- "Fat City"** - Durham, N.C., formerly the capital of the tobacco industry, is now home to three major medically supervised diet clinics treating thousands of overweight people annually. 09/26/04 **"Wanted: Dead Or Alive"** - a report on Abu Musab al-Zarqawi, the 37-year-old Jordanian terrorist thought to be responsible for the recent series of beheadings, kidnappings, murders and other acts of terrorism. Includes interviews with: Saleh Ilhami, a journalist; Laith Shebeilat, who met Zarqawi while in prison; Oraib al-Rantawi, head of a research institute in Aman that tracks radical Islamic movements; and Mowaffak al-Rubaie, national security adviser to Iraq's interim government. "The Closer" - a report on closers, fraudulent telemarketers who convince people to send them millions of dollars, based on phone conversations. 09/08/04 **"For The Record"** - a report on allegations that President George W. Bush avoided serving in the Vietnam War by landing a much-sought-after spot in the Texas National Guard, and then apparently failed to meet some of his obligations to the Guard. In an interview, former Texas House Speaker and Lt. Governor Ben Barnes, a Democrat, claims that he was the one who in 1968 obtained the guard position for Bush. Also interviewed are Dan Bartlett, the president's communication director (C: John Roberts); and Robert Strong, former director of the Texas National Guard administrative office. - 09/29/04 **"The Professor"** - college professor Paul Krueger was harboring a chilling secret: he was on parole for a triple homicide he committed nearly 40 years ago. Krueger transformed his life, earning a bachelor's degree while in prison, subsequently was awarded three graduate degrees and had been a respected professor at Penn State since 1999. Because of a change in state policies governing parolees, Pennsylvania officials were notified of Krueger's past and a job offer from National University of California was rescinded. "The Desperate Journey" - an estimated one million people will try to illegally enter the United States from Central America. Includes a report on the agonizing conditions that mark the lives of these desperate migrants. (C: Dan Rather - P: Steve Glauber)

- 09/30/04 CAMPAIGN '04: Presidential Debate (9:00-11:00p) - live coverage (from the University of Miami in Coral Gables, Florida) of the first of three Presidential debates between Republican nominee President George W. Bush and Democratic nominee Senator John Kerry (D-MA). The debate moderator was Jim Lehrer of PBS. The debate itself concluded at 10:30p. Included in CBS News coverage after the debate (10:30-11:00p) were: (1) live interviews with Senator John McCain (R-AZ) and Senator Joseph Biden (D-DE); (2) results of a CBS News 'instant poll' of 200 heretofore uncommitted voters across the country who watched the debate and registered their reactions online as the debate progressed; and (3) commentary and analysis by CBS Correspondents Dan Rather (anchor, NY), Bob Schieffer, Anthony Mason, John Roberts and Byron Pitts.

- 09/26/04 "Ethics In Sports" - the program looks at the role of religion in American society where winning, lying and cheating are too common in sports. The controversies over illegal performance-enhancing drugs and excessive violence that come from "winning at all costs" are examined. "Ethics In Sports" shows how ethical conflicts between religion and sports may be resolved. The program features a variety of views expressed by: David Callahan, author of "The Cheating Culture"; Sports agent Jerrold Colton; and William J. Baker, Professor of History at the University of Maine, who is writing a book, "Playing With God: How Religious Folk Learned To Embrace Modern Sport". Also includes the stories of Adam Taliaferro, A New Jersey high school football star who was injured seriously at Penn State and is not expected to walk again and 22-year-old Dimitry Salita, a 22-year-old Ukrainian-American boxer who turned pro after winning the U.S. Amateur Championships and when the International Amateur Competition would not honor his request to not fight on the Jewish Sabbath.
