 February 2006, the Holy Father visited the Parish of St. Anne, just inside the Vatican gate, where he presided at the concelebration of Sunday Mass. The Lord "gives us his hand, lifts us up and heals us", the Pope said. "dispelling the fog of ideologies and forms of idolatry".

#### **Pope Benedict XVI - A Symphony of Hearts Prays for Christian Unity**

On 25 January 2006, the Holy Father traveled to the Basilica of St. Paul Outside-the-Walls to preside at the Liturgy of Vespers for the conclusion of the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity. In his Homily at the Service, the Pope pointed out that "at the base of the commitment to ecumenism there is the conversion of heart", and that "it is the presence of Christ that makes the common prayer of those gathered in his Name effective."
