7/1 CMS B2S Plan - THEY SCHEDULED IT TO WORK OFF OF THE GUIDANCE THE GOVERNOR WAS SUPPOSED TO PROVIDE TODAY - NOW THEY SAY TIME IS TICKING AS THEY TRY TO FIGURE OUT WHAT NEXT SCHOOL YEAR WILL LOOK LIKE. AS CORONAVIRUS CASES SURGE IN THE CAROLINAS - MILLIONS OF PARENTS STUDENTS AND TEACHERS ANXIOUSLY WAIT TO FIND OUT IF KIDS WILL BE BACK IN THE CLASSROOM. TONIGHT - THE CMS BOARD OF EDUCATION WILL WORK TOWARDS FIGURING OUT HOW TO DO THAT SAFELY - IF AT ALL. ELYSE DASHEW/CMS Board of Education: "Our staff will be presenting to us their best thinking on three different plans for three different scenarios for reopening and we'll have an opportunity for board members to ask all of our questions and its important" THE FIRST OPTION IS AS CLOSE TO NORMAL AS POSSIBLE, KIDS BACK IN THE CLASSROOM WITH MINIMAL SOCIAL DISTANCING AND SOME HEALTH PRECAUTIONS IN PLACE. ON THE OTHER END OF THE SPECTRUM IS ALL REMOTE LEARNING.

7/2 CMS Plan - STUDENTS GOT A TASTE OF LEARNING AT HOME DURING THE PANDEMIC - AND IT MAY HAVE BEEN A TRIAL RUN FOR THE UPCOMING CHOOL YEAR. THE CMS BOARD OF EDUCATION PLANNING FOR THREE DIFFERENT SCENARIOS. THE FIRST IS CLOSEST TO NORMAL - EVERYONES BACK IN THE CLASSROOM WITH HEALTH SCREENINGS AND SOME SOCIAL DISTANCING. Deanna Peck// Parent & Teacher " As a parent I want her safe and healthy." THE SECOND IS A MIX OF IN PERSON AND REMOTE. EACH GRADE WILL BE SPLIT IN TO 3 GROUPS AND ONLY ONE GROUP WILL BE IN THE BUILDING AT A TIME. PRE K THROUGH 8TH GRADERS WILL DO ONE WEEK IN SCHOOL, 2 WEEKS OUT. 9TH THROUGH 11TH WILL DO THE SAME, BUT EVERY FRIDAY WILL BE REMOTE LEARNING. AND HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS WILL ONLY BE IN THE CLASSROOM ONCE A WEEK.

7/3 Mayor Violence Emails - This process has taken much longer than some would've liked. The mayor said the city would tackle the violence issue in January...and did discuss it at length during a meeting that month...but we've heard little publicly since. Meanwhile, more and more people keep getting murdered. My son was murdered March the 22nd, 2016. Lucille Puckett wears her son's ashes in a bullet around her neck. She shared her frustration with us late last year about the city's slow to evolve response to deadly violence. Why are we waiting? If it was your son, your daughter, your grandchild, would you be waiting then?

7/4 Union County - a new push for a resignation of the union county school board of education chair. Stallings town councilman *john martin* is calling for the move. He says that the chair-person, melissa merrell, who spoke to media after board member tom killings resigned for his racist posts, actually "liked" one of the insensitive memes on his facebook page. Those posts have since been deleted. MERRELL HAS responded to the claims saying she has no recollection of responding to that post. We are working to get more information on this story and will bring you updates as soon as we get them.

7/7 Back to School Debate - "I don't care if I have to wear the mask and gloves, I just want to go back to school." A YEAR SHE AND HER MOM HOPE IS AS NORMAL AS POSSIBLE. Parents want to see kids go back to their lives." FAMILIES... EDUCATORS AND HEALTH EXPERTS ARE WEIGHTING POTENTIAL HEALTH RISKS AGAINST THE IMPACT TO EDUCATION QUALITY. There will be a lot of consequences for children not being able to go back to school that are even more detrimental than getting COVID themselves. A RECENT STUDY PUBLISHED IN THE LANCET CHILD AND ADOLESCENT HEALTH, FINDS CORONAVIRUS CAUSES MILD ILLNESS IN MOST KIDS. BUT THE LONG TERM EFFECTS ARE NOT YET KNOWN.. AND STATES ARE PROCEEDING CAUTIOUSLY. SOME RELEASING REOPENING GUIDELINES... THAT INCLUDE REQUIRING MASKS... SOCIALLY DISTANCED DESKS... STAGGERED LUNCHES AND ENHANCED CLEANING.

7/8 Schools - THE WHITE HOUSE'S COROANVIRUS TASK FORCE WILL BE GIVING A BRIEFING AT THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION. THIS COMING AFTER A DISCUSSION YESTERDAY - WHERE PRESIDENT TRUMP REPEATED THAT HE WANTED SCHOOLS TO REOPEN IN THE FALL. HE SAYS HE PLANS TO PUT PRESSURE ON GOVERNORS TO GET KIDS BACK IN THE CLASSROOM. BUT ONE TEACHER HERE IN THE CAROLINAS - WHO'S RECOVERING FROM THE CORONAVIRUS HERSELF - SAYS SHE'S WORRIED ABOUT WHAT THAT WILL LOOK LIKE.

7/9 Trump on Schools - And of course - higher ed - isn't the only educational debate - as the president doubles down on his promise for pressure to get schools reopened as early as next month. This morning - the white house is asking the c-d-c to come up with less "restrictive" guidelines for schools - after calling their earlier recommendations "tough" and "expensive".

President trump - now says he'll push to cut funding for schools who don't get kids back in the classroom this fall.

7/10 Hispanic Prosperity Initiative - President Trump signing an executive order to create the "Hispanic Prosperity Initiative." It creates an advisory board- tasked with improving education and job opportunities for the Hispanic community. It comes as the president hopes to win a bigger share of the Latino vote in.

7/12 NC Back to schools decision - THIS WEEK GOVERNOR COOPER IS EXPECTED TO ANNOUNCE HIS PLAN FOR SCHOOLS TO RETURN IN THE FALL. IT'S EXPECTED TO INCLUDE A COMBINATION OF VIRTUAL AND IN PERSON LEARNING. TODAY, U-S EDUCATION SECRETARY BETSY DEVOS SAID SHE INTENDS TO HAVE AMERICAN SCHOOLS OPEN FOR *IN-PERSON* CLASSES THIS FALL.\

7/13 Rock Hills Schools - today -- education leaders in rock hill will meet to discuss the fall semester. A subcommittee is expected to recommend a blended learning approach for students. This would involve having 'a' and 'b' days -- where students alternate going into

the classroom. According to a survey -- nearly half of rock hill parents are in favor of this schedule.

7/14 BOE Meetings - we know at least two districts in our area are meeting tonight. Both the lincoln county and union county school boards will talk about their plans for the fall. Stay with us for those updates later tonight...

7/15 SC School Plans - SCHOOLS MUST HAVE IN CLASS FACE TO FACE TEACHING SO THAT THESE CHILDREN DO NOT FALL BEHIND. LADIES AND GENTLEMEN IF THEY FALL BEHIND JUST IN THIS ONE PERIOD THEY MAY NEVER CATCH UP. AND WE MAY HAVE A GENERATION LOST TO THEIR EDUCATIONAL OPPORTUNITIES. Governor mcmaster says the state would *not approve any plans filed by a district that doesn't give parents a choice.

7/16 Back to School Plans - Molly Spearman/ South Carolina Superintendent of Education "I don't believe that directive needs to come from Washington, D.C., and really not even from Columbia. That needs to be decided in the local community where it's best -- where folks know the spread. They know the needs of the community,"> OTHER SCHOOL DISTRICTS LIKE LANCASTER AND FORT MILL HAVE VOICED THEIR OPPOSITION TO THE GOVERNOR'S ORDER FOR *IN-PERSON* LEARNING.

7/17 Asheville Reparations - How is this gonna transpire and what's gonna become of it? Is it gonna be more lip service? Is it gonna be soething that just sounds great or is it gonna be a real intentional action plan to do some real work to support the black community city leaders say priorities for investment may Include home ownership, access to health care and closing the education gap.

7/20 Districts finalizing plans - other districts---- still working out the details of what reopening will look like. Wcnc charlotte's chloe leshner is at villa heights elementary school with more.

7/21 YMCA Virtual Learning - AS CMS ANNOUNCES A PLAN THAT WILL HAVE CHILDREN LEARNING REMOTELY - MANY WORKING PARENTS ARE SCRAMBLING. NOW ..SOME LOCAL CHARLOTTE Y-M-C-A'S ARE STEPPING UP TO HELP HUNDREDS OF FAMILIES IN CHARLOTTE. They're OFFERING LOW-COST, AND IN SOME CASES NO-COST *FULL DAY* CHILD CARE, AND HELP WITH SCHOOL WORK. THE PROGRAM WILL SERVE KIDS AGES KINDERGARTEN THROUGH 6TH GRADE. THE YMCA IS IN THE PROCESS OF HIRING PEOPLE WITH EDUCATION BACKGROUNDS TO HELP.

7/22 Virtual Learning - IT'S THE REALITY OF OUR EDUCATION SYSTEM - A MAP THAT PLAINLY SHOWS THE DIFFERENT EXPERIENCES OF STUDENTS.
THE RED AREAS SHOW THE LOW PERFORMING SCHOOLS WITH THE HIGHEST CONCENTRATIONS OF POVERTY. DATA SHOWS ONLINE LEARNING DID NOT WORK FOR THOSE STUDENTS. FORMER STATE SENATOR - AND CMS PARENT - JOEL FORD

THINKS THE WAY CMS IS MOVING FORWARD IS SETTING SOME STUDENTS UP FOR FAILURE AND IF BUSINESSES HAVE BEEN ABLE TO SAFELY OPERATE - SCHOOLS SHOULD TOO - FOR THOSE WHO NEED IT. HE FEARS THE GAP WILL ONLY GET WIDER - BUT THERE IS AN EFFORT TO TRY AND CLOSE IT.

E2D - ELIMINATE THE DIGITAL DIVIDE WORKS WITH CMS TO GIVE STUDENTS IN TITLE 1 SCHOOLS WHO QUALITY FOR FREE AND REDUCED LUNCH THE TECHNOLOGY THEY NEED TO SUCCEED.

7/23 Caldwell back to school plans - Caldwell county schools releasing its plans for the upcoming school year. The board of education there approving a blended learning plan - offering in-person and remote learning. Families can also opt into a full remote learning plan.

7/24 School Reopen - WE'RE MORE THAN FOUR MONTHS INTO THIS PANDEMIC AND THERE'S STILL NO REAL DIRECT PLAN TO SAFELY RETURN KIDS TO THE CLASSROOM--LEAVING MANY WITH QUESTIONS AND FEARS. THE C-D-C NOW BEEFING UP THEIR GUIDELINES TO HELP ANSWERS QUESTIONS, AND ENCOURAGE IN PERSON LEARNING. THIS IS THE TIME OF YEAR KIDS START THINKING ABOUT BACK TO SCHOOL--- NEW SUPPLIES, NEW CLOTHES.

BUT WITH THE NUMBER OF CASES IN THE CAROLINA'S RISING, PARENTS AND TEACHERS ARE WORRIED ABOUT HOW TO RE-OPEN SCHOOLS SAFELY.

7/27 SC for Ed Protest Today -An education advocacy group is expected to protest at the South Carolina statehouse. "S-C for Ed" says they will hold a "motor march" to protest the reopening of schools this fall. They plan to drive through Columbia later this afternoon.

7/28 Clover School plan - south carolina education leaders just approved clover school district's back-to-school plan. Elementary students will attend in-person classes five days a week -- and middle and high school students will have alternating schedules. The superintendent also ruled that face masks will be required on *all* school buses.

7/29 Look Ahead - We have a lot more coming up all new tonight on word charlotte at five. Including an interview you will only see here! Tonight at 5-30 -- we are talking live with mecklenburg county health director gibbie harris -- we are asking her about slow test results in the county -- and what needs to happen before c-m-s students can go back to class full time. And you've heard of the 'summer slide' -- when students forget what they learned during summer break -- but tonight we're learning the *covid slide* is having an even bigger impact on kids' education. What you can do now to help bridge the gaps.

7/30 Top Stories - today -- the c-m-s board of education held an emergency meeting on reopening schools. And in a unanimous decision, the board voted that the district will now move forward with a fully remote-learning at the start of the school year. Originally students were supposed to go to class in-person for the first two weeks...that's plan b. But due to recent rise in cases and staff shortages...they are moving to plan c.

7/31 CMS Virtual Learning -"None of us are expendable on the idea that learning comes before anything. It doesn't, safety comes first" SOME TEACHERS FEELING A WEIGHT LIFTED OFF THEIR SHOULDERS - THEIR DEMANDS ANSWERED AS THE CMS BOARD OF EDUCATION DECIDES TO SCRAP THEIR ORIGINAL PLANS AND START THE YEAR VIRTUALLY. AMANDA THOMPSON/CMS Educator: "teachers and students rise to the occasion. I think that we're going to do a really good job of onboarding and take the gap of not seeing our kids in person, in school versus being virtual" SOME STUDENTS WILL GET TO GO INTO THE SCHOOL BUILDING.

20,000 KIDS IN THE DISTRICT HAVE SPECIAL NEEDS - AND VIRTUAL LEARNING DOESN'T WORK FOR ALL OF THEM. CMS WILL PROVIDE AN IN PERSON INSTRUCTION OPPORTUNITY TO SOME OF THOSE STUDENTS WHEN THEY ARE ABLE TO. THE DECISION TO GO ALL ONLINE CHANGING PLANS ONCE AGAIN FOR PARENTS.

8/1 Alcohol Restrictions - Gibbie Harris/Meck Co Health Director "we really want to do what we can to encourage compliance rather than issuing citations and closing places now. So the first step will likely be education.

8/2 Alcohol Restrictions -"Back in the day, there was a famous phrase, 'it's 10 pm. Do you know where your children are? Thanks to the pandemic, a new phrase, 'it's 11 pm. Are you holding a beer? Case Warnemunde (Warn-uh-Mon-dee) owns Old Town Public House in downtown Cornelius... We were just starting to pick up a little bit here; think people are more comfortable with coming out and now we're definitely heading in the opposite direction which hurts" As a bottle shop...it's technically considered a retailer so its allowed to be open.. While Mecklenburg County launched its own alcohol curfew last week...Cornelius leaders didn't sign on to it. "putting the responsibility in the hands of the businesses, trusting that we're going to do the right thing"

8/3 Covid College Tuition - the pandemic is creating more controversy between students and universities... Schools like american university, georgetown and george washington university are offering a 10-percent discount on tution -- this comes as these schools will hold classes online for the fall semester. But some students say -- that's not enough.

8/4 Union County Schools - Our greatest fear is death and who will it be?"

It's the reality some Union County teachers come to terms with as they prepare to head back to class. "It's almost like Russian roulette and that's the game that the board of education and the people in the offices that are closed off and to everyone else are playing with our lives." An online petition is gaining traction in Union County with more than 27-hundred signatures in favor of Plan C—all remote learning.

Union County's percent of positive COVID-19 tests currently stands at 10 percent.

The petition calls for remote learning until the percent of positive tests is five percent or lower. "We really want the board of education to hear that we need to look at the data and not just the data that is being cherry-picked and glossed over, but the data that really talks about COVID in our community." Teachers say COVID-19 is already present in Union

County school settings. Health officials say 16 people tested positive after attending the Marvin Ridge High School graduation. A second cluster identified at East Union Middle School involving five staff members working together. And recently-- three football players at Forest Hills High School tested positive. For those reasons-- teachers are voicing this message before anyone steps back in a classroom: "We are really trying to our superintendent and to our board: You are comfortable with this idea, but what gives you the right to choose that for everyone else?"

8/5 Meck Pre K - Meck Pre-K announced it will reopen for in-person learning beginning in September. The program was started back in 2018 to improve "access for all" to early childhood care and education. The program is free and hopes to prepare students for kindergarten. WCNC Charlotte's *Ashley Daley* has been digging into their reopening plans. And Ashley, you also spoke with the program's director today...

8/6 UNCC Elementary - we're getting a look at a new elementary school in charlotte. "niner university elementary" will be based on the unc charlotte campus. The program is part of the school's initiative to give students in low-performing schools a better education.

8/9 Enforcing Guidelines - As COVID-19 numbers begin to look promising -- a warning to the public -- to not let our guard down. We need to keep our foot on the gas with the things we know that work.)) It's why there's a debate among Mecklenburg County leaders on the enforcement of state and local executive orders regarding face masks, social distancing, and alcohol restrictions.

8/11 Covid and Teens Futures - I knew that was going to be a struggle for me." Amari Toomer started her senior year at Carver High in ?? With a solid plan. {Amari Toomer} "I was going to work my entire senior year and save up \$400 a month and have that for school." The 18-year-old would apply to a 4-year university and work to support herself. Then came COVID. Toomer lost her job and had trouble finding another one. {Amari Toomer} "How am I going to survive while I'm here? I can't just rely on my parents cause they still have to take care of my little brother and pay their own bills." A new study from studentloanhero, shows 22 percent of college students will either transfer to a school closer to home, won't go at all, or remain unsure about their plans. And in metro Atlanta, the non-profit CARE, is finding food insecurity is another concern. {Ryan Shephard, Executive Director CARE Global Innovation Hub.} "A lot of households are having their earning and their income sources interrupted by the pandemic and because of that it's forcing some difficult decisions for all members of the family," According to CARE, food insecurity reduces a teen's chances of graduating from high school, because hunger forces them to miss classes or they have to find a job to support their family. While the odds seemed stacked against Toomer, she discovered a plan B for her education. Instead of the university she hoped for, she'll head to Atlanta Technical College, since it was closer to home. She encourages other teens to not give up.

8/12 SC Teacher free training - new this morning -- south carolina is helping teachers adjust to virtual learning. The state department of education is offering a free online training to thousands of teachers and administrators. The course will cover different ways to teach and facilitate activities in online classrooms. It's being paid for by the federal CARES act.

8/13 WH School roundtable - Parents and teachers meeting with white house leaders - to talk back to school safety. The presidents hasn't minced words about re-opening schools fully this fall. But hundreds of districts nationwide - and here in the carolinas - opting for virtual or hybrid approaches. Education secretary betsy devos - urging those schools to reopen.

8/14 Teacher concerns - FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL WILL FEEL DIFFERENT AND OF COURSE THERE WILL BE CHALLENGES. 8/17 CMS First Day - Thousands of C-M-S students are logging on for the first day of online learning. The district - launching the fall semester - all online. It might not stay that way though. The district superintendent says they've already given a plan to the state board of education for bringing students back to to the classroom. We don't have a timeline yet for when that could happen.

8/18 CMS Tech Glitches - a major snag in the first day back for thousands of c-m-s students. A statewide glitch in the department of education's online learning system - left families frustrated. But the superintendent is promising things will go smoother today. He says just in case the statewide platform isn't fixed - teachers have a back up plan to connect with students via zoom.

8/19 B2S Tech Issues - It's clear that the pandemic and the start of the school year have caused concern, anxiety, and some frustration." Some public schools in North Carolina are opening with a mix of in-person and online lessons...While others are going full remote. It means students are not only trying to learn... they're having to navigate tech glitches. For the second time this week—the North Carolina Department of Public Instruction announced "users are experiencing issues when accessing N-C edcloud." "I'm

going to start by clicking NC edcloud." It's the platform students utilize in remote learning. Even though districts like Union County opted Plan B—the blend of in-person and online instruction... Students are only in the school building one day week... and learning remotely the other four.

8/21 Homeschool Trend - the new - trendy - ways that could give you some inspiration for your kids' education.

8/22 Harris Follow - A month after sending tat email, does she still support kids returning to school right now? While the health director didn't answer with a yes or no, it's clear she thinks we need to find a way to get children back into the classroom. Getting kids back to school and parents back to work... "I think that needs to be our priority in our community." Gibbie Harris continues to believe that should remain our focus...especially for Pre-K, elementary and maybe even middle school students.

7/10 Hispanic Prosperity Initiative - President Trump signing an executive order to create the "Hispanic Prosperity Initiative." It creates an advisory board- tasked with improving education and job opportunities for the Hispanic community. It comes as the president hopes to win a bigger share of the Latino vote in November's election.

7/11 Ft Mill Clover District Plan - TWO LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS LAID OUT PLANS for THE SCHOOL YEAR. FORT MILL AND CLOVER SCHOOL DISTRICTS WILL BOTH OPERATE UNDER A HYBRID SCHEDULE. THAT MEANS SOME STUDENTS ARE ONLY IN THE BUILDING CERTAIN DAYS OF THE WEEK. ELEMENTARY WILL BE IN SCHOOL 5 DAYS A WEEK... AND ONLY INTERACT WITH THE SAME CLASS AND STAFF. 7/13 3 Weekend Homicides - C-M-P-D investigating after three deadly shootings in just 24 hours. Saturday night- a man was shot and killed at a gas station on East W-T Harris Boulevard. Then Sunday afternoon- another victim was shot and killed near Sugar Creek Community Park. And just three hours later in the University area - a man was shot and killed in his car at Robinsdale Apartments. C-M-P-D does *not think these shootings are connected- but ask you to contact them with any information.

7/14 Atrium Free Masks - One of Charlotte's biggest health care providers is handing out free masks for the community. Atrium Health teamed up local businesses to distribute two-million masks to people in the Charlotte area. Today they have out free masks outside the hospital on east boulevard. Atrium says so far they've handed out about a quarter-million masks since Governor Roy Copper announced a mask mandate here in North Carolina.

7/15 Parents - From the start of the pandemic – some neighbors have been forming small quananteams – and now with concerns over students being back in classrooms – some of those groups are looking at ways to keep the team together when it comes to school. We live in a neighborhood where we have 14 or 15 rising 1st graders that all go to the same school. 9/10 SC Covid Numbers - Even if we are seeing some benefit from COVID-safe behaviors in the community, we're still in for a rocky flu season. AND IT'S JUST A FEW WEEKS AWAY... HEALTH OFFICIALS AND DOCTORS ALIKE WARNING OF WHAT'S BEEN CALLED A "TWIN-DEMIC"... FLU AND COVID COMBINED. IT COMES AS THE CAROLINAS SEEM TO BE STABILIZING ON THE HEELS OF BACK TO SCHOOL REOPENING. WEDNESDAY... NORTH CAROLINA HAD JUST UNDER 900 NEW CASES... MAKING FOR TWO BACK-TO-BACK DAYS UNDER ONE THOUSAND SINCE JUNE.

9/11 Spaghettios Donation - this story sure to warm your heart - a community comes together for a mother of five -- who has a child with autism. After searching everywhere she couldn't find her daugher's favorite food spaghettios - anywhere. She says that's all

she can get her to eat. Then word got around - the community stepped up - in a huge way! She now has almost 200 cans of spaghettios.

9/12 5 year old follow - Its called the stop killing our children march.. And this is where it will start.. This is the food lion on Wendover road.. And the community members i've spoke with say the community needs to ask themselves.. When it comes to gun violence when is enough going to be enough. "We have got to make a value judgement for ourselves and for our community as to what we're going to do about guns" Lisa Crawford with mothers of murdered offspring says she understands gun rights "I know everybody as the right to have one, I know all of that.. But it's also a responsibility" Crawford says she was heartbroken after hearing of 5 year old Amani Barringer dying after being shot in the neck on Wednesday and it's so many others! Where it was a gun.. A gun.. A gun.. A gun.. A gun.. It's almost always a gun"

9/13 Anti Crime Event -THAT WASN'T THE ONLY ANTI-VIOLENCE EVENT TODAY, ANOTHER TOOK PLACE ON CATHERINE SIMMONS AVENUE IN CHARLOTTE TONIGHT. IT'S WAS HOSTED BY THE "UNITED COUNCIL FOR CHANGE." THE COMMUNITY WANTS A SAFER PLACE TO LIVE-- THE QUEEN CITY HAS SEEN MORE HOMICIDES THIS YEAR COMPARED TO THIS TIME LAST YEAR. LAST YEAR HAD THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF HOMICIDES SINCE 1993. WCNC CHARLOTTE'S LEXI WILSON JOINS US WITH THE GROUPS MESSAGE.

9/15 Ferrell Memorial - community members coming together to remember a man shot and killed by a c-m-p-d officer. Yesterday marked seven years since jonathan ferrell was killed. The group gathered in marshall park - lighting candles and writing messages with sidewalk chalk.

9/16 CMPD Presser - CMPD holding a briefing this morning - giving an update to its "eight can't wait" initiative aimed at police reform. The department adopting eight new policies including things like: banning chokeholds, de-escalation tactics, duty to intervene and banning shooting at moving vehicles...among several others.

Chief johnny jennings saying CMPD is one of only 10 departments in the top populted cities to meet all eight standards.

9/17 Rock Hill Christmas Parade - the rock hill christmas parade is going virtual this year. It will now feature video submissions from the community spreading holiday cheer. Anyone can submit a video to be selected for the parade. It will stream on facebook on friday, december 4th.

9/18 Wildfires - This is where I live and I have family here so that's been the hardest part // My community is on fire. And we're here to protect our community but we can only do so much. FIREFIGHTERS SAY WIND CONDITIONS HAVE BEEN FAVORABLE... BUT THAT MEANS THE SMOKE HAS JUST BEEN SITTING OVER THE L-A BASIN, FILLING THE AIR... AND IT WONT BE LEAVING ANY TIME SOON.

9/19 Rochester Shooting - I mean this is truly a tragedy of epic proportions if you ask me. I mean 16 victims is unheard of. And, for our community who is right now going through so much, for them to deal with this tragedy needlessly people who decide to act in a violent manner is unfortunate and shameful and we are going to do everything as a department we can to bring those people involved to justice."

9/20 Ronnie Long - WE START OFF WITH THE CONCORD COMMUNITY WELCOMING HOME RONNIE LONG. Long had been in prison for 44 YEARS.. After being WRONGLY CONVICTED OF RAPE IN 1976 WHEN HE WAS 20 YEARS OLD. He was freed from prison last month.. AND TODAY...COMMUNITY MEMBERS CELEBRATED HIS RELEASE.

9/21 Justin Carr Shooting - today marks four years since 'justin carr' was shot and killed while protesting in uptown. And tonight -- the community will come together for a vigil to honor his life -- and show solidarity against violence. Wake up charlotte's billie jean shaw joining us live. Billie jean -- justin's family plans to be there?

9/22 Jail Support Arrests - 25 people have been arrested outside the mecklenburg county jail. Jail support volunteers say they were camped out to offer crucial services for released inmates. The sheriff says they were trespassing and causing problems. He is now calling on the group and community leaders to reach a solution.

9/23 Virtual Learning - THE BABBITT FAMILY DROVE OUT OF CHARLOTTE 3 WEEKS AGO - AND AS THEY HEAD WEST, THEY'VE MADE THE COUNTRY THEIR CLASSROOM. BUT THE MOST IMPORTANT LESSON HAS BEEN CONNECTING WITH OTHER FAMILIES ALONG THE WAY. (have a video/animation thing annie helped me with of where they been, will have it in my tv screen behind me) (nat "we're heading into yellowstone national park. We went to mt rushmore crazy horse and devils tower") LIFE ON THE ROAD HAS BEEN AN ENTIRELY NEW EDUCATION FOR THE BABBITT FAMILY ADRIENNE BABBITT/Huntersville "It's been hard at times. We didn't have a lot of cell reception in yellowstone and grand teton so that made our road schooling challenging"

9/24 Reasons to smile - STILL TO COME...WE COULD ALL USE SOME REASONS TO SMILE... A CHARLOTTE RESTAURANT STRUGGLING DURING THE PANDEMIC...IS NOW IN THE NATIONAL SPOTLIGHT THANKS TO community support! THAT'S NEXT.

9/25 Hickory FD - SOME FAMILIES AND BUSINESS COULD BE SEEING CHEAPER home INSURANCE - THANKS TO THEIR FIREFIGHTERS. HICKORY'S FIRE DEPARTMENT RECEIVED AN ELITE RATING - WHEN IT COMES TO THEIR EFFICENCY IN PROTECTING THE COMMUNITY. LESS THAN ONE PERCENT OF THE STATE'S FIRE DEPARTMENTS HAVE EARNED THIS RANKING. The city encouraging homeowners to check with their insurance agents about possible savings.

9/26 Panthers Fans at Games - I believe with the plans they have in place - we've been working with them for several months on these plans - that if they are enforced properly that there will be a safe opportunity for our community to enjoy the game. County leaders also made it a point to say -- tailgating will not be allowed on Panthers property.

9/27 Get out the vote block party - community groups joined together in charlotte for a "get out the vote" block party. It was held outside the Mecklenburg county jail.. The group's goal, to register people to vote and raise awareness about people disenfranchised or disconnected from the election process.

9/28 College Enrollment Down - enrollment for undergraduate students at colleges across the country is down. The national student clearinghouse research center reports enrollment declined two-and-a-half percent across hundreds of colleges. Community colleges are showing the steepest decline at eight percent. However -- graduate programs are seeing an increase in enrollment: up nearly four percent.

9/29 CMPD No Knock - when we looked at it and realized what does this do what are we trying to accomplish HERE and also what does this do as far as community trust" officials say they signed off on the policy as of *yesterday* -- meaning this change is now in effect.

9/30 CMPD Presser - today cmpd talked about something other than coronavirus that's killing community members. Fatal traffic crashes are up 44 percent from this time last year. 62 people have died in 2020...that's compared to 46 people at this same time in 2019. The department says they're working to minimize these incidents - but are asking the community to do their part.

7/1 Crime in Clt - "I grew up on beatties ford road.. And to see it now be in the news for such tragedy... it really hurts me" Lisa Crawford with Mothers of Murdered offspring says her organization advocates for nonviolence. Running And the recent shootings on beatties ford rd that claimed 5 lives in the last 2 weeks.. Have been hard to stomach "we've gone wrong somewhere... we've gone wrong." Crawford says the community has to start looking at violence as the tip of the iceburg "violence is a symptom of bigger, greater problems. Access to housing, access to education, to be able to start businesses, I think all of these things go into peoples hopelessness and their despair. "I think that we as a community as a whole.. Have not fulfilled our obligation to our community" It's why Michael Smith is starting a new organization called Sam.. In honor of his son "sam was 23 year old.. He was on the way to pick his 18 month old son up.. And we don't know what happened other than someone shot and killed him"

Smith says SAM would have a major focus on the youth "because it's the young people. We've got to find out what's going on with these young people that's causing them to

pursue the roads that they're pursuing." Because this is happening in our community...Both smith and Crawford say it needs to be addressed as a community "we need to do more. I mean we ALL need to do more."

7/2 Jennings sworn in - The queen city officially has a new police chief. Chief Johnny Jennings was sworn in yesterday. Jennings says the department will now focus on four areas- "professional accountability, community collaboration, crime management and employee wellness."

7/3 CLT Missing Person - CMPD WANTS YOU TO KEEP AN EYE OUT FOR A MISSING MAN. 38-YEAR-OLD "DEV-RAY NELSON" LEFT HIS HOUSE ON A BIKE YESTERDAY AROUND 2 P-M AND HASN'T BEEN SEEN SINCE. A FAMILY MEMBER CALLED POLICE. "DEV-RAY" IS KNOWN TO RIDE HIS BIKE IN THE AREA OF PHILLIPS PLACE, NEAR SOUTH PARK MALL. HE MAY BE TRYING TO MAKE HIS WAY TO STATESVILLE. 7/6 Trump Bubba Wallace Twee t - president trump responding to nascar driver bubba wallace and the alleged noose that was found at a race garage at talledega speedway. The president tweeted this statement... Quote... "Has bubbawallace apologized to all of those great NASCAR drivers & officials who came to his aid, stood by his side, & were willing to sacrifice everything for him, only to find out that the whole thing was just another HOAX?" end quote.. Its important to note wallace did not report the noose... A member of his team did.. The FBI has said the rope had been there as early as october of last year -- and that wallace was not a target of a hate crime.

7/7 Lawyers Rd Homicide - A CRIME ALERT IN EAST CHARLOTTE. POLICE ARE INVESTIGATING AFTER A DEADLY SHOOTING BROKE OUT YESTERDAY. IT HAPPENED ON LAWYERS ROAD... NEAR ALBEMARLE ROAD AROUND 11:30 IN THE MORNING. WE'RE TOLD ONE PERSON WAS SHOT AND KILLED. RIGHT NOW THERE AREN'T MANY DETAILS ON WHAT LED UP TO THE SHOOTING... OR ABOUT A SUSPECT.

7/13 3 Weekend Homicides - C-M-P-D investigating after three deadly shootings in just 24 hours. Saturday night- a man was shot and killed at a gas station on East W-T Harris Boulevard. Then Sunday afternoon- another victim was shot and killed near Sugar Creek Community Park. And just three hours later in the University area - a man was shot and killed in his car at Robinsdale Apartments. C-M-P-D does *not think these shootings are connected- but ask you to contact them with any information.

7/8 CMPD Meeting - homicides are up and aggravated assault is up 18:09 We have more shootings and more people shot this year than last year.. And CMPD says we can't desensitize ourselves to this, these are people who are dying in our community...

And deputy chief vorhees says it's young people who are mostly committing these crimes, that 16-24 age range.. And a lot of the time it's a matter of resorting to violence for minor conflicts.

7/9 CMPD Crime Stats - C-M-P-D says Charlotte is seeing a rise in violent crime this year- mainly committed by young people. So far there have been 54 homicides in 20-20. C-M-P-D says overall crime is down 9 percent-with crimes like theft and sexual assault on the decline.

7/12 Bank Robbery - CMPD WANTS TO KNOW IF YOU RECOGNIZE A SUSPECT IN AN ATTEMPTED BANK ROBBERY. POLICE SAY THIS MAN ENTERED THE FIFTH THIRD BANK ON SHARON AMITY ROAD BEFORE 5 P-M YESTERDAY. HE DEMANDED MONEY FROM THE TELLER AND SAID HE HAD A GUN. THE TELLER REFUESED TO GIVE THE SUSPECT ANY MONEY AND THE SUSPECT LEFT.

7/13 Look Ahead - now for a look at what's coming up later today on WCNC charlotte. As we've shown you today--- charlotte seeing a violent weekend. There have been five homicides since Thursday. We're talking with CMPD about what can be done to stop the violent crime. Plus--- leaders in Gaston county are meeting right now to discuss a confederate monument in the county. We'll bring you what they talked about-- coming up at four and tax day got moved to this month-- but time is now running out. You have two days to get your taxes done. We'll have a live interview with a tax prepcoming up at 4:30.

7/14 CLT Crime - TONIGHT IN CHARLOTTE .. POLICE ARE ADDRESSING A VIOLENT AND DEADLY WEEKEND. THREE DAYS IN A ROW OF DEADLY SHOOTINGS -- CLAIMING THE LIVES OF FOUR PEOPLE INCLUDING TWO TEENAGERS. 7/15 Popcorn Arrest - WHERE POLICE ARRESTED TWO SUSPECTS - FOR ALLEGEDLY BREAKING IN TO A POPULAR BELMONT BUSINESS. WE FIRST SHOWED YOU THIS VIDEO MONDAY NIGHT - FROM "TASTE BUDS POPCORN".
POLICE SAY THE TWO SMASHED THE FRONT DOOR AND STOLE HUNDREDS OF DOLLARS. JUSTIN SCHIENE - AND KELSIE EUBANKS ARE IN CUSTODY THIS MORNING. BOTH ARE FACING MULTIPLE CHARGES.

7/17 Breaking overnight Homicide - cmpd is investigating the *sixth* deadly shooting in charlotte in just one week. This happening on 'bramblewood drive' in southwest charlotte. Police say a man was found shot multiple times -- and he died at the hospital. No arrests have been made. Anyone with information should call crime stoppers.

7/19 Violence Trend in CLT - right now on wake up charlotte weekend - local leaders speaking out about the recent uptick in violent crime. Some now asking *could the pandemic be to blame.

7/21 Alexander Home Invasion - Alexander County authorities are searching for a suspect- who attacked a 69-year-old woman inside her home. The woman says she was asleep in her bed- when a man she didn't know began beating her and sexually assaulted her. She was taken to the hospital. Call Alexander County Crime Stoppers with any information.

7/22 West Bld homicide - new information on two homicides in charlotte -- happening just hours apart... The first happened on west boulevard yesterday afternoon. Police say tykari brown was shot and killed... Another person was shot as well and rushed to the hospital. Police are still searching for the suspects.

7/23 Portland Protests - President Trump says he will send federal officers to cities seeing a spike in violent crime. Agents are already on the ground in Portland and Kansas City. They will head to Chicago next after 15 were hurt in a drive-by shooting this week. Some local leaders are pushing back- saying the troops could actually escalate tension.

7/24 Mint Hill Homicide - A crime alert tonight in mint hill -- where police are investigating a homicide. Officers found *Michael James Deseve* dead outside of a house after being shot, just before eight this morning. Moments later -- they found *John Michael Odea* sitting in the backyard of the house -- with the *apparent* weapon nearby. Police have arrested *Odea and charged him with murder.

7/25 South end Crime Alert - right now on w-c-n-c charlotte - a south end crime alert. What you need to know to keep you and your belongings safe... After thieves smash windows and make a quick getaway - one person even losing their social security card.

7/26 Homicide W 28th St - BREAKING OVERNIGHT - still no arrests, AND FEW DETAILS RELEASED in a late night shooting on "west 28th street" near the intersection of "north poplar street." c-m-p-d tells us when officers arrived on scene just before eleven they found a woman shot. She died at the scene. Keep it here as we work to learn more from police. If you have any information that may help investigators-- you're asked to call crime stoppers.

7/27 2 Statesville Homicides - two -- Statesville police releasing details on a homicide. It happened early Sunday morning. Officers responded to an s-u-v that crashed into a telephone pole and a tree on 'elam avenue'. They say there were bullet holes in the car and the driver was dead. The victim was identified as 39 year old 'courtney bradshaw'. Anyone with information on this should call crime stoppers.

7/28 Portland Protests - The fear and intimidation tactics put to use by the federal agents here a couple weeks back. I couldn't take it anymore. It was a breaking point for me." authorities say they've arrested and charged at least 22 people with federal crimes.

7/29 Barr Testimony - attorney general william barr testified before the house judiciary committee -- for the first time in his tenure with the trump administration. Democratic lawmakers questioned him on several issues -- including recent clashes between police and protesters. "When communities turn on and pillory the police, officers naturally become more risk-averse and crime rates soar. Unfortunately we are seeing that now in many of our cities. He says president trump has not interfered in any of his decisions -- including sending federal agents to portland.

7/30 Nevin Road Homicide - A CRIME ALERT TONIGHT. CMPD CONTINUES TO INVESTIGATE A HOMICIDE IN NORTH CHARLOTTE. IT HAPPENED THIS AFTERNOON ON NEVIN ROAD. WE'RE TOLD A young MAN DIED AT THE SCENE. 7/31 Shelby Arson - the search for an arsonist is underway in shelby. Fire crews say they think several fires have been set intentionally- including this one set at the home of shelby's fire and rescue chief. There's no word yet on a suspect.if you have any information - call shelby police - or crime stoppers on cleveland county.

8/1 Concord Car Jacking - A CRIME ALERT TONIGHT UP IN CONCORD. TAKE A LOOK AT YOUR SCREEN. POLICE ARE HOPING YOU CAN HELP FIND THE PERSON WHO CARJACKED A WOMAN AT A GAS STATION. IT HAPPENED AT THE CIRCLE-K ON CONCORD MILLS BOULEVARD. Police say a man pulled a gun on a woman and forced her to get out of her car. She tried to standing in the way -- but you can see that didnt stop the thief from taking off in her car. WE'RE TOLD THAT WOMAN IS EXPECTED TO BE OKAY.

THE VICTIM IS "SOLOMON FLEMING JUNIOR" AND POLICE BELIEVE HE AND THE SUSPECT KNEW EACH OTHER. BUT NO ARRESTS HAVE BEEN MADE...
THEY NOW HAVE A PLEA TO *YOU* AT HOME.

8/3 Stop the Violence Event - the Mecklenburg county sheriff is working to bring awareness to rising crime levels in the city. Sheriff 'Garry mcfadden' organized a 'stop the

violence' demonstration yesterday. 19 hearses rode through the streets of charlotte where homicides have happened. There have been 71 homicides this year. That's your morning rush -- more news in less time.

8/4 Uptown Sex Assault - Now to a crime alert in uptown - where police are asking for your help to find a suspect in a sexual assault. It happened Sunday in uptown - in the middle of the afternoon. C-M-P-D says a woman was approached by a man in frazier park. When she wouldn't talk to him for more than a brief minute - police say that's when the man attacked her.

8/5 Lancaster Murder Suspect - Lancaster police searching for a murder suspect who is considered armed and dangerous. Officers say this man was out on bond for armed robbery charges when he shot and killed someone. Call the Lancaster Police with any information.

8/6 CLT Homicide - IT'S GONE PAST THE SHOCK AND THE AMAZEMENT IT'S GOT TO BE WE'RE NOT GOING TO TOLERATE THIS ANYMORE WE DON'T THINK THIS IS OKAY AS AM OUTCOME FOR ANY HUMAN BEING WHO LIVES IN OR COMES TO THE CITY OF CHARLOTTE 16:18:09;17 THE SHOOTER IS STILL ON THE RUN TONIGHT.IF YOU HAVE ANY INFORMATION ...CALL POLICE OR CRIMESTOPPERS.

8/7 Ronnie Long Protest NEW VIDEO TONIGHT... THE COMMUNITY CALLING FOR THE RELEASE OF RONNIE LONG. He's been in prison for 44 years -- for a crime he says he didn't commit. Long is serving time in *Albemarle Correctional Institute.* An all-white jury convicted Long of rape in 1976 in a case where police hid evidence and lied on the stand. In April, a federal appeals court heard HIS case and could overturn his conviction any day now. Today demonstrators gathered at the 'M-L-K Memorial' -- in concord to PUSH FOR long's FREEDOM. Along with this protest... More than a dozen state lawmakers HAVE JOINED THE FIGHT FOR his conviction to be overturned.

8/8 Rock Hill Stolen Peaches - A local peach farm -- hit by thieves! Black's peach farm in york county says someone poached 15-hundred dollars' worth of peaches right off their trees last night. The crime has left those on the farm hungry to find out who could do such a thing.

8/10 Shots Fired into Home - we're working to find out how a five year old child doing after they were hit by a stray bullet. Rock hill police are looking for the person who fired into a home on king drive early Sunday morning. That child was inside the home asleep and was shot in the leg. Anyone with information is asked to call police.

8/11 Shooting Follow - So far this year in Charlotte the city has seen more than 70 homicides. Neighbors in the Camp Greene area worry the string of recent drive by shootings they've seen will eventually add to that homicide rate if nothing is done about it." IN THE MIDDLE OF THE NIGHT... It's centered around ronnie long-- the concord man who spent 44 years behind bars for a crime he says he didn't commit. This morning we're learning the next steps in his legal journey. His attorney telling us, he expects the cabarrus county district attorney's office will dismiss his pending charges. His attorney says he also plans to request a pardon of innocence with the governor. Our cameras rolling thursday as long walked out of prison and into the arms of his family.

9/11 2 Fatal Hit and Run - c-m-p-d asking for help finding the driver of *this car. They say the person is wanted for a deadly hit and run. Officers are looking for a red ford sedan with black wheels. It was last seen sunday on brookshire freeway. If you have any information - call crime stoppers.

9/12 5 year old follow - Its called the stop killing our children march.. And this is where it will start.. This is the food lion on Wendover road.. And the community members i've spoke with say the community needs to ask themselves.. When it comes to gun violence when is enough going to be enough. On the same day that dozens of homeless people were forced from this property on West 12th and North Poplar Charlotte's Mayor - speaking out in an open letter -- saying in part, "cities across America continue to struggle with homelessness. His benefits ran out -- and after two months of waiting for an extension -- he had to use his *credit cards to pay* the rent.

9/17 Vaccine Rollout Plan - n update now on a covid-19 vaccine -- as of right now, the federal government says it plans to make vaccines free for all americans. The plan calls for a vaccination campaign to begin gradually in january -- or once one is approved. 9/22 COVID Lockdown - more restrictions in the u-k. Pubs, bars, and restaurants in england will have to close by 10 pm... 9/24 mcconnel SC Nominee - Senate Majority leader Mitch mcconnell put out this release Tuesday - explaining why he didn't push forward President Obama's Supreme Court nomination in 2016 but will push forward President Trump's nomination this year. The main difference: What mcconnell calls a "divided government" IN 2016, Democrats held the White House - and Republicans held the Senate. They were divided. This year - Republicans hold both the Senate and White House. Why does that matter? According to mcconnell's release...Almost every Supreme Court vacancy during an election year HAS been filled when the Senate and White House are the same party. First - let's break these numbers down. We checked with Senate Records and Congressional Research Service Reports.

9/25 Lie in state vs lie in honor - Late Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg is *actually* not the first woman to lie in the capitol building – after her death. But she's still making history. And take a look at this video! You can see him dancing in a tik-tok video his family posted! Mckinney was born june 25th 19-18.. His family and church threw him a birthday "drive-by" celebration. 7/3 CMS Sports - schoool sports, on the minds of many people. Many wondering if their kids will have a season at all come fall. C-m-s now announcing it will *not* restart athletic programs on campuses next week. The district released a statement saying it's consulted with local public health officials. The district says -- more time is needed to make sure it can protect the health and safety of student athletes and staff. Union and gaston county schools tell us they are still scheduled to begin athletic activities on monday.

7/4 Pudgy Pets from Quarantine - this morning - people and their pudgy pets. If you packed on pounds, vets say your pet likely did too. 5 KIDS AND ONE STAFF MEMBER THERE TESTED POSITIVE.

7/10 CDC Back to school guidelines - the c-d-c says it will *not* release new back-to-school guidelines. The trump administration has complained that the original guidelines are too strict. Health officials said they would release looser guidelines -- but are now going back on that -- saying the current ones still hold. Those include wearing face masks and staggering schedules for students.

7/11 Disney World Reopens - THE MOST MAGICAL PLACE ON EARTH" IS BACK OPEN TODAY. BUT WALT DISNEY WORLD IN ORLANDO, FLORIDA will look DIFFERENT TO VISITORS. THERE WILL BE NO FIREWORKS SHOWS OR PARADES, AND VISITORS WILL BE GETTING TEMPERATURE CHECKS WHEN THEY ENTER. EVERYONE HAS TO WEAR A MASK AND MAINTAIN SOCIAL DISTANCE. RESERVATIONS ARE REQUIRED. THE PARKS ARE REOPENING EVEN AS FLORIDA IS SEEING A SURGE IN CONFIRMED CASES OF COVID-19...

AND DISNEY WORLD IS IN A LABOR DISPUTE WITH ACTORS over health concerns.

7/12 Blue Space - turns out the cure for the blues.. May actually be the color blue. A new study shows when we spend time in "blue spaces" it lowers our blood pressure and boosts our mood. The best example of this? Taking a walk on a beach or near water. Researchers say that soothing effect could have long-term benefits for our heart health.

7/13 CLT Daycare Closes - a charlotte day care is temporarily closing -- after reporting a covid-19 cluster. Six children at 'providence road kindercare' tested positive for the virus. The day care says it is closing for 14 days to retrain its staff on health and safety protocols.

7/14 SC First Child death - sadly, the first child died in south carolina this weekend because of covid-19. That child lived in chester county and was under five years old. Health officials say this is a tragic reminder that no one is immune to this virus, and we must protect not only ourselves, but others as well.

7/15 SNS Asymptomatic - New numbers show *exactly why doctors want you to wear a mask even if you feel healthy. The C-D-C says about 40 percent of people with COVID-19 are showing no symptoms at all. That estimate is *up about 10 percent from May. The C-D-c says the majority of asymptomatic patients can still pass covid-19 on to another person- who could develop a more serious case of the virus.

7/16 Gaston Co Nursing Home Outbreaks - in Gaston county, leaders there are reporting an alarming spike in covid-19 cases. They say, from mid-may to last week...

The percent of positive tests in the county has more than doubled. Several clusters are also being reported at congregate care facilities. That includes "carolina care" in cherryville, where 2 residents and 4 staff members tested positive. Health leaders say -- community spread is playing a major role in those clusters.

7/17 COVID Numbers - i think we all have questions about - WHEN THAT DATA IS NOW GOING TO THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT - WHAT VISIBILITY WILL COME BACK. 14:39:17 //BUTT TO WHITE FLASH// 14:39:24 We will continue to be transparent at the state level, but I think it always helps for us to be able to compare to what's going on in other states and understand where we fit into the national landscape

7/18 Walmart Goes Cashless - heads up - if you're headed to Walmart this weekend. You'll need to grab your debit or credit card.. The retail giant - joining a growing list of stores moving toward cards-only because of the pandemic. The stores reportedly *will still accept cash payments. They just can't promise you'll get exact change back, because of the current coin shortage.

7/19 SNS Queens U Novant Partnership - novant health is trying to help queen's university students stay safe from the coronavirus. The two have teamed up for an online symptom tracker that students and staff will have to use every day before heading out on campus or even leaving their dorm room. Novant will also help queens university with advice on everything from testing for the virus - to what happens if there's an outbreak on campus.

7/20 TX Infants test positive - scary numbers out of one texas county. 'Nueces county' health officials say *85 infants* have tested positive for covid-19 since march. A 6-month-old baby died last month because of the virus. 38-percent of tests in the county are coming back positive.

7/21 Panthers Training Camp - today rookies report for the first day of panthers training camp. Injured players and quarterbacks will report on thursday -- and the rest of the team

will arrive in a week. It comes as the n-f-l is still working with the player's association- to reach solutions on players' health and safety.

7/22 Charlotte Diocese schools reopening - the charlotte catholic diocese announced its schools will reopen campuses in august. But they *will* offer a remote learning option. They say the schools will follow the guidance of the c-d-c and the state health guidelines to keep staff and students safe.

7/23 MIT New Masks - Our best protection against covid-19- just got even better. Scientists at M-I-T developed a mask from the same stuff as the N-95 masks used by health care workers. But this one- needs *less material and is reusable. They are still in testing now- but this mask could be a game charger for hospitals running low on P-P-E.

7/24 RNC Cancelled - More than 300 delegates will be headed to Charlotte Aug 21- 24th In a newly obtained email from Charlotte's city attorney – the events will consist of small break-out sessions during the day, with evening receptions. Then Monday the delegates will convene to formally select Donald Trump as the republican presidential nominee. But where his celebratory party will be held – no one yet knows. In June President Trump moved that portion of the RNC to Jacksonville after North Carolina lawmakers requested it be scaled-down due to covid19.

7/25 RNC Latest - I am an absolute no when it comes to expanding convention.> We can come back to this blank slate and say alright how can we maximize the safety and health of situation going on right now of a president thats now leaning into that" no matter where the events are happening, r-n-c officials say all attendees will be required to follow local health restrictions.

7/26 Cali Religious Peeps told to go home - in huntington beach, california - Hundreds of people who gathered for a religious service on a local beach Friday were told "go home." the crowd was seen gathering friday evening - even though city officials told organizers to postpone the event because they did not get the proper permits. They were also *not following coronavirus health mandates. The group's website encouraged people to wear a mask and social distance... But aerial video shows few people did. One of the organizers reportedly telling the crowd as police moved in-- "you can't cancel jesus"

7/27 Social Checkback - More than 150 health care workers calling fod the U-S to shut down again in an open letter. So we've been asking if you agree.

7/28 Fitness Tracker - health experts say the most important thing to monitor for covid is your heart rate. Most smart watches can detect when your rate fluctuates -- and that can signal a variety of health issues -- including infection. Doctors say a smart watches' most important role in this pandemic -- is to get you moving.

7/29 NC Alcohol Sales - A MAJOR ANNOUNCEMENT FROM GOVERNOR COOPER WHO SAYS RESTAURANTS AND BREWERIES WILL HAVE TO STOP SELLING ALCOHOL AFTER ELEVEN. THIS COMES AS HEALTH OFFICIALS CONTINUE TO BE CONCERNED THAT YOUNG PEOPLE ARE GETTING THE VIRUS. THEY'RE HOPING THIS WILL DISCOURAGE LATE NIGHT GET TOGETHERS WHERE SOCIAL DISTANCING ISN'T HAPPENEING. THE ORDER DOESN'T APPLY TO GROCERY OR CONVENIENCE STORES. A SIMILAR ORDER IS ALREADY IN EFFECT IN MECKLENBURG COUNTY. THE STATEWIDE ORDER STARTS LATER THIS WEEK.

7/30 Caro Seniors Health - VISITING YOUR LOVED ONES SAFELY. HEALTH EXPERTS WEIGH IN ON HOW YOU CAN DECIDE IF ITS SAFE TO GO SEE YOUR AGING LOVED ONES.

7/31 Gibbie Harris RNC - Local leaders are still working on the plans for next month's R-N-C. Mecklenburg County's health director says the safety resrictions they plan to enforce- are still a work in progress. "There will be some very specific protocols in place, there will be limitations on numbers that are coming, they'll be expectations around testing for them and screening for them" The R-N-C is set to begin August 24th.

8/1 Alcohol Restrictions -<Gibbie Harris/Meck Co Health Director "we really want to do what we can to encourage compliance rather than issuing citations and closing places now. So the first step will likely be education"

8/2 Meck Co Covid Update - what we're terming covid fatigue.. People are tired of hearing abou it.. People want to get back to normal.. And I think that could potentially be impacting whether people are coming in to get tested or not" She went on to say.. There's really no foreseeable end in immediate sight here, that we will be wearing masks and social distancing for awhile.. And continuing to stay the course is the quickest way to get through this.

8/3 Knights help promising pages - Finally here at 4:30-- The charlotte knights raised over 100-thousand dollars to help Healthcare Workers... Local Charities... And its own employees in need due to COVID19. And today--- The team kicked off their week of giving at promising pages-- an organization that gets books into local kids' hands. WCNC Charlotte's Ruby Durham was there as the team helped out.

8/4 Gaston Co College - IN GASTON COUNTY - WE'RE GETTING A SNEAK PEEK INSIDE A SCHOOL AS IT OPENS UP FOR THE FALL SEMESTER. ALL THE DESKS IN CLASSROOMS AND COMPUTER LABS ARE SPACED OUT SIX-FEET APART. EVERYONE HAS TO WEAR A MASK ...AND SOME BUILDINGS WILL HAVE TEMPERATURE CHECKS. THERE WILL ALSO BE WAYS FOR STUDENTS TO ATTEND CLASSES ONLINE WHILE THEY STAY HOME IF THEY HAVE COVID-19 SYMPTOMS GASTON COLLEGE PRESIDENT DOCTOR JOHN HAUSER (WHO-SER) SAYS

BEFORE A STUDENT WALKS ONTO CAMPUS...THEY'LL BE ASKED TO ANONYMOUSLY ANSWER HEALTH QUESTIONS THROUGH A SMART PHONE APP.

8/5 Atrium Mask Giveaway - TODAY ATRIUM HEALTH gave away free face masks near charlotte mtotor speedway in concord. Volunteers also passed out pamphlets with information about coronavirus. Organizers say educating people about masks is a big reason why they're doing this.

8/6 CLT Film Festival online - but before we head to break - the annual joe-dance film festival - kicks off tonight. The now all - online event - highlights content from creators in the carolinas - georgia - and tennessee. It raises money for pediatric cancer research at Atrium Health's Levine Children's hospital. Tickets and passes to the online event are still for sale.

8/7 UNCC New Norm Mascot - UNC Charlotte is getting ready to welcome students and faculty back to campus. This guy here, part of that new normal. The school mascot front and center there, wearing a mask and promoting safe social distancing, and other tips to keep niner nation safe. The campaign dubbed, "The New Norm: Your Health. Our Community."

8/8 Covid Predictions - THIS FIRST ONE - the last thing anyone wants to hear. The possibility of a second stay-at-home order in the carolinas. One research group says-- it could be necessary, if the current projections play out. Health leaders in north carolina say they're hopeful it won't come to that, but that means everyone doing their part. Wearing a mask, washing hands, and standing at least 6 feet apart when waiting in lines.

8/9 Cali Covid Self-Test - in california, health officials say they're bringing back a COVID-19 self-testing kiosk... AFTER a successful pilot program tested more than 500 people. The kiosk walks people through the steps, even shows them how to take a swab and wipe the inside of their mouth for 20 seconds. The idea is that the test is self administered-- cutting down the risk of exposing others. "curative".. The company that makes the test, says they are doing 60 to 70 thousand tests a day right now. Test results are emailed out in 24 to 48 hours.

8/10 By the numbers - Every day we take a look at this outbreak by the numbers. After a couple of bad days- the number of new cases in North Carolina seems to be on the decline again. Yesterday about 15-hundred people tested positive across the state. That's much lower than the nearly 2-thousand cases we saw on Thursday and Saturday. And here's some good news. The percentage of tests coming back positive-Was down to *6 percent yesterday. That's the lowest percentage we've seen since *May- when there were much fewer tests available. Still- Health officials need to see that line keep trending downward before easing any restrictions. In South Carolina-The numbers are also looking better. The state saw just 1 thousand new cases yesterday- their lowest number since early July. And look at the percentage of tests that

came back positive. Just 13 percent- compared to the 20 percent we've seen for much of the summer. You can see by that graph though- the percentage of positive tests in South Carolina varies greatly from day to day. We'll keep an eye on it to see if the decline lasts.

8/11 Karen Pence to CLT - the second lady will visit charlotte today. Karen pence is traveling to the queen city to participate in a veteran suicide prevention roundtable discussion. Congressman dan bishop will also be there. She will then visit 'hopeway mental health treatment center' in south charlotte to discuss mental health resources in our area. And that's your morning rush.

8/12 Meck Co latest now to the latest on the coronavirus - mecklenburg county health officials giving an update in the last hour... And it looks like we are trending in the right direction - at last check there were 22,657 cases in the county... Up 170 from yesterday... And the positive test rate has dropped to around 7 percent. Still, health director *gibbie harris* says, that will need to drop much lower in order for us to fully reopen.

8/13 Novant Nurse Vigil - TONIGHT, FAMILY AND FRIENDS ARE REMEMBERING A LOCAL NURSE WHO FOUGHT ON THE FRONT LINES OF THE PANDEMIC. SANDRA SARANTIS OF HUNTERSVILLE PASSED AWAY FROM THE CORONAVIRUS. SHE WORKED AT NOVANT HEALTH IN THE MIDST OF THIS COVID CRISIS. EARLIER THIS EVENING... A PRIVATE VIGIL WAS HELD VIRTUALLY IN HER HONOR. HER FAMILY CALLS HER A TRULY REMARKABLE NURSE... AND says SHE HAD A WAY OF MAKING EVERYONE SHE MET FEEL SPECIAL AND LOVED.

8/14 CDC Warning - the c-d-c issuing a major warning -- as coronavirus cases continue to rise. The c-d-c director says the united states could be in for quote -- "the worst fall from a public health perspective" we've ever seen -- if we don't follow covid-19 safety measures. Doctors say americans need to do four things -- wear a mask, practice social distancing, wash your hands, and stay away from crowds.

8/16 Mouthwash and Covid - Before you leave the house this morning-- use your mouthwash. You'll be doing everyone a favor. A new study found not only does mouthwash give you fresh breath- it could also keep you from spreading covid-19. Researchers say mouthwash was able to "inactivate" the virus in infected people's mouths- and made them less likely to spray their germs on people near them. To be clear- this is *not a treatment for covid-19 and will *not protect you from getting it. But if you happen to be infected- it *could make you less likely to pass it on to someone else.

8/18 Presidential Poll - the president is behind in the latest n-b-c and wall street journal poll. The survey shows biden leading trump among registered voters by 9 points. And biden holds double-digit advantages on the coronavirus, immigration, health care, race relations, and uniting the country.

8/19 App State Cluster - BREAKING TONIGHT - A NEW CLUSTER OF COVID CASES AT A LOCAL UNIVERSITY - THIS TIME STEMMING FROM APP STATE FOOTBALL PLAYERS. THE SCHOOL SAYS THERE ARE 11 TOTAL CASES.. SEVEN STUDENTS AND FOUR STAFF MEMBERS. APP STATE HAS SUSPENDED FOOTBALL PRACTICE UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE. HEALTH OFFICALS HAVE BEEN IN CONTACT WITH THE AFFECTED PEOPLE, WHO HAVE BEEN TOLD TO RECOVER IN ISOLATION.

8/20 Union Co School outbreak - KIDS WILL START VIRTUAL LEARNING TODAY - AFTER ONLY 3 DAYS OF IN PERSON INSTRUCTION. MEANWHILE, THE UNION COUNTY HEALTH DEPARTMENT WILL START CONTACT TRACING, FINDING OUT EXACTLY WHAT OTHER STAFF MEMBERS OR STUDENTS WERE IN CONTACT WITH THE TWO PEOPLE WHO TESTED POSITIVE.

8/21 Homemade mask upgrade - and - the simple item you can sew into your homemade mask, that health experts say can cut your risk of catching covid-19 by more than 80 percent!

8/22 RNC Friday - Next week all eyes on the Queen City as it serves center stage for the RNC. Before the Coronavirus many businesses in Uptown where hoping the convention could bring a spotlight to them as well, but with lesser crowds some are now forced to adjust." Brandon Salter// Dudelicious Food "It's definitely different these days." DUDELICIOUS FOOD TRUCK OWNER says THEY WERE BANKING ON THE RNC TO GIVE THEIR NEW BUSINESS A NECESSARY BOOST. "One order of brussels." "We're trying to get around this area of Charlotte during the RNC to pick up tourists." BUT THE CUT DOWN ON THE RNC CROWDS IS MAKING THAT A LOT MORE DIFFICULT. OVER THE PAST FEW DAYS MORE THAN 300 DELEGATES ARRIVED HERE IN THE QUEEN CITY AND SOME OF THEM RECOGNIZE THE ADJUSTMENTS TOO.

8/23 New Healthy Milk Chocolate - this next story may just be a game changer in households nationwide. Milk Chocolate is officially good for you. Scientists have found a way to give it all the same antioxidants as dark chocolate without sacrificing the flavor. They say the secret- is mixing in ingredients like peanut skins and coffee grounds.
8/24 UNCC Delays in person classes - TURNING TO THE CORONAVIRUS. UNC CHARLOTTE IS DELAYING THE START OF IN PERSON CLASSES. Now classes will still being september 7th but virtually.. And in-person instruction will be delayed until october 1st.

The chancellor spoke in a news conference this afternoon saying it's a decision made based off of their talks with the county health department

8/25 Gibbie Harris RNC Concerns - this morning - mecklenburg county's health director says she's worried about delegates *not* wearing masks or social distancing inside the convention center. Chairs were six feet apart, but few people had on masks.

Delegates were tested for covid-19 before coming to charlotte. Health director gibbie harris says she has reached out the r-n-c and they're "working hard to address these issues". Rachel?

8/26 No COVID Cases - The Mecklenberg County Health Director does *not think the R-N-C exposed the public to covid-19. Gibbie Harris there were *no reports of someone with the virus attending the events in Charlotte. The health department plans to release a full report on the R-N-C in the coming days.

8/27 Wedding Goes Virtual - a local elementary school is switching to remote learning -- after a staff member tested positive for covid-19. Weddington elementary in union county will do all classes online until september 8th. Health officals say they believe more students and staff were exposed. Seven union county schools have seen positive cases in the past week.

8/28 March on Washington - TODAY MARKS 57 YEARS SINCE MARTIN LUTHER KING junior's FAMED MARCH ON WASHINGTON TO advocate for the civil and economic rights of African Americans. TODAY demonstrators from around the country ARE GATHERING AGAIN IN THE CAPITOL. BUT THIS TIME TO PROTEST the deaths of Black men AND WOMEN at the hands of police officers. NBC's ALICE BARR reports from Washington, DC.

8/29 RNC Cases - turning now to coronavirus coverage in the carolinas-- this morning--we know four people linked to the r-n-c in charlotte earlier this week tested positive for covid-19. That's according to mecklenburg county. The county says -- the positive tests came from two attendees and two charlotte-based event staff. The attendees tested negative before arriving in charlotte. We're told they isolated, and close contacts were notified and told to quarantine. It's important to note -- the health department says this is a small portion of the more than 790 tests conducted.

8/30 COVID in the Carolinas - this morning - now add davidson college to the list of local schools to report a covid cluster on campus. A cluster is five or more cases. This news coming as north carolina sets a new one-day case record. Nearly 26 hundred new cases were reported saturday. *but the department of health and human services also stressing saturday's spike was caused in part by delayed test reporting. No word at this time on what caused the delay from lab corp.

8/31 Panthers - the team sent a letter to fans saying they've been working tirelessly since march to develop a plan to keep fans as safe as possible. The panthers say they are prepared to implement a face covering requirement and temperature checks for all fans and staff as well as enhanced cleaning procedures. Also -- the team is working with honeywell to monitor air quality throughout the stadium. Although the panthers are confident they can safely host a *limited* number of fans -- the state health department is denying that request at this time. SAFETY AND FAN FAVORITE TRE

BOSTON JUST TALKED ABOUT WHAT IT WILL BE LIKE WITH NO FANS AT THE FIRST GAME.

9/1 UNCC Niner Health Check - U-N-C Charlotte students and employees will begin tracking their covid-19 symptoms online. They are expected to complete the "Niner Health Check" each morning. U-N-C-C's fall semester will start completely online next week. Students are *still being asked to complete the health check-so the university can make informed.

9/2 Rowan Co Child Care Cluster - A preschool in Rowan County is trying to contain a covid-19 outbreak. 3 children and 4 staff members have tested positive at St. Peter's Lutheran Church Preschool in Salisbury. The North Carolina Health Department is also reporting a second covid-19 death linked to a child care center. They have not said *which location that was- or *who died.

9/3 Drive Thru Safety - MECKLENBURG COUNTY HEALTH LEADERS ARE TRYING TO REACH OUT TO THE HISPANIC COMMUNITY AND HELP THEM LEARN ABOUT COROANVIRUS SAFETY. DATA SHOWS THAT A FOURTH OF THE CORONAVIRUS CASES IN THE COUNTY ARE HISPANIC. TODAY - THE COUNTY IS HOLDING A DRIVE THROUGH SAFETY EXPO FOR HISPANIC CONTRACTORS FROM FIVE TO SEVEN. LOCATION INFORMATION FOR THAT EVENT IS ON OUR WCNC MOBILE APP.

9/4 SC Covid School numbers - Soon we'll have a better idea of how covid-19 is affecting South Carolina schools. State health leaders will give their first report on cases among the students and staff today. The numbers will be updated twice per week. Colleges will *not be included-but many are reporting their own daily case counts online.

9/5 SC Schools - SOUTH CAROLINA HEALTH OFFICIALS just unveiled A new school COVID-19 tracker. Today we are seeing 158 cases between students, teachers AND STAFF statewide. The health department SAYS, THE data does not show where individuals contracted the virus. The reports are also limited to K THRU 12 students and staff who are physically present in school settings, not those attending virtually.

9/6 Atrium Health Hacked - new this morning - atrium health reaching out to patients to let them know about a cyber-crimes attack. Authorities say atrium sysytems were hit by a ransomware attack back in february. But investigators didnt find out about it untl july. They say an unauthorized party had access for about three months. Atrium says it will notify patients who may be affected.

9/7 NC Health Officials - the urgent warning from local health officials and why they say you may want to lay off those barbecues this year.

9/8 Pandemic Fatigue poll - coroanvirus fatigue is getting worse. Doctors say it can be hard to have to rearrange your life around something that almost doesn't seem real.

And another issue is that we can't decide what kind of crisis we're dealing with. A new survey from n-b-c news and survey monkey - found over half of people think this is a health crisis - while the rest think it's financial. But doctors say no matter what kind of crisis it is- we'll get through it better if we follow guidelines and try to keep each other safe.

9/9 Huntersville Leak Meeting - ALL NEW TONIGHT - FAMILIES *STILL* WORRIED ABOUT THAT MASSIVE GAS FUEL UP IN HUNTERSVILLE. WE'VE BEEN TELLING YOU ABOUT IT FOR NEARLY A MONTH NOW. AND IN THE PAST FEW HOURS - the owners of the line that caused the leak announced the steps they're now taking to ensure community health and safety. WCNC CHARLOTTE'S BRIANA HARPER EXPLAINS WHETHER THESE PRECAUTIONS ARE ENOUGH TO KEEP RESIDENTS' WORRIES AT EASE.

9/10 UNC Testing Students - tonight, we know U-N-C CHAPEL HILL IS OFFERING free covid testing to all students living locally. That's regardless of whether they have symptoms. Testing is voluntary. The school wants to more accurately align campus data with state and local health department recommendations. Students should look for an email with more information about testing.

9/11 Holiday Decorations - if quarantine has got you down - it might be time to deck the halls. Experts say breaking out the lights and Christmas tree early will be good for your mental health right now. Christmas decorations have a direct link to happy memories - so seeing them can brighten your mood.

9/12 911 Museum Reopens -TODAY THE 9-ELEVEN MEMORIAL MUSEUM IN NEW YORK CITY REOPENED TO THE PUBLIC FOR THE FIRST TIME SINCE MARCH. YESTERDAY THE MUSEUM REOPENED ONLY TO 9/11 FAMILIES ON THE 19TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ATTACKS. VISITORS WILL STILL HAVE TO FOLLOW ALL CURRENT CORONAVIRUS HEALTH AND SAFETY GUIDELINES.. And TICKETS ARE BEING SOLD IN ADVANCE FOR TIMED VISITS TO HELP ENSURE SOCIAL DISTANCING.

9/13 COVID - then - the latest on the fight to curb covid-19 top health experts warning it could be 20-21 before life returns to normal - the way it was before the pandemic. As the u.s this sunday passes another grim mileston when it comes to the virus.

9/14 By the Numbers -As school leaders make those decisions-they are keeping a close eye on the numbers. So let's break them down. After lower testing around the labor day holiday- cases are back up in North Carolina. About 15 hundred people tested positive for covid-19 friday- then *another 15-hundred people tested positive on Saturday. Numbers were down some yesterday. There were about 12-hundred new cases across the state. That rise in new cases is likely the result of increased testing. Because we are seeing some good signs when it comes to the *percentage of tests coming back positive. For the past three days- just *5 percent of covid-19 tests have come back

positive. That is the number health officials have been aiming at for *months. Hopefully we'll see that trend continue.

9/15 NCDHHS Fall Activity - the pandemic is taking aim at fall fun in north carolina. The department of health and human services says hayrides - train rides - and fair games are a no-go this year. Places like pumpkin patches and haunted trails will have to limit capacity. But some farms say they are ready to handle the changes - and are planning to open this fall. 9/16 Meck Co Texts - The Mecklenburg Country health department says nearly 7-thousand people were *incorrectly told they tested positive for covid-19. Health Director Gibbie Harris says a glitch in the county's contact tracing program sent out those texts and emails Friday. It was followed up by a correction to all of the affected people. Harris says the incident did not affect our numbers in any way.

9/17 Vaccine Rollout Plan - an update now on a covid-19 vaccine -- as of right now, the federal government says it plans to make vaccines free for all americans. The plan calls for a vaccination campaign to begin gradually in january -- or once one is approved. The first focus is on protecting healthcare workers, essential employees, and other vulnerable groups. State and local communities have one month to submit plans for receiving and distributing vaccines -- which may require refrigeration or freezing. Officials say the goal is to have vaccines on the way to immunization sites with-in 24 hours of approval.

Have not fulfilled our obligation to our community" It's why Michael Smith is starting a new organization called Sam.. In honor of his son sam was 23 year old.. He was on the way to pick his 18 month old son up.. And we don't know what happened other than someone shot and killed him" Smith says SAM would have a major focus on the youth "because it's the young people. We've got to find out what's going on with these young people that's causing them to pursue the roads that they're pursuing." Because this is happening in our community...Both smith and Crawford say it needs to be addressed as a community

7/7 Violence in CLT - It's a scene the Queen City has become familiar with... Yellow tape and blue lights in our neighborhoods... Especially these four hotspots... Monday night -- city council was briefed on a number of solutions they hope could work... Including two violence interrupter programs. One would happen in hospitals to help victims to stray away from retaliation through counseling and other services... The other program would be trained and trusted community members who would be called to a situation to defuse any violence. Those two pilot programs could start by this fall... Some question why so long. There's no mystery around the fact that Beatties Ford Road has been a hotspot for years. The City manager arguing solutions take time. ((We're giving ourselves a little bit of
