KSJD, KZET, and KICO Quarterly Issues-Programs Report 1st Quarter 2023 (January - March 2023)

Issue: Native American Issues

Discussion of Issue: The KSJD listening area is home to the Ute Mountain Ute and Navajo reservations, and the challenges faced by indigenous people from these tribes are many times distinct from those of the general public. KSJD has continued covering more stories related to Native American health, land use, and sovereignty during this quarter

Programming: KSJD broadcast news stories about Native American issues throughout this quarter from a variety of sources.

A. KSJD, in partnership with KSUT, secured funding from a grant source to bring more stories about under-served and under-represented Native American people through the Voices From The Edge of the Plateau project and in particular from Clark Admits, a reporter focused on this endeavor.

Issue: Student Overdoses and Access to Narcan

Discussion of Issue: Fentanyl overdoses among young people have become a nationwide issue. After a high school student in nearby Durango, Colorado overdosed on fentanyl, students began a campaign to have access to the Narcan, a drug that can save people from the effects of an overdose. The students wanted to be able to carry Narcan on school grounds but school administrators were reluctant.

Programming: KSJD broadcast news stories about Native American issues throughout this quarter from a variety of sources.

Issue: Climate and Water In The West

Discussion of Issue: Water has become the nexus through which many social and economic issues in the west are viewed, including agriculture, climate change, and growth. KSJD has used our programming to take a deep look at water issues locally, and across the country so that our listeners can be better educated on the challenges the future may hold around water issues.

Programming: KSJD addressed this issue through a variety of programs, including local and national news interviews and coverage, as well as public service announcements.

C. Farm News and Views (Weekly on Tuesdays at 7:45am)

Locally produced four-minute feature offers information and analysis about agriculture, and occasionally included information about water policy and environmental news that impacts local farmers and ranchers.

Issue: Agriculture

Discussion of Issue: Southwest Colorado and the Four Corners Area are home to farmers and ranchers who need to balance economic and environmental concerns to be successful. Water issues, climate change, and social changes present changes that agricultural producers need to be aware of and respond to. Discussion of these challenges helps to educate and present solutions to farmers, ranchers, and consumers.

Programming: KSJD addressed this issue through a variety of programs, including local and national news interviews and coverage, and a weekly locally produced feature.

A. Farm News and Views (Weekly on Tuesdays at 7:45am)

Locally produced four-minute feature offers information and analysis about agriculture policy and practices and the food economy that is relevant to farmers and ranchers in the KSJD listening area as well as the general public.

B. Capitol Coverage Project (Occasionally on weekdays between 7:00-9:00am)

The Capitol Coverage Project is an effort of Rocky Mountain Community Radio, a group of non-commercial public and community radio stations mainly in Colorado, with stations in Utah and New Mexico. The project provides daily news reports from sessions of the Colorado State Legislature and examines decisions made by elected state representatives and senators, including issues centered on agriculture in Colorado and across the region.
