Traffic fatalities on Alabama Highways increased significantly during this year's Thanksgiving holiday period with 11 fatalities, that compared to 5 fatalities during the same holiday period last year.
"Diabetes Work Shop"... Every Year and estimated 31, 000 people in Alabama are diagnosed with diabetes... needless to say we as Alabamians must address the Diabetes epidemic in our state.
