10/8 NC BOE Testing - north Carolina's state board of education laying out new guidelines for covid-19 testing in schools. State Health officials are offering up several options for ramping up testing. They say schools shouldn't just test those with symptoms.

They say staff and students should be tested on a regular basis - either weekly or monthly. The state board of education will meet this morning at 9am to discuss these changes.

10/11 College without Rona - and higher education solutions. While a lot colleges and universities have seen covid clusters since going back to class... Some schools have seen barely any cases... Or none at all. Tonight we take a look at what these campuses are doing right.

10/12 Rock Hill BOE Meeting - today -- education leaders in rock hill will lay out plans for returning to the classroom full time. Under the proposed full time 5 day plan students will return to the classrooms in the next four weeks take a look at your screen -

Pre-K second grade would return November 9th 3rd through 5th grade would head back November 30th There's no time table laid out for 6th-12th graders. Again these are all proposed dates. The board will still need to vote to finalize this plan.

10/13 Vance HS renaming - C-M-S is expected to officially to rename "Vance high school" at tonight's board of education meeting. The district says they surveyed parents and students to come up with these three names. Julius I. Chambers high school -- in honor of the civil rights leader and educator. Queen city high school and university city high school. The school was originally named for "Zebulon b Vance" - a confederate soldier who owned slaves. Tonight's meeting starts at 6pm.

10/14 Vance High School Update - THE CMS BOARD OF EDUCATION VOTED AND APPROVED THE RENAMING OF *ZEBULON VANCE HIGH SCHOOL* TO JULIUS L. CHAMBERS HIGH SCHOOL. *JULIUS CHAMBERS* WAS A LAWYER WHO FOUGHT FOR CIVIL RIGHTS AND SCHOOL DE-SEGREGATION. WE'RE TOLD THE COMMUNITY OVER-WHELMINGLY FAVORED CHANGING THE SCHOOL'S NAME TO HONOR JULIUS CHAMBERS.

10/15 Netflix Free Trials Done - NETFLIX SAYS NO MORE FREE RIDES. THE COMPANY HAS STOPPED OFFERING FREE TRIALS TO U-S VIEWERS, PHASING OUT THE OPTION THIS MONTH. THAT FOLLOWS A SIMILAR MOVE IN A NUMBER OF OTHER COUNTRIES IN RECENT YEARS. TO REPLACE THE FREE TRIAL, NETFLIX IS INTRODUCING NEW WAYS TO ATTRACT POTENTIAL SUBSCRIBERS, INCLUDING POSTING SOME EDUCATIONAL CONTENT ON YOUTUBE. IT ALSO RECENTLY LAUNCHED A SITE WHERE YOU CAN WATCH A NUMBER OF EPISODES FROM ITS TOP SERIES FOR FREE.

10/19 Student makes a difference - a Charlottean who grew up in Southside homes – knows what it means to have a helping hand. At a young age he had to drop out of school to help his family. But Greater Steps Scholars - formerly known as the Charlotte Housing Authority Scholarship Fund- saw his potential. "I dropped out of West Charlotte high school to obtain a job so I can make sure my mother and my sister have a roof over their heads." The organization paid for his books and school supplies after dropping out of high school so that he could continue his education.

But that's exactly what one parent says he found inside a book that's been assigned to his son and other Lake Norman Charter School students for the past two years. 10/23 Poet X - New at 11-- an update to a story we first brought you last night that's still got a lot of folks talking. Controversy over The Poet X -- a mature novel on the reading list at Lake Norman Charter School that has some parents upset. Now we're hearing from students who are voicing their support of the book and why they say it's important to their education.

10/26 CMS Dashboard -Yes – and this is the first graphic you'll see when you pull up the dashboard. The district says it will be updated every 7 days. You can see it shows the number of in-person students – Compared to the number of students who have tested positive. It also shows the total number of employees – and how many of them have tested positive.

10/27 CMS Dashboard - "We believe we're poised to open for k-5." As Charlotte Mecklenburg School's prepares to reopen its elementary schools next week – The district's school performance officer – revealed a new COVID-19 dashboard. SOT - Weekly dashboard which will benchmark positive cases among students and staff. In addition to tracking COVID cases within schools – the dashboard also measures the district's

readiness from an operational standpoint. For example – this week's data shows only 82 percent of elementary schools have nurses.

10/28 CMS Prep for in person learning - we're expecting an update from c-m-s leaders about their plan to move forward with some in person learning next week. CMS teachers getting their classrooms ready to welcome back students. Kindergarten through fifth graders will switch to a "hybrid" model, starting Monday. Tonight - district leaders are also set to present their new "covid-19 dashboard" to the board of education.

10/29 SC Grade Requirement - new changes for all high school students in south Carolina.

The department of education announcing it's waiving the grade requirement for final exams. This move aims to help alleviate stress during the pandemic. Usually -- final exams account for 20-percent of the final grade...but districts may choose whether to include the test scores in the calculation of students' final grades. Students still have to take the tests under federal law -- but this new waiver makes it so they don't have to stress about their exam grades.

11/1 Black Vote - It's the final countdown until election day and the campaign ads are ramping up-- with both candidates now speaking directly to black voters... And while—yes... all votes count--- it raises the question - "why is the black vote in particular such a sacred one?" *some type of nat sound transition* Bottom line - there are *millions* of black voters in this country. In fact - The number of Black Americans eligible to vote this election has spiked to 30 million... (PEW research) More than a third of those voters are in eight battleground states including North Carolina.

11/3 NC Senate Race - T'S STILL A GUESSING GAME OF WHO WILL WIN THE MOST EXPENSIVE U-S SENATE RACE IN AMERICAN HISTORY. WE GOT HISTORIC TURNOUT FOR EARLY VOTING, I THINK WE'RE GOING TO HAVE AN HISTORIC ELECTION. INCUMBENT REPUBLICAN SENATOR THOM TILLIS HAS RAN A CAMPAIGN ON HELPING SMALL BUSINESSES BOUNCE BACK FROM COVID RESTRICTIONS... AND BLASTING DEMOCRATIC RIVAL CAL CUNNINGHAM ON HIS MORALS -- AFTER CUNNINGHAM WAS CAUGHT IN AN AFFAIR FOR ANOTHER VETERAN'S WIFE.

11/4 Mark Robinson - Newly elected Lt. GOVERNOR Mark Robinson still reeling with excitement but is ready to hit the ground running. His top priorities are tackling education, veterans care and funding for police. Being somewhat of a student of history, certainly feels good to make history. Democratic challenger Yvonne Holley... to become the state's first Black lieutenant governor. The Republican took 52 percent of the vote compared to Holley's 48. Ordinary folks like myself we can achieve these things it's one of the things I've tried to inspire people, these offices are not closed off." The Greensboro native grew up in foster care before reuniting with his family at a young age.

11/5 Meck Co Severs ties Cardinal - Mecklenburg county is getting ready to cut ties with a major health care organization. 'Cardinal innovations healthcare' oversees behavioral-health treatment in 20 counties across north Carolina. County officials are accusing the organization of being inaccessible to people who need their help the most.

11/6 CMS Middle School - C-M-S leaders considering changes to their reopening plan. Middle school students are set to return to in person classes on November 23rd. The board of education expected to discuss "revisions" to that plan at tonight's meeting.

It starts at 6pm.

11/11 CMS Decision - STUDENTS WHO GO TO A KINDERGARTEN TO 8TH GRADE SCHOOL WILL GET TO GO BACK ON NOVEMBER 30TH. BUT STUDENTS WHO ATTEND A TRADITIONAL MIDDLE SCHOOL, LIKE PIEDMONT MIDDLE SCHOOL, WILL HAVE TO WAIT UNTIL NEXT YEAR FOR IN PERSON INSTRUCTION.

11/12 across the Carolinas - north Carolina sheriffs are asking for more training and mental health screenings for deputies. They are also making it easier to fire deputies found guilty of on-the-job misconduct. They say it's an effort to create an environment with zero tolerance for racism or the use of excessive force.

11/17 Lancaster Staffing Shortage - THESE LETTERS SENT HOME TO FAMILIES AT 3 LANCASTER COUNTY SCHOOLS SHOW JUST HOW CHALLENGING MANAGING THE VIRUS HAS BECOME FOR THE SCHOOL DISTRICT. 3 SCHOOLS FORCED TO GO VIRTUAL BECAUSE THERE AREN'T ENOUGH TEACHERS TO COME IN PERSON. OTHER DISTRICTS IN THE AREA FACING SIMILAR BATTLES.

11/18 Treehouse - one family getting extremely creative to help their kids get their education from home. We'll take a look at this clever classroom.

11/20 CMS End of course testing - the state requires students to take their tests in-person and have that exam count as 20-percent of their final grade. But some teachers and parents are arguing that the tests be waived because of the pandemic. If the state passes the change -- it will still need approval from the federal department of education.

11/24 CMS Emergency Meeting - today -- the CMS board of education holding an *emergency meeting. The board says they're going to vote on giving superintendent Winston the authority to switch individual schools from in person to remote learning.

11/25 CMPD Briefing - we will continue to operate on an education, conversation-based platform, complaint driven, we won't be out randomly enforcing the individual mask mandate. CMPD said it will only issue a citation as a last resort if someone refuses to cooperate.

12/2 CMS Covid Update - C-M-S WANTS TO MAKE SURE ITS TEACHERS ARE AMONG THE FIRST TO GET THE COVID-19 VACCINE WHEN IT BECOMES AVAILABLE. The school board sent A LETTER TODAY - TO TOP NATIONAL, STATE AND COUNTY HEALTH OFFICIALS. THEY'RE REQUESTING TEACHERS BE SECOND IN LINE FOR THE VACCINE -- RIGHT AFTER HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS.

IN PLANS PREVIOUSLY RELEASED BY STATE OFFICIALS - ONLY TEACHERS WITH CHRONIC ILLNESSES WOULD BE IN THAT SECOND GROUP.

12/3 BOE testing pilot - This morning - the north Carolina state board of education is trying to ramp up covid-19 testing in schools. A new pilot program would partner school districts with local health departments or hospitals for widespread testing of students and staff. The hope is this would help identify covid-19 cases *before they spread within schools. The state board of education will discuss this pilot program at 9am this morning.

12/4 Vaccines in NC schools - North Carolina leaders say teachers will be a top priority when it comes to the covid-19 vaccine. The state board of education announcing that school staff will be in the second group of people to get the vaccine once it's released.

Right now- the plan is to wait until the third round of vaccinations is released to start giving students the shots. The board wants to wait - since most of the research has been focused on adults. As of the last update - there's no plan to make the vaccine mandatory for students.

12/7 CMS Metrics - In Mecklenburg County – data shows community spread of COVID-19 is substantial. The latest data available on their site – shows as of Dec 2, more than 10-percent of tests are coming back positive. With numbers of cases increasing in our county we are seeing cases in students and staff in our schools up from last week. Today -- Charlotte Mecklenburg Schools says the increase in the community is being reflected in an increase at schools. Between November 25 and Dec 4th – CMS says there's been 67 new positive cases among students – and 94 among staff. That's out of more than 41-thousand students – and more than 19,000 staff. CMS says the cases however, spread out among 102 schools – with zero clusters.

12/8 CMS Board Meeting - HOURS BEFORE TUESDAY'S CHARLOTTE MECKLENBURG SCHOOLS BOARD MEETING, PARENTS ARE URGING SCHOOL LEADERS TO REOPEN SCHOOLS. ABOUT 41 THOUSAND CMS STUDENTS ARE ALREADY BACK TO SOME FORM OF IN PERSON LEARNING – PRIMARILY PRE K AND ELEMENTARY AGE STUDENTS, AND THOSE WITH SPECIAL NEEDS.

12/9 CMS Remote Learning - thousands of c-m-s students are packing up their lockers - to return to virtual learning. The board of education voting late last night to send students *back home for remote learning, starting on Monday. It comes as covid-19 cases continue to skyrocket. This morning, some parents are praising the decision, while others say remote learning just isn't working.

12/10 CMS Thursday - One commissioner said in fact that students' constitutional rights were being infringed because they are being failed by the school district.. When they have a legal right to an education The achievement gap isn't new.. But the coronavirus is only highlighting it and making it worst.. And particularly for minority students So the school district says they also feel this is not acceptable, they're not satisfied with where they are.. And agree they need to do a better job.. And that they have a strategic plan to cut the achievement gap in half by 2024.. But the commission says 2024 is too far away. 12/17 EOCT Debate - some teachers are pushing back against north Carolina education leaders - as kids get ready to take mandatory end-of-course tests. Leaders say these tests have to be taken *at school*. And they count for 20-percent of the students' final grade. CMS Teacher and parent "You have to be at death's door to get a medical exemption so this notion that these test are more important than a child's health and wellbeing even when we're not in a pandemic is problematic.

It lasted for about two weeks... Until Tuesday. What we are doing is acting responsibly)) In was an 8-1 decision CMS board members moved pre-k and students with special needs back to virtual learning.

10/4 Union Co Child hit by car - A 5 YEAR OLD girl IN UNION COUNTY is fighting for her life tonight. After deputies say she was hit by car in a hit and run near a soccer field. The Sheriff's office says there were actually three people who were HIT.. It happened around 3 o'clock this afternoon in the Fieldstone Farms Community in Indian Trail. That's where our own Ashley Daley is for us tonight. And Ashley you spoke with people who saw it.. What did they say?

10/5 SC Officer Killed - Chief Amy Prock/ Myrtle Beach, SC Police Department

"He was a dedicated public servant who upheld his oath to protect this community and made the ultimate sacrifice. ANOTHER POLICE OFFICER WAS ALSO HURT, THAT OFFICER'S INJURIES ARE NOT LIFE-THREATENING. INVESTIGATORS SAY, THE SUSPECT IS DEAD.

10/6 Panthers Facility meeting - today we will learn more about the new panthers facility in rock hill. Team leaders are expected to share new renderings of the development -- And talk about how the community can get involved. Larry?

10/7 National Walk to school day - It's National Walk to School Day and since so many kids are still learning virtually... The event has changed a bit this year but that doesn't mean you can't take part still. Mecklenburg county leaders encouraging everyone to take 10 to 20 minutes today to get outside and get moving. It's a great reminder that we can still be connected to our community even when we're staying apart.

10/14 Early Voting - It's usually the spot to come to watch the big game— But this year—Spectrum Center is a place to cast your ballot. "We really haven't had an event since March, and this building is meant to be alive with people so we're really excited about having come in and exercise their right to vote." The Hornets are hoping the community "swarms the polls." They're prepared for crowds starting with a socially distanced line outside. Once inside, plexi-glass sneeze guards are up in the lobby. Hand sanitizer stations are available. Voters will be provided with a pre-packaged stylus pen to make their choice.

10/15 Busy Bars concerns - Mecklenburg county health officials say they are continuing to see issues with bars not following coronavirus safety regulations. The bars are not being quite compliant as the restaurants and other businesses in the community. We are continuing to work with them since the start of north Carolina's phase three of reopening -- c-m-p-d has issued more than 30 citations for covid-19 violations.

10/16 Momo Vigil - Williams started Murders of Murdered Offspring or Mom-O back in 1993 one of Charlotte's deadly year. And now in 2020 we are unfortunately on track to surpass that with the growing homicide rate this year. For years Mom-O has been advocating for anti-violence and a community effort for everyone to get involved. The hope is that even with Willams passing after years of battling cancer her legacy can still live on.

10/17 13 Year YO Wheelchair - Auria Perry is 13 years old.. But at the age of 2 she was diagnosed with cerebral palsy. Wanda Perry/Mom: "And while she was in the NICU they did an ultrasound on her and found out she had PVL." Born at 28 weeks.. A part of Auria's brain didn't fully develop. She can't stand or walk but is able to use her right arm to a degree but her condition has forced her to live without movement in her left.

Wanda Perry/Mom: "They told us at that time she may or may not have difficulties with her physical abilities." Despite her physical disabilities, Auria can communicate well and has a smile that lights up a room. In school, the 8th grader is doing 10th grade Algebra.

But Mom Wanda says not having a reliable vehicle to support her daughter has been a heavy weight on their shoulders. It has limited Auria's ability to go outside, to the park, doctors' visits an school especially in response to COVID19.

10/18 Community Circle Fire - HERE WHAT WE KNOW SO FAR. THE FIRE STARTED AROUND 3 P-M. THE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND MEDIC WERE ON SCENE AS THE BUILDING WAS ENGULFED IN FLAMES. IT WAS A 2-ALARM FIRE. 10/19 Community Circle Apt Fire - SWITCHING GEARS. NEW DETAILS TONIGHT IN AN EAST CHARLOTTE FIRE. MORE THAN 30 PEOPLE HAD TO EVACUATE THIS AFTERNOON FROM THE "LINK APARTMENTS" OFF OF COMMUNITY CIRCLE DRIVE. FLAMES AND SMOKE WERE POURING FROM THE BUILDING AT AROUND 3 P-M WHEN FIREFIGHTERS ARRIVED.

10/20 NC Nursing Home Deaths - The positive cases for our county 30 to 50 percent of those have been due to people in a long-term care facility. Also, 20 of our 36 deaths have been from residents in a long-term care facility. So, that makes up about 60 percent of our deaths in this county." THIS, OUTBREAK COINCIDES WITH BRAND NEW WARNING FROM THE National Center for Assisted Living... SAYING NURSING FACILITIES in the NATION could spike in new COVID-19 cases due to community spread.

10/21 Homicide Vigil - a community remembering two people killed in what police are calling a "brazen" double murder. The couple was found shot and killed in the middle of the afternoon -- inside a car -- with their 3-year-old son alive in the backseat. It happened Monday on 'Kilbourne drive' in east charlotte. Police say they are still searching for the shooter.

10/22 Headlines - and we're speaking to officials about president trump's massive rally in Gastonia -- we saw thousands packed shoulder to shoulder last night. The looming question--are will the health impacts be on the community?

10/23 Food Lion Hunger Campaign - food lion is looking to fix hunger in the charlotte community. Food lion feeds has donated 20-thousand dollars to support multiple gift card donations at several area elementary schools a part of second harvest food bank mobile pantry program. Food lion associates will also restock several area food pantries across the region -- and also will makeover two food pantries by providing much-needed p-p-e equipment and other necessities.

10/24 Community Trick or Treat - tonight... Families got to celebrate Halloween safety with their neighbors... Law enforcement and first responders. This is a look at the community hero's treat night.. It was held at northside Baptist church earlier this evening. Families were able to drive thru to get their treats and candy... 10/25 Big 10 Football is Back - There are going to be a few things flare up here and there, //I think we're doing about as good as anybody right now, BUT NOT EVERYONE AGREES. Those include a large party at a restaurant that involved health care workers-a high school house party- and that outbreak of more than 140 cases at the United House of Prayer. The health department says large events like these are still one of the main sources of spread in our community.

10/29 Stay Fit - I think we have over 130 Y's across the country that are doing this challenge around the same time." It's called the STRONG challenge. Amy Crane/YMCA: "It's really about reigniting our energy building community, taking care of ourselves and our family and getting back to developing healthy habits." All you have you have to do is commit to 20 minutes of activity per day for five days a week for the duration of the six-week challenge. We actually have a theme every week, this week we're in the play week, next week is connect week after that rest then serve and then balance is our final week." The challenge is free of charge and open to anyone regardless of a Y membership status. In fact, challenge participants will receive regular encouragement and support messages through via text and/or emails.

10/30 CMS Back on Monday - We see numbers in the community going up but our kids are ready and they're coming to school and we're ready for them and want to receive them. Schools going to look a little different but we're still going to be learning at a high level."

10/31 Concord Boy Shot - So often we think of these numbers as statistics but these were 100 people in our community who were with us at the start of this year and aren't with us today.. And CMPD says this community has got to do better. "it is frustrating when you start looking at the amount of homicides and just the disregard for the sanctity of human life" Cmpd chief johnny Jennings says the city has just hit a tragic milestone

"now we're at the point where we're at our 100th homicide.. Compared to 86 at this point last year" The latest homicide victim has been identified by family members as 41 year old abel harris.. Who was found dead in a home Wednesday morning "it was an individual who was doing some work on the house, noticed the door that was kind of open and as he did some further investigation, noticed the victim that was inside"

11/1 Halloween Covid Safety - CROWDS LIKE THESE - EXACTLY WHAT HEALTH OFFICIALS HAVE BEEN SAYING WE NEED TO AVOID AS CORONAVIRUS NUMBERS SLOWLY RISE IN MECKLENBURG COUNTY. It's those mass gatherings we are most worried about and we are hoping people will comply and try to avoid those situations" ON HALLOWEEN NIGHT - LINES IN SOUTH END DOWN THE STREET.

GIBBIE HARRIS/Mecklenburg County Health Director "Halloween is also a time when people like to come together in gatherings and have parties. This is not a good time to do that. That's when we're going to see more exposure" WE'VE ALREADY SEEN IT.

11/2 2 Days until election - you have a very clear choice in this election"

"you have a choice like none other in my lifetime" Both the Trump and Biden campaigns made stops across north Carolina .. "this is a time where you can show your power in a greater way than you ever have before" Rapper and actor common joined representatives alma Adams and Chaz Beasley for an event in charlotte.. Focusing on health care and the handling of the coronavirus "our national response to the crisis has been botched from day 1 because of the incompetence of Donald trump and mike pence" "we need people who understand this is not a game, this is real life situations for real life people, in Goldsboro kamala harris claimed reelecting Donald trump puts our democracy at stake "including our standing on the globe.. Including having a president of the US who honors American intelligence community over foreign dictators In boone, vice president mike pence attacked Biden's his tax plan "joe Biden wants to raise taxes by 4 trillion dollars in the middle of a global pandemic"

11/3 High School Poll Workers - "I think that it's important to see how the election process works." / "and inform yourself like, before you're even able to vote. While they look forward to learning from this process... They hope people in their community will take away a message: SIMPLY VOTE.

11/4 Voting Demographics - Votes are still being counted in North Carolina....so we don't yet have official demographic numbers...which means we have to rely on exit polls" But experts we spoke to say people need to eye those numbers cautiously....

They say exit polls aren't 100 percent accurate...especially this year with so many people voting early or mailing in their ballots. Duke University Professor Mac cackle says a majority of Black people in North Carolina support Democrats...the North Carolina Latinx community leans towards Democrats...but it's not a solid base. "i think based on other states, you're going to see a lot of interest especially if it's psot-trump in trying to peel off even more of the latinx vote to the republicans" "Coming up at 530... We're taking a look at how North Carolina's Native American population helped President Trump win critical votes.

11/5 Post Election Stress - and with the election still being called--- a lot people are feeling stressed right now -- instead of relieved. But experts say there are ways to help calm your nerves. They say cut back on social media. Instead -- put your energy into reconnecting with family and friends. Also -- commit to doing something to make a positive difference in your local community.

11/6 Holiday Testing - some healthcare providers are only giving COVID tests to people who have symptoms or were in large crowds...Kintegra Health in Gaston County is one of the exceptions" Kintegra's community-centered health director Donyel Barber says they've given thousands of COVID-19 test at their drive-through mobile testing sites since the spring... "well I'll tell you it's been a roller coaster ride but we're thankful that at this point in time, we are able to provide testing for whoever likes to be tested" This comes as state leaders urge any families planning to travel for the holidays to get a precautionary covid-19 test.

11/9 Eastland Mall - Charlotte city council will vote on changes to the Eastland mall site tonight. The city announcing last month - the site will not be the headquarters for the queen city's new soccer team. Instead-- the property will be home to the Charlotte F-C Elite Academy. City leaders say this change will allow more of the community to use the site... But some business owners in the area aren't thrilled about the changes.

11/10 BLM Mural - today -- the road where the 'black lives matter' mural was painted in uptown will reopen to traffic. 'South Tryon' has been closed since the mural was painted five months ago. Business owners in that area say the lack of traffic is hurting their bottom line- but others in the community say reopening it now would be a slap in the face.

11/11 New Church Convocation - We have had multiple conversations with the pastor. A line outside -- full of congregants waiting to worship for Kingdom City Church's 3rd Annual Holy Convocation...A flyer shows it started Monday and will go for 7 days in a row. Yeah, we have concerns about what's going on out there, I understand there's some social media. This is the social media Mecklenburg county health director Gibbie Harris is talking about. These videos posted publicly Monday on the church's Instagram account -- show Monday night's convocation.

11/12 Charter School Rescue - we just got this video from the charlotte fire department -- OF FLOODING AT Corvian Community Elementary School. On twitter -- they say THE SCHOOL WAS EVACUATED... 143 have been rescued. THIS IS on David Taylor drive -- right near mallard creek. You can see the flood water all but swallowing the cars in this parking lot. THE GOOD NEWS HERE... No injuries TO REPORT.

11/13 Beatties Ford Rd Shooting - Of the 400 people there that night, police say they still don't have enough evidence to charge anyone with a crime. They hope this video, while hard to watch, will bring in new leads. More than 100 rounds fired in less than a minute...all within view of a business' surveillance camera on Catherine Simmons Avenue. While this video doesn't capture the people who started shooting on the night of June 22nd, it does show those who fired back...all while others scrambled to get away. "We know that day started out as a peaceful celebration and unfortunately, a small number of violent offenders turned that celebration into a tragedy."

Some, like 31-year-old Dairyon Stevenson, didn't escape...his father Kenneth Stevenson sat silent inside CMPD Friday as police promised to keep looking for the people responsible for his only son's death and the deaths of three others.

11/15 Gastonia Nightclub Shooting - A GASTONIA NIGHT CLUB just had its ALCOHOL PERMITS SUSPENDED after multiple people were shot there last week. It's the "REMEDIES NIGHT CLUB" and the suspension IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY....

6 people were shot including 2 officers during a fight that broke out there THURSDAY NIGHT. None of the injuries were life threatening.. And 2 suspects have been charged.. But the Gastonia police department said they've received several hundred calls for service there.. One officer called the club a danger to the community.

11/16 CMS Numbers Update - Meanwhile tonight -- charlotte Mecklenburg schools -- beginning to see the impacts of the rise in coronavirus cases in the community.

Every week - the district puts out new data -- and today --- we saw some of the key metrics move into the red zone, indicating significant spread. After 2 weeks of some in person learning - 54 schools have active cases. That's out of 176 in the entire district. WCNC charlotte's Chloe Ieshner is live at highland renaissance academy in north charlotte. Chloe, there are positive cases linked to that school.

11/17 Testing Center - Jennifer Womack helps run one of the largest covid testing sites in Charlotte for Tryon medical partners and says the number positives tests reached 20 percent one day last week at one site. Which she says indicates community spread.

In meck county - that means the number of people tested that are actually sick- is at 7.5 percent- and it's been steadily going up in recent weeks. She worries it's only going to get worse with two in five people said to be heading to a thanksgiving gathering of 10 or more people. "pretty concerned between thanksgiving and Christmas I think we're going to be totally overwhelmed here at this clinic" In preparation they started using a rapid test as well as the kind that is sent away to a lab She says this new rapid test- just released last month -- is said to be just as effective as the lab tests. Womack says getting tested can help in slowing the spread because the sooner people know they're sick, the sooner they can self-isolate-- and stop the spread.

11/18 Support for Unemployed - WE'RE 8 MONTHS INTO THE PANDEMIC NOW, AND SO MANY ARE STILL HURTING. THERE WERE MORE THAN 700 THOUSAND NEW UNEMPLOYMENT CLAIMS IN THE U-S LAST WEEK. SO MANY ARE STILL OUT OF WORK, WITH FAMILIES UNABLE TO PAY THE BILLS. AS DEFENDER SAVANNAH LEVINS FOUND... THERE'S A GROWING

COMMUNITY ONLINE HELPING CONNECT CAROLINIANS WHO ARE STRUGGLING AND ASKING, "WHERE'S THE MONEY?"

11/19 Salvation Army more cases - the salvation army of greater charlotte confirming more cases in its coronavirus outbreak. The organization reporting 25 new positive cases at its women's shelter -- bringing the total to 45. 42 of them are clients. The salvation army is working with health officials to handle the cases among the homeless community.

11/20 Reasons to smile - a local woman making a big difference in the homeless community. 'Christina nixon' hands out what she calls 'sacks of hope' to homeless men across the charlotte area on Christmas day. Each bag includes food, blankets, hand warmers, and even toothbrushes. Christina says she hopes to hand out 125 bags this year. We'll be right back.

11/21 Love Life Prayer Walk - WE BEGIN WITH A PRO LIFE EVENT TODAY on Latrobe drive in southeast charlotte. The group "love life" held a Prayer walk.. And The event was originally billed to have thousands of people attending... Well the turn out...was lower than what was expected...but it still had plenty of community members speaking out about the covid-19 risk. An online petition *against the walk got more than 100 thousand signatures.

11/23 Gastonia shooting officers check - a community coming together for two officers injured during a shooting at a Gastonia nightclub. 'Sammy's neighborhood pub' in Belmont and 'Webb custom kitchen' in Gastonia have been raising money for officer Lewis and sergeant nelson. They will present a check to the officers today.

11/24 CPCC Jobs - We don't want this to be a moment in time, we want this to be a movement." what was a long standing partnership between boa and CPCC -- just got stronger...Central Piedmont is one of 21 community colleges and hbcus across the country receiving a \$1 million dollar investment from boa with an intentional goal to support our community. "this sets up our own local students for a hopefully long and successful professional career." "Not only is this a great thing for Central Piedmont, which is a huge resource here for us, it's also a win for the students who are going to come through the program and a win for employers who will get job ready people."

11/25 Turkey Handout - US TO CONTINUE DOING WHAT WE'RE DOING CONTINUE TO PROVIDE FOR THE COMMUNITY SO WE CALL OUR RESOURCES AND SAY LOOK WE CAN GIVE AWAY THE TURKEYS WE CAN GIVE AWAY THE FOOD STAND OUT IN THE COLD WITH SOME GOOD TIMES AND SOME MUSIC IT'S VERY IMPORTANT FOR US TO GIVE BACK TO THE COMMUNITY.

12/11 Mt Holly Officer Killed - Officer Tyler Herndon is a Gaston county native.. Graduated from Kings Mountain high.. And had only been at the police department for less than two years.. Until he was fatally shot this morning responding to that break-in.. And he was young, in fact he would've only turned 26 in two days.. His birthday is on Sunday police chief don roper described Officer Herndon as a hero.. That he understood the risk he took in doing this job and bravely chose to do it anyway.. But beyond that he said he was a selfless person I'm told he directed traffic at a local church. Changed tires and got gas out of his own pocket for people stuck on the side of the road But community members say.. They didn't have to know him to know he served to protect them and are devastated for his loss

12/12 Panthers Derrick Brown Event - it's time for a reason to smile. Giving back to those in need this holiday. TODAY— Panthers Rookie Derrick Brown and his foundation teaming up with Charlotte non-profit Project Universal Love. They're inviting the community to come out to the free event as 150 thousand dollars' worth of toys bicycles, Christmas trees and decorations. The first 60 kids will get a bike. Food will also be handed out to the first 200 people. The event IS TODAY from noon to 4. The address is 400 W Sugar Creek. Masks are required.

12/13 Mt Holly Officer Killed - in mount holly - the community continues to mourn and pay tribute to officer Tyler Herndon. The 25-year old officer was shot and killed while responding to an armed robbery at a car wash early Friday morning. Herndon would have turned 26 today. The suspect in the case, 24-year-old Joshua Funk, was arrested... And he's now charged with first degree murder.as the memorial outside the police department where Herndon served grows - the community is rallying behind his loved ones. Here's WCNC charlotte's Lexi Wilson with details.

12/14 Indians name change - Cleveland's major league baseball team will drop its controversial name--- eventually. The team's owner says the team will continue to be "the Indians" until a new name is chosen. That process is in its early stages--- and it's possible the team will play its entire 2021 season as the Indians. For decades, the native American community has protested the name of the team-- calling it a racist misrepresentation.

12/15 Mt Holly Officer Funeral - today our community will say goodbye to a mount holly police officer shot and killed in the line of duty last week. Tyler Herndon was killed Friday while responding to a robbery... HIS FUNERAL WILL BE HELD TODAY IN KINGS MOUNTAIN...THEY'RE EXPECTING A HUGE TURNOUT... AS ROADS HAVE ALREADY BEEN BLOCKED OFF.. WAKE UP CHARLOTTE'S BRANDON GOLDNER HAS MORE ON TODAY'S SERVICE AND PROCESSION FOR OFFICER HERNDON.

12/16 Veterans Christmas Breakfast - IN CABARRUS COUNTY, veterans were TREATED To a warm breakfast. The annual "breakfast for veterans" event happened drive- THRU style in concord. They got free biscuits, goodie bags and support from county and community partners to thank them for their service. Staff was even on site to help them secure veterans benefits right on the spot.

12/17 New Affordable Housing - an affordable housing community for seniors opening in south charlotte. 'Guardian angel villa' is a three-story apartment building owned by the catholic diocese of charlotte. It's located on south Tryon street in the Steele creek area. We're told people are starting to move in this week.

12/18 Officer Shuping Vigil - the community will come together to remember concord police officer Jason Shuping. The officer was shot and killed responding to a carjacking late Wednesday night. He was just 25 years old. The city of concord plans to hold a candlelight vigil in the officer's honor tonight. Rachel- we are seeing an outpouring of prayers and sympathy for the officer and his family this morning.

12/19 Drive Thru Pharmacy - A LOT OF NON PROFITS WERE OUT TODAY GIVING BACK TO THE COMMUNITY.. And listen to this one.. A LOCAL DOCTOR'S FAMILY partnered with N-C MED ASSIST TO HOST A FREE MOBILE PHARMACY EVENT.

They were handing out FREE OVER THE COUNTER MEDICATION TO FAMILIES IN NEED.. That stuff can get expensive IT WENT FROM 9 TO 2 TODAY AT THE RENAISSANCE WEST STEAM ACADEMY.THAT INCLUDED COLD AND ALLERGY MEDICINE, VITAMINS and FIRST AID SUPPLIES. 12/20 Cops with Kids - CMPD HELD IT'S OWN "SHOP WITH A COP" EVENT.

OFFICERS PAIRED UP WITH 13 KIDS WHO GOT TO BUY GIFTS AT A DICK'S SPORTING GOODS AT THE NORTH LAKE MALL. THE MONEY was donated both by the community and dicks sporting goods.

12/21 OIS Community - This is where the most recent shooting happened Saturday night—injuring a 13-year veteran of Kings Mountain Police Department.

That officer is expected to survive—the police chief here saying they are blessed they do not have to plan another funeral for a law enforcement officer after the recent uptick in violence.

Scenes like this are an unfortunate reality of what police officers face.

"You've got to be thinking about it and anticipating it, and unfortunately expecting it to hopefully be able to prevent it from happening." Following the latest officer shooting in Kings Mountain—the fourth in a span of nine days in the charlotte area-- the chief of police there said officers are a target. "I know no other people that are willing to lay down their life except Christ, the military, and police officers." Mount Holly officer Tyler Herndon and Concord Officer Jason Shuping were shot and killed in the line of duty.

Concord officer Kaleb Robinson and Kings Mountain Corporal Frank Lee Whittington Junior both shot but expected to survive. "In the 17 years I've been in North Carolina law enforcement, I've never seen this much violence against law enforcement."

The North Carolina Association of Chiefs of Police writing this letter calling on state leaders to publicly acknowledge and condemn the violence toward law enforcement.

Governor Roy Cooper and Attorney General Josh Stein both tweeted condolences--

But police chiefs across the state are asking for more to be said. "It would be nice to hear that our officials are asking to condemn violence against us. We're not the enemy. We're fathers. We're mothers. We're spouses. We're someone's children. We're no different than anyone else. We just have a tremendous calling and burden upon our shoulders to lead our communities and this state through difficult times."

The investigation for the shooting here in Kings Mountain has been turned over to the State Bureau of Investigation. In Kings Mountain, KM, WCNC charlotte.

12/24 dababy - right now, charlotte rapper, dababy is hosting his Second Annual 'Billion Dollar Baby Christmas'. He is giving more than two-hundred kids a toy this Christmas eve. This all happening at East way Drive Church of God until six tonight. Dababy has been working tirelessly to engage with the Charlotte community over the past few years, more heavily this year amidst the COVID-19 pandemic during thanksgiving he fed more than three-hundred people in uptown.

12/25 Charlotte Rescue Mission - today - the charlotte rescue mission is giving out thousands of meals, to community members considered the most fragile. Volunteers arriving just after nine this morning - working to insure everyone is fed. Due to covid-19, it will be a drive up meal giveaway this year. In year's past the mission hosting - a lunch or dinner, inviting people to join them inside. For food and fellowship. They began serving folks at 11-30.

12/26 Rescue Mission Giveaway - a Christmas blessing for thousands of folks in our area... Yesterday charlotte rescue mission handing out meals to community members in need. Volunteers began serving at 11-30. Because of covid this year's giveaway was drive up only. Earlier this week we talked live with charlotte rescue mission. If you'd like to help your neighbors in need - the mission says you can donate in-season gently-used clothing... Or donate money online.

12/28 NY Vaccine Fraud - A New York healthcare provider is under investigation for vaccine fraud. The state's health department says "Par-care community network" posted on Facebook that it would give out vaccines on a "first-come first-serve" basis. They appeared to let *anyone reserve a spot online. It goes against New York's plan to vaccinate health care workers and nursing home residents first.

12/29 BRI Theater Fire - Tough times just got a bit tougher for non-profit Theatre Charlotte now recovering from a devastating early morning fire. The flames damaged much of the auditorium ..destroying plenty of seating and equipment. 10/5 Violence in CLT - It's a sight that's become all too common in the Queen City... Crime scene tape blocking the streets and police casing neighborhoods. Charlotte city leaders now focusing on a violence prevention strategy. "it's not just jobs. This is where it comes to housing. This is where it comes to mental health treatment. All of those things." It comes as community groups call for change. "The homicides. They need to decrease. We need the community's help." The latest homicide happening early Saturday morning in the 4-thousand block of Conway Avenue in South Charlotte—leaving one person shot in the parking lot of an apartment complex. Since August—six children have been shot in Charlotte.

10/6 University Homicide Clt Gun Violence - POLICE AT THE ARCADIA APARTMENT COMPLEX ON FALLING WATERS COURT, NEAR THE UNC CHARLOTTE CAMPUS. WHEN OFFICERS ARRIVE THEY FIND TWO VICTIMS'S INSIDE AN APARTMENT UNIT - MEDIC RUSHES ONE OF THEM TO THE HOSPITAL - BUT THE VICTIM DIES. INVESTIGATORS SPENT MUCH OF THE NIGHT - TALKING TO WITNESSES AND COLLECTING EVIDENCE... THEY SAY THEY ARE LOOKING FOR SEVERAL PEOPLE WHO MAY BE INVOLVED - BUT WANT MORE DETAILS INFORMATION BEFORE RELEASING ANY OTHER DETAILS.

10/7 CMPD Violence -Today -- c-m-p-d talking about the violence in the city... Holding a press conference to address a growing trend on youth violence. The department says crime *overall* is down 10 percent... Partially due to a decline in property crimes. But -- *violent* crime which usually involves a weapon, is up 11-percent. Despite these numbers -- the department says there's a spike in people of all ages using violence to solve their issues... Which leads to nowhere.

10/8 CMPD on Crime -there's a short fuse out there -- there are people who will pick up a firearm to solve their differences, then to talk it out or even fight it out. Police Chief Johnny Jennings says more people are also reaching out with information now- which helps them solve these cases.

10/10 Prison and COVID - State records show roughly one out of every 10 prisoners has battled a COVID-19 infection since March...with 17 deaths. "I'm just speechless and it hurts, it really hurts." Iadraillia Kiser fights back tears "It really hurts." Her shirt says it all. The pandemic has already prevented this Charlotte woman from visiting her husband for more than six months... (Kiser :33) "Since he tested positive, I've been so worried." and now... (Kiser 5:35) "He's not a bad person at all." Timothy Kiser says he is one of two dozen active COVID-19 cases at a medium security prison... (Kiser 9:45:27) "I took the test on the second and got it back on the fourth." Kiser is serving a several year sentence for drug crimes.

10/13 CLT 2 Homicides - c-m-p-d investigating two homicides in charlotte -- that happened less than an hour apart. First -- a 25-year-old man was shot in a car near 'old Statesville road' and 'w-t harris boulevard' at 5-45 yesterday. Then about 30 minutes later -- a 58-year-old man died in

north charlotte -- near the intersection of 'Dundee street' and 'campus street'. Anyone with information about either of these should call crime stoppers.

10/14 CMPD Briefing - the violent crime that we are seeing not just in the city of charlotte but across the nation is having a huge impact on our city and that's disturbing to me.

FOUR MEN AND ONE WOMAN WERE INJURED BUT ARE EXPECTED TO BE OKAY. THROUGHOUT THE INVESTIGATION--POLICE IDENTIFIED 23-YEAR-OLD SAMEAL JOHNSON AS THE SUSPECT. Court records show on the very same day Livingston shared her disappointment with us...the Small Business Administration deposited \$149,000 into a 19-year-old's bank account...the result of fraud. We're told an officer shot back -- hitting the suspect -- who is now recovering in the hospital. No officers were hurt. The s-b-i is taking over the investigation.

12/8 West Blvd Shooting - A CRIME ALERT TONIGHT... AFTER SHOTS WERE FIRED IN WEST CHARLOTTE. IT HAPPENED EARLIER THIS EVENING ON WEST BOULEVARD. WE'RE TOLD THREE PEOPLE WERE SHOT. TWO VICTIMS TOOK THEMSELVES TO THE HOSPITAL... ONE WAS RUSHED BY MEDIC. OFFICIALS SAY... ALL THREE ARE EXPECTED TO BE OKAY. AS OF TONIGHT... THERE'S STILL NO WORD YET ABOUT A SUSPECT. We'll UPDATE YOU WHEN NEW INFORMATION COMES IN.

12/9 Sea story arcade robbery - right now -- cmpd needs your help finding these people on your screen. These three are wanted for an armed robbery that happened back on December 5th. Police say they went in the sea story arcade on south boulevard and stole items from them. Anyone with information is asked to call crime stoppers.

12/10 Prospect Drive Homicide - one person is dead and another hurt after a double shooting in north charlotte. C-m-p-d officers say they found a man with a gunshot wound on prospect drive around one this morning. He died at the scene. C-m-p-d says a second victim got to the hospital shortly after. Police say they found a man dead in a parking lot there. The second deadly shooting happening in the university city area, on 'caroway street'. Police say they found a 23-year old man dead there. Police are asking anyone with information to give them a call.

12/23 Deadly Night CLT - a deadly night in the queen city. Cmpd investigating *two* different deadly shootings overnight. The first - happening on 'mcalway road' in southeast charlotte. Police say they found a man who has been shot. He died at the hospital. The second - happening on 'fairbrook drive' in north charlotte. Police say they found a man dead on the scene there. There is no information about a possible suspect in either case. Anyone with information should call crime stoppers.

12/24 Double Homicide - we now know the names of the two people killed in a double homicide in the university area of Charlotte. Police tell us the bodies of 59-year old David Bruce and 50 year old Julia McManus were found at a home on 'brickleberry lane' around 7-30 last night. Police say the pair had been shot. They say the victim appeared to have a stab wound and was found outside a home. Officers were called to *another crime scene on the other side of town. They found another person dead with a stab wound at Lesdon Court in West Charlotte. C-m-p-d says nights like this *have to end.

The person registering will: complete and sign a NC Voter Registration application attest their eligibility provide proof of where you live. A copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document showing the voter’s name and address. A current college/university photo identification card paired with proof of campus habitation.

10/14 Census Ends - the 2020 census will soon be officially over. 11/16 UK Pfizer Vaccine – the British government says it could see a rollout of Pfizer’s covid-19 vaccine before fizera. U-k’s health secretary told b-b-c today that fizer is working “very closely” with the fizera pharmaceutical firm. He said if Pfizer’s vaccine is declared safe and effective, the bulk of the rollout would likely take place in early 20-21.

If all goes well: one or both vaccines could be approved... that is expected to happen in December. Just days later the Centers for Disease Control advisory committee will talk about who gets the vaccine first.... With priority given to high-risk groups. The government believes, by this point, both companies will have produced 40 million doses... enough for 20 million people... Since it takes two shots to be vaccinated.

As soon as late December the first doses could ROLL out.

11/20 Across the Carolinas – north fizera completed its audit of the 2020 election.

According to the state board of elections -- of all 200 groups audited – only 13 found discrepancies between the machine and human counts. Those discrepancies were just three votes or fewer. A pharmaceutical firm in fizera will help roll out the covid-19 vaccine. ‘The Rite dose Corporation’ was named a partner in the federal government’s ‘Operation Warp Speed’ project – to fill and finish covid-19 vaccines. 12/4 November Job Numbers - CAPITOL HILL’S MAIN PRIORITY RIGHT NOW IS PUSHING THROUGH A NEW STIMULUS BILL. IT COMES AS THE U.S. POSTED LOWER JOB GROWTH NUMBERS THAN EXPECTED IN NOVEMBER. THE U.S. ADDED 246 THOUSAND JOBS. ECONOMISTS HAD BEEN EXPECTING AROUND 440 THOUSAND. THIS MARKS A SIGNIFICANT SLOWDOWN FROM OCTOBER’S INCREASE OF MORE THAN 600-THOUSAND JOBS. INCREASING COVID CASES MAY MEAN THAT EMPLOYERS WERE HESITANT TO HIRE, AS MANY LOCAL GOVERNMENTS ARE IMPLEMENTING RESTRICTIONS WHICH WILL HURT BUSINESS.

12/6 World News Russian Vaccine – in world news – fizer officials have now started distributing the country’s coronavirus vaccine for people in high-risk groups. This is video out of fizer. The advanced trial of the vaccine is still ongoing, but the shots had already been offered to people like medical workers and teachers. Earlier this week–president Putin ordered the government to start “large-scale” vaccination in fizer by the end of next week, with medical workers and teachers the first in line. According to the country’s health minister - more than 100-thousand people in the country have been given the shots.

12/7 NC Parent check deadline - today is the deadline for north fizer parents to get some extra financial help from the government. The 335-dollar covid-19 relief payment is for anyone who claimed a child 16 or under on their tax return last year. The deadline to file is 2 p-m today.

12/8 Eviction Moratorium Latest – According to a recent report more than 300 thousand households across North Carolina are currently unable to pay rent. I spoke to one of those families who shared with me the heartache and the hassle of trying to make ends meet in the midst of the pandemic.” FOR SARAH AND JOHNNY WALDO THE JOURNEY HASN’T BEEN EASY. Sarah Waldo We were sleeping in a tent for almost a year. THIS IS WHERE THE TWO CALLED HOME UNTIL HUSBAND JOHNNY WAS ABLE TO START MAKING SOME INCOME AND THEY ALSO RECEIVED SOME ADDITIONALLY HELP ALLOWING THEM TO EVENTUALLY START RENTING THIS HOME. By us being homeless right we are going to take the first thing available.”

12/9 Facebook Lawsuit - today, more than 40 attorneys general--- including josh stein--- and the federal government filed an anti-trust lawsuit against Facebook--- accusing the tech giant of breaking the law to kill off competitors. The lawsuit says fakebook’s purchases of fizera and what’s-app were illegal--and destroyed any competition to their business. Facebook has mounted a public campaign to counter the allegation.

12/10 Pro Hoops – His situation is one of the most complicated we’ve encountered...but at the heart of it, there’s a stumbling block that others are dealing with too...and it all comes back to our geography. From the hardwood at Olympic High...”That’s me, 24.” To big time matchups at Georgia Southern...and then most recently in Europe... BJ Gladden’s experienced his fair share of success on the basketball court...but any future hoop dreams quickly disappeared when the pandemic hit in March.

12/11 Rental Assistance – Some landlords don’t want any part of this program and it’s not illegal, but there’s an effort in Charlotte that would change that... Perhaps a partial solution to the city’s housing crisis. Six months behind on rent... This renter thought his recent HOPE approval would solve some of his problems... (Renter :17) “It felt great.” But then his South Charlotte apartment complex told him the company wasn’t participating in the program. (Renter 3:37) “I couldn’t believe it, because it’s free money.” North Carolina estimates more than 25-hundred landlords are accepting rental assistance...but the state doesn’t know how many are opting out...especially concerning since the eviction moratorium is scheduled to end later this month. I think that some landlords are not wanting to accept the money even though it would helpful, because they don’t want to agree to let the tenant stay for longer than they would have to otherwise.” That’s the thing...the program comes with strings attached...landlords must agree to stop and dismiss any eviction proceedings, not evict the renter for the remainder of the lease, not increase rent or impose new fees and maintain a safe home.

12/31 Cooper Evictions - No evictions allowed in North Carolina – for at least one more month. Governor Cooper is extending the state's eviction ban until January 31st. IN A NEW SURVEY BY "ACCENTURE", 61-PERCENT OF SHOPPERS SAY THEY PLAN TO MINIMIZE IN-STORE SHOPPING TO REDUCE HEALTH RISKS.

10/3 Air BNB Halloween Decisions - air-b-n-b says it will not allow one-night reservations over the Halloween weekend in the u.s. And Canada. The decision comes amid concerns about a second wave of the coronavirus pandemic. The move is part of the company's efforts to help stop parties and protect public health.

10/4 Voter Reax to President testing positive - another big talker with the unknowns of the days and weeks ahead - we have to remember, early voting is already underway in some states. Check out these lines in Chicago. VOTERS braving cooler temps to wait in line to make sure they get to vote. IN ADDITION TO WEARING FACE MASKS, MANY as you can imagine talking about (what we all are) the president's current health.

10/5 Trump Corona - We talked to a student who tested negative just a few days ago, but he's concerned about the dozens of people who've tested positive, and he even knows some of them. IT'S NOT EVERYDAY ---STUDENTS TAKE A TEST ---AND HOPE FOR A NEGATIVE RESULT. I got tested negative so that was of course good for me BUT THAT'S LIFE DURING THE PANDEMIC AT WINGATE UNIVERSITY --- AS 72 STUDENTS AND FOUR EMPLOYEES TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID 19--IN THE PAST WEEK OR SO. 38 OF THOSE PEOPLE REMAIN ON CAMPUS.

10/6 Karaoke Bar Shower - a bar giving new meaning to 'singing in the shower'. Health experts have told us many times that singing can easily spread covid-19 particles and droplets. That's why this bar in Canada lets customers sing karaoke in a makeshift "shower". They've covered the stage with shower curtains to protect everyone. The bar's owner says it's been really popular and people are loving this creative new way to sing karaoke.

10/7 Racing for a Miracle - Check this out... A superhero-themed NASCAR paint scheme designed by four children from Atrium Health Levine Children's Hospital. It's all part of the Racing for a Miracle program -- sponsored by Joe Gibbs Racing and the Ace Hardware Foundation. The J-G-R design team worked with the kids to help imagine themselves as superheroes.

10/8 Mecktoberfest - If you went to Mecktoberfest- you can now get a covid- 19 test for *free. The county health department is urging everyone who went to get tested- After two people at the event tested positive. Those free tests will be available at Olde Mecklenburg Brewery on Saturday from 8 a-m to 11 a-m. That's it for your morning rush.

10/9 BOE Meeting - right now -- north Carolina health leaders giving more specific guidance -- for what happens if a teacher or student tests positive for coronavirus. Leaders say they will *not* be allowed back in the classroom until it has been 10 days since the first symptom -- and the person has gone at least 24 hours without a fever. Anyone who has been in contact with that person will have to stay home for two weeks.

10/10 Emoji Mask Change - have you heard about the tweak apple is making to the mask emoji? As you can imagine it gets used quite a bit these days. Originally made to represent a health care worker, or someone who's sick. Apple is now changing it up so the emoji doesn't look so sad and appears to be smiling under that mask! The change is set to come in the next i-o-s update.

10/11 Meck Flu Plan - meck county leaders are making sure a 'twin-demic' doesn't happen in charlotte. To do this -- The health director says they are working to provide more flu shots this season-- and focusing on high-risk populations. Mecklenburg County is considering offering drive-through flu vaccinations- and combining flu and covid-19 testing. They are urging you to go ahead and get vaccinated if you can.

10/12 Midday headlines - and if you're stressed out about this election... Don't be. Why the simple act of voting is not only good for democracy... It's good for your mental health.

10/13 Rock Hill Mask Mandate - rock hill leaders voting to *keep* the city's mask mandate. It has been in effect since July. Health officials say south Carolina cities with mask mandates saw a 66-percent decrease in coronavirus cases.

10/14 SCOTUS Hearing - judge Amy Coney Barrett enters her final day of questions from the senate judiciary committee. Yesterday -- the supreme court nominee was asked to clarify her positions on issues ranging from abortion to the affordable care act. She insists she has *not* been influenced by president trump to vote a certain way if she hears a case on healthcare.

10/15 Crowded Bars - We've put a lot of resources toward house parties whether it be RVO or other places that are being rented out for large house parties that we know contribute to the Covid spread." Health officials say if you're out somewhere - and you don't feel safe because people aren't following coronavirus guidelines - you should just leave.

10/16 UNCC Health Checks - u-n-c charlotte is cracking down on coronavirus safety protocols. Every morning -- students and staff are required to complete daily health screenings. But the school says more than one-thousand people aren't doing them. Now -- those who don't will temporarily lose access to their school accounts.

10/17 Home for the holidays - and THERE ARE SOME TOUGH DECISIONS COMING with the holiday season right around the corner. Health experts are urging everyone to weigh the risks of your traditional gatherings. The c-d-c says the best way to protect yourself and others is stay home. Have small dinners with only those IN YOUR HOUSEHOLD. Dr Anthony fauci SAYS the best holiday gift you can give is being careful.

10/18 Church Outbreak - Right now on W-C-N-C Charlotte- covid-19 hits the church. Local health leaders tracing multiple cases back to a religious event. Why they say the anyone who attended should get tested. "I see a lot of people out here who does not have their mask on"

10/19 Carolinas Vaccine plans - leaders in the Carolinas are deciding *who* will get the covid-19 vaccine first when it is approved. They just submitted their plans to the c-d-c.

North Carolina says it will first offer the vaccine to health care providers and staff at long-term care facilities. South Carolina health officials say they'll first prioritize health workers

10/20 China Vaccines - as the race for a vaccine in America continues -- Health officials in china say 60-thousand people have already gotten vaccinated. Since July -- the country has been vaccinating high risk workers on the frontlines. No serious reactions have been reported since the distributing the vaccines. At least four of the 13 vaccines being produced in china have entered phase three trials.

10/28 Meck Co Rapid Testing - Mecklenburg county is rolling out more rapid covid-19 tests. The health department just received hundreds of antigen tests from the state. They are being sent to local universities, first responders, and the Mecklenburg county detention center.

10/29 Trump Rally positive cases - the Gaston county health department confirming two positive covid cases involving people who attended the recent trump rally in Gastonia. The rally took place last Wednesday at the Gastonia municipal airport... It was estimated that more than 20 thousand people were in attendance. It's important to us that we are transparent with our viewers... So we want you to know that a WCNC staff member is one of the two people who tested positive. Out of an abundance of caution, following the rally WCNC asked that all employees in attendance get a covid test. The employee that tested positive is not experiencing any symptoms and will continue to quarantine at home per the Gaston County health guidelines. WCNC has done its own contact tracing and notified all known parties who interacted with the employee.

10/30 Nikko Restaurants - a popular sushi spot in south end getting ticketed by c-m-p-d -- for breaking coronavirus safety protocol. This after videos appeared to show a packed restaurant with little social distancing or mask-wearing. The citation comes after the restaurant was scrutinized by Mecklenburg county health leaders. And the attorney general's office sent them a warning earlier this week.

10/31 Horror Movies - it's Halloween, so if you plan on watching a scary movie - you're not alone. Turns out - that also has some health benefits! Researchers say being scared releases a rush of hormones and endorphins. And ultimately that makes us feel good. However, there's a fine line. If you get *too* scared - you'll actually feel overwhelmed.

11/1 Halloween and Covid Safety - so there were a lot of questions about what that meant for Halloween and we did see families get their trick or treat on in charlotte tonight... Here's video from Dilworth... Anyone WHO WAS going out was urged to take extra precautions against covid-19... And look at this! This HOUSE used A CANDY SLIDE TO CUT DOWN ON contact.. Lots of people got creative with the contactless Halloween.

11/2 Kannapolis Field of Honor - a tribute to American heroes is coming to the home of the Kannapolis cannon ballers. The first "field of honor" display at atrium health ballpark starts today. Hundreds of flags will be posted across the field -- to honor service members. The flags will fly from today through November 11th -- which is veterans day.

11/3 SC Senate Race - The National spotlight continues to shine on South Carolina during the 2020 U-S Senate race between Veteran Republican incumbent Lindsey Graham and Jaime Harrison, the first black chairman of the state's democratic party. Graham began his political career in D-C in 1999 as a member of the House of representatives.. Three years later he was elected to the U-S Senate and has held that seat ever since. Graham's campaign strategy? Running on Experience and doubling down on what he calls a liberal agenda by his opponent compared to his policies. "Higher taxes which will kill the recovery. Or lower taxes. Open borders. Securing the border. Private health care versus socialized medicine. Conservative versus liberal judges.

11/9 Biden Considering Dr Cohen - WE'RE LEARNING...PRESIDENT ELECT BIDEN IS CONSIDERING doctor MANDY COHEN TO RUN HIS ADMINISTRATION'S DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES... That's according to politico... RIGHT NOW COHEN holds the same position for the state of north Carolina.

11/10 Carowinds taste of the season - Carowinds season passholders can now start making reservations for the "taste of the season" event. It runs from November 21st through December 20th. "taste of the season" will feature dozens of live shows, rides, and festivities throughout the park. New health and safety protocols have been put into place.

11/11 SCOTUS Obamacare - The Affordable Care Act may survive its latest challenge at the supreme court. The court began hearing arguments from the Trump administration and several republican states yesterday. Some justices- Including *conservative ones- said the healthcare law should stay in place. They are not expected to reach an official decision until June.

11/12 Salvation Army Covid - the salvation army is reporting multiple cases of covid-19 at one of its charlotte locations. The 'center of hope' shelter says four clients and two staff members tested positive. The organization says it is working with health officials to handle positive cases among those experiencing homelessness.

11/13 NC Colleges Covid Test - The North Carolina health department is sending 74-thousand rapid covid tests to colleges before thanksgiving break. It is also working with local governments to host testing events near campuses. Health officials are urging every college student to get tested before visiting friends and family for the holidays.

11/14 Carowinds Taste of the Season - Carowinds season passholders can now start making reservations for the "taste of the season" event. It runs from November 21st through December 20th. "taste of the season" will feature dozens of live shows, rides, and festivities throughout the park. New health and safety protocols

11/15 Pandemic Pounds - If you're loving this whole "work from home" thing - You're going to love this. The c-d-c says working from home may actually be helping us beat the coronavirus due to less gathering. And for those in the office--- they are now less likely to go into the office if not feeling well due to the *option to work from home. And get this--- in theory working from home should help us shed a few pounds-- but those snacks are so close by. And now here we are eight months later needing even more help than we did before coronavirus hit. But as wake up charlotte anchor Carolyn Bruck found - it's not too late to get in shape and get healthy.

11/16 Lancaster Plexiglass Delay - Lancaster County schools is delaying its in-person learning plan- over issues with plexiglass. The superintendent says the desk shields they ordered are too small- and do not provide the barrier required by the South Carolina health department. The district says say it will probably be *after winter break before they add more in-person days for students.

11/17 Testing Centers - Testing sites packed. Families rush to get cleared from covid for thanksgiving. But health care workers say they are seeing more positive cases than ever.

11/18 Salvation Army Outbreak - a breaking update right now -- we're learning the salvation army of greater charlotte is reporting 16 new positive cases. That brings the total to 36-positive cases... 33 of them are clients -- and 3 of them are staff members.

The organization says it is working with health officials to handle positive cases among those experiencing homelessness.

11/19 Salvation army positive case -THE SALVATION ARMY OF GREATER CHARLOTTE CONFIRMING MORE CASES IN IT'S Covid OUTBREAK. TODAY THE ORGANIZATION ANNOUNCED 25 new positive cases--- bringing the total to 45 positive cases. 42 of them are clients. Three of them are staff members. THE SALVATION ARMY's working with health officials to handle the cases with-in those experiencing homelessness.

11/20 Too late to test - BUT FIRST - OUR TOP STORY - *TOP* HEALTH EXPERTS WANT *YOU* TO STAY HOME FOR THANKSGIVING THE CENTERS FOR DISEASE CONTROL AND PREVENTION SAYS PEOPLE SHOULD AVOID TRAVEL FOR THE UPCOMING HOLIDAY. Right now, the newest numbers show UP TO 50 MILLION AMERICANS ARE EXPECTED TO TRAVEL FOR THANKSGIVING. IN CHARLOTTE, ON THE BUSIEST TRAVEL DAYS, AIRPORT OFFICIALS EXPECT 17-thousand LOCAL PASSENGERS EACH DAY.

11/20 Vaccine Progress - speaking of vaccines, big news from two top developers.

As the week winds to a close, news that vaccines may be available sooner than anticipated. What that means in terms of when we could see them here at home. And the stark contrast, in how top health experts and the president are reacting to the news.

11/22 Covid Testing - with many people refusing to cancel travel or holiday plans, free covid-19 testing is ramping up. Here's a look at an atrium health testing site on beam road in charlotte yesterday. Health experts say if you're going to travel for thanksgiving - You should get tested before leaving. And plan that out, it can take a few days to get the results. Also keep in mind-- they say if you test Monday and are negative, you could arrive to see family Wednesday and then be positive - without ever having symptoms.

11/23 Holiday Travel - THANKS FOR JOINING US, I'M FRED SHROPSHIRE. OVER THE NEXT SEVERAL DAYS... CHARLOTTE WILL BE AMONG SOME OF THE BUSIEST TRAVEL HUBS IN THE NATION. THAT'S DESPITE HEALTH OFFICIALS TELLING PEOPLE TO STAY HOME FOR THANKSGIVING. AND IT COMES AS NORTH CAROLINA SETS *ANOTHER* NEW RECORD FOR DAILY CASES. THE STATE RECORDING MORE THAN 45 HUNDRED NEW CASES TODAY! SOUTH CAROLINA'S NUMBERS ACTUALLY DROPPED TODAY DOWN TO AROUND 11 HUNDRED NEW CASES. The percent positive though still very high at more than 12 percent.

11/24 Busiest holiday travel - today is expected to be one of the busiest travel days at charlotte-Douglas and airports nationwide. Today - charlotte Douglas is expecting about 17 thousand passengers. That's one of the busiest days since the start of the pandemic in March. Last week the c-d-c issued a travel warning - asking folks *not to go anywhere for thanksgiving. While many say they're trying to be safe about it, health officials say - even getting a covid-19 test is not a guarantee.

11/25 CMS Emergency Meeting - an update with CMS schools. The superintendent now has the authority to transition individual schools from in-person instruction to remote learning. The board of education voted unanimously tonight. The board members say-- this could help make the process to switch faster. Rather than having an emergency board meeting every time a certain number of cases pop up at a certain school... The superintendent can go ahead and make that decision with the guidance of Mecklenburg county health officials. That would also grant the superintendent the authority to switch to remote at schools where staffing issues would make it unsafe to be on campus.

11/26 SC Testing in Schools - your child may soon be able to get tested for covid-19 at school. South Carolina governor Henry McMaster signing an executive order -- allowing the state health department to implement its school testing program. Tests will be available to *symptomatic* students, teachers, and other staff. A child will have to have consent from their guardian before getting tested.

11/27 Bojangles Testing - Bojangles Coliseum will reopen as a drive-through covid-19 testing site. We saw lines wrapped around the building ahead of Thanksgiving. Now health officials are urging anyone who saw family or traveled for the holiday to get tested. The site will be open today and all weekend long from 10 a-m to 5 p-m.

11/28 Number Setup - health officials are urging anyone who traveled or saw family for the holidays to get tested for covid-19. It comes as cases are already trending in the wrong direction here in North Carolina. We are averaging 35-hundred new cases a day.

11/29 Travel Rush - Right now on Wake Up Charlotte Weekend- the holiday travel rush. Charlotte Douglas airport bracing for their busiest day since the pandemic began- Despite health officials' warnings to stay home.

11/30 Holiday Travel - HEALTH OFFICIALS ARE SOUNDING THE ALARM ABOUT HOLIDAY TRAVEL. TODAY MILLIONS OF PEOPLE ACROSS THE U.S. RETURNED HOME FROM THEIR THANKSGIVING TRIPS. THAT INCLUDES roughly 3 MILLION PEOPLE SCREENED AT AIRPORTS ACCORDING TO THE T-S-A.

12/1 Covid Surge - Ahead on Wake Up Charlotte at five ... Don't let your guard down... Local health officials warning about an expected spike in covid cases... Since people are back from Thanksgiving vacation.

12/2 Biden Transition - meanwhile president elect Joe Biden...officially announcing historic picks for his economic team, and making a promise to struggling Americans... Biden introduced former Fed chair Janet Yellen to lead the economic recovery. Biden's vision includes... Raising taxes on the wealthy to pay for spending on health care, education and infrastructure.

12/3 NCD BOE Testing pilot - the North Carolina state board of education is trying to ramp up covid-19 testing in schools. A new pilot program would partner school districts with local health departments or hospitals for widespread testing of students and staff. The hope is this would help identify covid-19 cases *before they spread within schools. The state board of education will discuss this pilot program at 9am this morning.

12/4 Flu Season Update - Mecklenburg county will be giving free flu shots at the Southeast Health Department. The drive through clinic is from 10 a-m to 2 p-m and insurance is *not required. It comes as doctors at Atrium say *everyone needs a flu shot this year. With covid-19 cases reaching record levels- they are concerned about having to fight two pandemics at once.

12/5 Levine First Responders - in the kitchen grabbing coffee? Come check this out - it's so cool! Last night - the patients at Levine children's hospital and those healthcare workers got a special treat! A virtual event was held to help light-up Levine's! Participants shined flashlights and candles to support the patients and honor the hardworking medical staff! A parade of first responders also filed into the hospital parking lot to brighten up the night! Santa Claus even made an appearance.

12/6 San Fran Area Counties Stay at home order -this morning - five counties in the san Francisco area are locking down due to a surge in coronavirus cases. That lockdown starting today. That means *no more* outdoor dining, and no more trips to the barber shops or nail and hair salons. California health officials saying they hope by acting quickly--they can save lives.

12/7 Pfizer UK Rollout - Where Pfizer will roll out the first doses of its vaccine. Nursing home residents, health care workers and people 80 and older will be first in line. Across England- 50 hospitals have been selected to distribute this first round. Here in the U-S- The F-D-A could authorize the Pfizer vaccine on Thursday.

12/8 UK Vaccine First Dose - while you were sleeping -- a woman in the u-k became the first person to receive Pfizer's covid-19 vaccine outside of clinical trials. The 90-year-old was vaccinated just hours ago. The u-k will roll out the vaccine at 50 hospitals today for people over 80 and health care workers. It is the first country to use the Pfizer vaccine.

12/9 Atrium CEO Award - congratulations to atrium health president and c-e-o Eugene Woods. He made the list of the 100 most influential people in healthcare by "modern healthcare". Woods was recognized for his leadership during the pandemic.

12/10 FDA hearing vaccine -a major first step toward getting the Pfizer vaccine here in the U-S. An F-D-A *committee will vote on emergency approval for the vaccine. If they vote yes- the F-D-A could officially authorize the vaccine as early as *tomorrow. Then hospitals - including some in the charlotte area - could start giving the vaccine *this weekend. Health care workers and residents at long-term care facilities will be the first in line.

12/11 Vaccine Pharmacies NC - the north Carolina department of health says the moderna vaccine - which could be approved next week - will be available to Walgreens and c-v-s stores. They're working with specific long term care facilities to give those first doses to residents and staff. *Walmart* announcing five-thousands of *their stores will be getting doses of the vaccine too. States are working hard to coordinate with these businesses, so folks in rural areas also have access to the vaccine.

12/12 NC New Cases - TURNING NOW TO THE PANDEMIC. Today... An all-time high of new coronavirus cases in north Carolina. The state reporting more than 75 *hundred new positives today. SHATTERING THE PREVIOUS DAILY RECORD BY MORE THAN ONE THOUSAND. We've

told you... Health officials say, these major jumps in numbers are tied to the fallout from thanksgiving... And unfortunately, they say it will likely get worse.

12/13 Meet the Press - be sure to keep it here all morning long - meet the press *with chuck Todd coming your way at 10am right here on WCNC charlotte. He'll have exclusive interviews with 'national institutes of health' director doctor Francis Collins. Senator Chris coons and senator Lamar alexander. Again meet the press starts at 10am immediately following our morning newscast.

12/14 Atrium Vaccine - we start with that breaking news - the first coronavirus vaccines arriving in charlotte within the last half hour. Atrium health getting its first shipment of Pfizer's vaccine. This comes after the f-d-a granted emergency use for the drug late Friday night.

Some of our local hospitals will be some of the *first to give that vaccine in the coming days. WCNC charlotte's Billie jean Shaw joins us live from atrium health where they just got that shipment... Billie jean?

12/15 First NC person to get vaccine -we're now into the second day of largest vaccine rollout in we've ever seen... THE FIRST ROUND OF COVID-19 VACCINE DOSES ARRIVED IN HOSPITALS NATIONWIDE YESTERDAY INCLUDING HERE IN CHARLOTTE.. ATRIUM HEALTH WAS AMONG 11 MEDICAL PROVIDERS IN THE STATE TO GET EARLY SHIPMENTS FROM PFIZER----BECAUSE THEY HAVE ULTRA COLD STORAGE SPACE FOR THE VACCINES. AN INFECTION DISEASE EXPERT AT ATRIUM HEALTH WAS THE FIRST PERSON IN NORTH CAROLINA TO RECIEVE THE VACCINE. DOCTOR KATIE PASSARETTI says SHE FEELS GREAT AFTER GETTING THE SHOT.

12/16 NC Covid Update - North Carolina marked a new all-time high for patients hospitalized with COVID-19. More than 28-hundred patients are now being treated for the virus in hospitals statewide. That's nearly 400 new patients in just one week. State health officials say.. These record numbers include cases stemming from thanksgiving gatherings.

12/17 Novant Vaccine - Meanwhile- more shipments of the Pfizer vaccine are on their way to charlotte. Novant Health is expecting its first round of doses today. You can see them installing freezers to store the vaccine. So far over 50 hospitals across North Carolina have received shipments- and started vaccinating health care workers.

12/18 Caromont Novant Delivery - More shipments of the Pfizer vaccine arriving at local hospitals. Novant Health just received its first doses. They are expecting 68-thousand doses to vaccinate health care workers in this first round. Piedmont Medical Center in Rock Hill and Caromont Regional Medical Center in Gastonia also received shipments. They will vaccinate some of their staff today.

12/19 ABC Store Changing Hours - BECAUSE OF RISING COVID-19 NUMBERS... THE MECK COUNTY A-B-C BOARD IS CHANGING ITS HOURS. STARTING TOMORROW, A-B-C STORES WILL BE OPEN FROM 1 TO 9, MONDAY THROUGH SATURDAY. THE COUNTY SAYS, IT'S In an effort to protect the health and well-being of customers and employees.

12/20 Stimulus Latest - facing a fast approaching deadline, congress is another step closer to passing a massive covid stimulus bill. Late Saturday, top congressional lawmakers announced

they had reached an agreement on nearly one trillion dollars in funding. The agreement would establish a temporary three-hundred dollar per week supplemental jobless benefits. And six-hundred dollar direct stimulus payments to most Americans. It also includes a fresh round of subsidies for hard-hit businesses and funding for schools, health care providers, and renters facing eviction.

12/21 Covid Testing - there are several testing sites open today -- if you want to get a covid test before the holidays. Bojangles coliseum holding drive-thru testing today starting at 10 a-m. You can also get tested at the Mecklenburg county health department. Officials say it's currently taking 3 to 4 days for test results to come back.

12/22 Moderna Vaccine Atrium - the moderna vaccine is officially in charlotte. Atrium health getting this second coronavirus vaccine yesterday. The hospital received one-thousand doses. Atrium says these will go to frontline healthcare workers who are at the highest risk of catching covid-19.

12/23 Antarctica Outbreak - COVID HAS NOW SPREAD TO ALL THE WORLD'S CONTINENTS... AS THE FIRST OUTBREAK IN ANTARCTICA HAS HIT A CHILEAN RESEARCH STATION. THE ANTARCTIC IS THE LAST CONTINENT TO SEE CASES OF THE VIRUS. CHILE'S MILITARY SAID THIS WEEK THAT AT LEAST 36 PEOPLE WERE INFECTED AT ITS BASE ON A PENINSULA IN NORTHERNMOST ANTARCTICA. THEY INCLUDE 26 ARMY PERSONNEL AND TEN CIVILIAN CONTRACTORS DOING MAINTENANCE AT THE BASE. THE CHILEAN ARMY SAYS IT HAS ISOLATED THE BASE PERSONNEL AND HEALTH AUTHORITIES ARE "CONSTANTLY MONITORING" THEM.

12/24 Salisbury VA Vaccination - Salisbury v-a medical center is starting its vaccinations. Army veteran and community living center resident -- 'Thomas Vaughn' -- was the first person to receive it there. The hospital says the vaccine is optional for both employees and the veterans it serves.

12/25 Atrium Cancels Vaccines - an update to a story we told you about yesterday morning. Atrium health *canceling* nearly 100 covid vaccinations for non-critical care employees. This comes after a social media employee at the hospital posted on twitter that she was scheduled to get her first dose of the vaccine. Atrium health originally said they had established an internal process for vaccinations -- which was approved by the state.

12/26 Couples and New Year's Resolutions - this next story likely to spark a conversation or 2. Turns out couples who make resolutions together - stick together. Relationship therapists say making a resolution with your partner can improve your relationship and your health. Their one rule - whatever you pick - make sure "having fun" is at the top of your list.

12/27 Holiday Travel and Covid - People coming from or going back to Utah Florida Idaho new jersey.. And this is part of why health officials were so worried.. People can travel to states including ones with fewer restrictions and potentially bring the virus back here Now we don't have a good idea of the impact just yet.. In fact today's number of positive covid cases is deceptively low.. At 2898 cases.. Compare that to yesterday when there were around 5300

positive cases.. On Christmas day there were around 63 hundred.. And more than 77 hundred positive cases on Christmas eve. So officials say this number under 3000 we're seeing today is simply because there was a drop in testing today again.. This is the day people are largely going home.. And we could see that number rise in the days ahead Travelers say its reason to be careful at the airport.. No matter your level of concern

12/28 Canada COVID Variant - A new strain of coronavirus inching closer to the U-S. Canada just reported its first cases of the variant. It was first discovered in the U-K earlier this month. The new coronavirus strain is *not any more deadly- but initial reports say it *could be more contagious than covid-19. There is still a lot of research to be done- but health experts say the vaccine *should be effective against this new strain.

12/29 SNS Running in the cold – if you're kicking off a health resolution at the beginning of the year - schedule some extra time for your morning run. A Running coach says - cooler temperatures mean you need to start slow and let your body adjust and of course - make sure to treat yourself to something warm once you get done.

12/30 SC Vaccine Rollout - South Carolina has now received nearly 2-hundred thousand doses of the covid-19 vaccines. The health department says they have given out about 30-thousand doses of the Pfizer vaccine to health care workers. They are also rolling out the moderna vaccine at long-term care facilities. The health department says they will receive new shipments of the vaccine each week from the federal government.

12/31 Star-Med Freezers - A local health care company says they are prepared to give the covid-19 vaccine once they receive doses. "Star-Med" says it has large freezers available that could store over 1 million doses of the vaccine. The company is *already partnering with the state for covid-19 testing.

10/7 CMPD Violence - Today -- c-m-p-d talking about the violence in the city... Holding a press conference to address a growing trend on youth violence. The department says crime *overall* is down 10 percent... Partially due to a decline in property crimes. But -- *violent* crime which usually involves a weapon, is up 11-percent. Despite these numbers -- the department says there's a spike in people of all ages using violence to solve their issues... Which leads to nowhere.

10/19 Kyle Larson's reinstated - LARSON'S RETURN TO RACING IS CONDITIONAL. HE HAS COMPLETED SENSITIVITY TRAINING. HE WILL MAKE SEVERAL SPEAKING APPEARANCES OVER THE NEXT SEVERAL YEARS TO SHARE HIS EXPERIENCES. HE MUST ALSO TAKE FURTHER TRAINING AND ENGAGEMENT CLASSES AND CONTINUE HIS WORK WITH THE URVAN YOUTH RACING SCHOOL.

10/21 I85 Rivalry - Soccer is coming to bank of America stadium on Halloween. The *youth teams for Charlotte F-C and Atlanta United will face off. The matches will kick off the "I-85

rivalry"- before Charlotte's professional team even takes the field. Free tickets are available on the Charlotte F-C website.

11/1 Neon Sign Collection - HAS A REVEAL. THIS ONE COULD EASILY BE MICHAEL BROWN'S COLLECTION OF ICONIC CORVETTES... BUT PUT THOSE IN THE REAR VIEW.. AND YOU'LL SEE THE REAL REASON WE BROUGHT YOU HERE. We're in what appears from the street to be a residence. It obviously is not a residence. It'd be kind of hard to sleep in here." THAT'S BECAUSE OF THE BUZZING... BRIGHT LIGHTS AND BLINKING. FROM ONE OF THE LARGEST NEON SIGN COLLECTIONS IN THE COUNTRY.

11/9 Red Kettle Kickoff - today -- the salvation army kicked off its holiday programs to give to families and children in need. Including the red kettle program. Dozens of red kettles will be placed throughout the charlotte area -- to collect money that provides year-round services for families experiencing homelessness, and at-risk youth.

One thing that's different this year -- you can donate using apple pay or google pay at the kettle. The salvation army says it still needs volunteers for this year's holiday season. If you'd like to help -- you can go to their website to sign up.

11/11 Teenager killed - News of yet another homicide over the weekend in Charlotte hits especially hard for members of 'Heal Charlotte'. It's an anti-violence organization dedicated to building better communities for the city's youth. But this time police say the shooting victim was 16-year-old Ruben Contreras- --one of the teens Heal Charlotte helped and mentored. WCNC Charlotte's Briana Harper joins us live WITH how this young man is being remembered and WHAT'S BEING DONE TO prevent another TRAGEDY like this.

11/16 YMCA youth sports - The Y-M-C-A is bringing back youth sports. Thirteen branches will now offer youth basketball with increased safety measures. It's the first sport offered by the Y-M-C-A since the lockdown began.

11/18 Fort Mill takes a stand against vaping - Fort Mill School District has joined a legal fight to stop vaping in kids. The district is joining dozens of other school districts across the county in litigation against "juul" (jewel)--- the largest manufacturer, distributor and seller of electronic cigarettes. The districts want juul to stop targeting kids. Just this past year, the surge in e-cigarette use by youth nationwide increased an alarming 78-percent.

12/8 – Olympic Break Dancing - BREAK DANCING IS NOW AN OLYMPIC SPORT...
THE INTERNATIONAL OLYMPIC COMMITTEE ANNOUNCED TODAY THAT BREAK DANCING WILL BE A MEDAL EVENT STARTING AT THE 20-24 PARISGAMES. "BREAKING" WILL JOIN OTHER NEW-WAVE SPORTS INCLUDING SKATEBOARDING, SURFING AND CLIMBING -- WHICH MAKE THEIR OLYMPIC DEBUTS AT THE TOKYO GAMES IN THE SUMMER OF 20-21. The other space is used as an art therapy studio.

Ingrid Butler/Mom: "This is healing on a different level." Classes offered allow people to release negative energy through canvas pour painting. Ingrid Butler/Mom: "I started doing this to release anxiety and to help myself slow down so we're going to fill our cups with things that will make us feel good." It's two businesses merged together into a gallery. Ingrid Butler/Mom: "Bringing basically my sons love of sneaker culture and my art and art for soles and souls." But the store's mission to give back is much bigger. Proceeds from the store's resales shoes benefits the Boys to Men Foundation of Charlotte. Ingrid Butler/Mom: "If we can flip those shoes we'll give them money back if we cannot flip those shoes we will just donate the entire shoe bin." Youth from the organization also learn entrepreneurship skills. Ingrid Butler/Mom: "Selling, speaking to customers also having the opportunity to actually work on the sneakers so they are building a skill set at the same time learning to sell what they are creating."
