2/20 Hickory Student Charge - a hickory high school student facing charges for threatening multiple schools through *snapchat*. Police say 18-year-old 'jaleya allen' threatened hickory high... And west Caldwell high school. Investigators were able to trace the snapchat posts by location -- and found the source in hickory. Allen now faces two counts of making threats towards educational property.

2/24 Coronavirus and social media - With the spread of the coronavirus comes the spread of something else... misinformation. But some of the biggest names in social media are trying to fight back. Let's connect the dots. There have been some pretty strange claims about this coronavirus on social media... everything from conspiracy theories about where it came from to bizarre cures that could probably kill you. To stop the spread -- Facebook say it's doing proactive sweeps to remove fake information... and is offering free advertising space for health organizations that want to post educational information. On Instagram... which is owned by Facebook if you click on a coronavirus hashtag you will get a notice linking you to the official centers for disease control website.

Back in 2017 they voted to approve a 922-million bond package that would create some 26 new projects in the district. They also promised 3 new high schools with 125 classrooms at each one. But on Tuesday night district officials voted to remove 25 classrooms from each of those schools. Because of the vote - the high schools should open by august of 2022.

2/28 Across the Carolinas - 25-year-old 'Jacob lee' is charged with breaking into the home of an elderly couple and severely beating them. The attack happening last weekend in southern pines, north Carolina. Officials say lee is a paratrooper in the 82nd airborne -- and has been in the army for three years. An animal shelter is currently out of service after a break-in. This happening in Anderson county, south Carolina. The robber took more than 20-thousand dollars' worth of vaccines, medication, and equipment. Police arrested 'Russell prady' in connection to the crime. A federal lawsuit wants to change the way sex education is taught in south Carolina. Right now -- it is against state law for public schools to mention anything other than heterosexual relationships -- unless discussing sexually transmitted diseases. The lawsuit says this prevents L-G-B-T-Q students from receiving proper sex education.

3/1 SC Primary Results -right now polls show a close race for NC with former vp Biden leading pack but not by much mike Bloomberg is placing 3rd rt now....A who's who of democratic politicians at the North Carolina Democratic Party's Blue Celebration...((This is the most important election of our lifetime.)) Governor Roy Cooper -- taking the stage before Democratic Presidential Candidate Mike Bloomberg..((If we're going to beat Donald Trump in November, then we need to take him on in swing states like North Carolina.)) Following dhecupdate—Governor Henry mcmaster ordered all public schools and colleges to close until the end of the month. "our task is to try as they say flatten the curve and anticipate what we need in order to keep the ontagin under control." During the mandatory closures, students will transition to online classes. School buses with WIFI will be placed in rural areas to make sure students have what they need through distance learning programs.

On a conference call this morning – North Carolina's Deputy Superintendent of Innovation, Dr. David Stegall announced the state is looking at mobilizing free public childcare options. Opening up childcare centers inside schools. 17;27;01 We're trying to develop what it would look like within each district if we needed to open a childcare facility on short notice to help with the overflow for frontline workers, their children. Dr. Stegall said the childcare centers would only serve kids, whose parents are on the frontlines of the global pandemic – for example meaning kids of first responders or healthcare workers. He says right now – 1,500 daycare centers across the state have stayed open – and have roughly 1,500 open spots. What's that's told us is there may not be as much of a need for childcare facilities within schools. What we don't want to do is create free childcare facilities in our schools for parents and cause the closedown of private pay who are dependent on that revenue.

It's the largest coal ash clean up in u-s history. The deal settles several legal disputes between duke energy and community environmental groups. That includes the "catawba river-keeper foundation"... They've been putting pressure on duke energy to clean up sites in the catawba basin, as well as sites on lake Norman and lake Wylie.

1/3 Brain Injury - But you can see light. For Scott Mele - that light has come from painting. Scott Mele, Artist: "I was going to tell my story to bring light to what it's like to be somebody who's depressed or has anxiety, that has gone through trauma, and suffering in dealing with losing parts of who they are." The strokes of a paint covered brush on canvas can create something beautiful... But one move can alter a painting forever. The same can be said about life. Scott Mele, Artist: "I'm 42 years old. I restarted at 38." Four years ago - Mele was stopped at an intersection when a driver hit him at 70 miles per hour. He didn't know at the time... But he suffered a traumatic brain injury. Four months later... He woke up feeling lost. Scott Mele, Artist: "When I say I was completely estranged to my life I felt like I was in somebody else's life and trapped." The former car salesman says he used to focus on himself, success, and material things. Suddenly he questioned every decision he ever made and fell into a deep depression. Scott Mele, Artist: "I felt like I was suffocating every day."

1/4 Vigil for 13 year old killed at Concord Mills - last night for the first time ... We heard from propst's family as relatives and community members came together for a candlelight vigil to remember the 13 year old whose life was cut short. Dozens of people attending a vigil.

1/5 Propst Funeral - then - we take you to concord - where loved ones said their goodbyes to a 13-year-old girl shot and killed at concord mills mall last weekend. Her family and the community now pushing for change.

1/6 Australia Wildfires - DEVASTATING WILDFIRES ... REFUSING TO QUIT ... EVEN AS RAIN BEGINS TO FALL ON SOME OF THE MOST DEVASTATED AREAS. AUTHORITIES FEARED HUNDREDS OF HOMES MAY HAVE BEEN LOST IN THE SOUTHERN PART OF THE STATE. AND WITH MORE THAN 60 FIRES STILL NOT CONTAINED. FIREFIGHTERS ADMIT THEY ... AND THEIR RESOURCES ARE RUNNING THIN.

BUT THEY'VE GOT NO CHANCE TO GIVE UP ANY TIME SOON. Once you have become a part of this family, you just know it's a job that you have to do. You just, you just put your body on the line. You work your butt off for your community.

1/7 CMPD Homicide Strategy - City leaders learning new details into the deadly year 2019 was... Now, looking ahead -- trying to prevent it from happening again. ((No one thing that in and of itself will make the community safer.)) New numbers show four hotspots that CMPD says accounted for 8-percent of the city's violent crimes. Beatties Ford near lasalle, Nations Ford near Arrowwood, I-85 near Sugar Creek, and Central near Sharon Amity... Crime hitting these areas year after year. ((We Cannot do this ourselves. Law enforcement, policing, CMPD, we cannot do this ourselves. It's why the city is wanting to take a collaborative approach -- digging into data, looking at root causes, and evidence-based solutions. I really think that the neighborhoods are going to step up and help us make good decisions.)) This is a marathon, not a sprint.)) But some are frustrated that it's taken this long...((We have the homicide task force report from 2005, we have the criminal justice report from 2008, they've made all these recommendations and here we are talking

About the same things on a different day. So, when's it going to change?

1/8 Scott Brooks Shooting Video - Police want the public to take a good look at the surveillance video and images they released today. Police say there are two suspects—they are covered head to toe. Police have zeroed in on specific parts of the suspects in the still images—such as the gloves one was wearing. Detectives believe this was a planned robbery and that the suspects had knowledge of the business. Today—Scott Brooks' twin asked for the community's help in finding out who killed his brother.

1/9 Tyler Perry gives man a job - movie mogul -- Tyler Perry is giving back to his community. And he's even giving some, a second chance at life. Darrell hall was sentenced to life back in the 90's for possession of two grams of cocaine. Last month, he was released -- thanks to a new conviction integrity unit.

Not surprisingly, hall has had trouble finding work since getting out of jail. But thanks to Tyler Perry, that's all changing.. Saying he can start work on Monday at tyler perry's new movie studios.

1/10 CMPD Crime Stats - our problem is we did this in the 90's we took our eye off the ball and here we are again so shame on us. I can tell you from a policing standpoint our people are doing some fantastic work , I highlighted some of the community work, now it's time to fund that work , scale it up and reduce the numbers.

Charlotte is still reeling after the murder -- and now "noda brewing company" is working on a new brew in his memory. NBC charlotte's lexi wilson has the details.

1/13 Events Happening Today - today -- a new semester at central piedmont community college begins. The college's new 154-thousand square-foot classroom building will open its doors. Also today -- the state division of waste management is holding a public meeting in Davidson. They will discuss risk management plans for the residential area near the former Carolina asbestos corporation site.

1/14 Teens Stealing - right now - the community on edge after another violent crime at south park mall. 1/17 Double Murder Vigil - Tonight, a hurting family and community coming together to remember a mother killed, one of two victims in a mysterious double murder. 35-year-old *Siojvon (shuh-VAHN) "Mookie" Joseph* was found alongside *Asa Shannon* in a car early Saturday morning. Police say, both had been shot. Joseph's brother spoke emotionally about what his sister meant.. To those who knew her.

1/18 Serial Killer moves to York Co - also making news in york county... Neighbors in one fort mill community say they're in shock -- after learning a serial killer is living nearby. Catherine wood was convicted 30 years ago in the deaths of five people at a nursing home in Michigan. She's

now out of prison -- and arrived at her new home in south Carolina yesterday. This morning NBC charlotte's briana harper has details

1/19 MLK Parade - yesterday - thousands came out to celebrate the legacy of doctor martin luther king junior in uptown charlotte. The parade was jam packed with community organizations, marching bands and step and drill teams. It all kicked off at 10 a-m near "ninth and tryon" then made its way down tryon to third street. The annual event.. Always a huge draw... This year thankfully the heavy rain held off.

1/20 MLK Jr Day - here's a look at some of the events happening today around our area to honor martin luther king junior. C-p-c-c is hosting a day of community service called the m-l-k day challenge. Y-m-c-a of greater charlotte is holding its annual m-l-k holiday breakfast -- which we will talk more about in the next half hour. And the Catawba Nuclear Station is hosting its third annual m-l-k day of service.

1/21 Violent Crime - Charlotte leaders are looking at an idea other city have used to try to reduce crime called-- a "violence interruption coalition."

The goal -- to break up conflicts before they lead to violence. New Orleans's mayor announced a similar program in 2018 -- treating violence there, as a public health issue. They use violence interrupters... Like Eugene Vessel who spent 17 years behind bars. So far the plan seems to be working.

For a third year in a row the total number of murders in New Orleans has declined. Last year -- hitting a 50 year low. That's enough for Charlotte to take a serious look.

But circus supporters, including the CEO of universoul Circus which comes to Charlotte, said the wording in the law was too vague and asked leaders to revisit it. Those opposed to the ordinance also spoke about the need of the circus for parts of the community.

2/26 Sumter Deputy Killed - This morning ... A south Carolina community is mourning a sheriff's deputy. Sumter county corporal 'andrew gillette' was killed when he was ambushed by a suspect yesterday. Officers say he was trying to serve an eviction order at a home when he was shot. Deputies then shot and killed the suspect. Gillette was taken to the hospital where he later died. He was 37-years-old.

2/27 MLS HQ Update - tonight a community meeting is scheduled on the rezoning process for the old "eastland mall site" in charlotte. It's where the queen city's new m-l-s team will have its practice fields and headquarters. Community members are invited to learn about the vision for the site and provide feedback. The meeting is scheduled for 6-30 at the Calvary church of the nazarene on sharon amity lane.

2/28 Milwaukee Latest - in Milwaukee - the community is rallying together as they mourn the victims of the Molson Coors shooting. 5 people died when one of their fellow employees opened fire at the brewery- then turned the gun on himself. Still no word from police, on a motive in that shooting.

2/29 WA State Coronavirus - two new cases of coronavirus...announced in Washington state...health officials say the cases are presumptive positives... Meaning the c-d-c will need to confirm the results. One patient is a king county woman in her fifties who recently travelled to south Korea... She is in home isolation. The other patients is a teen who had *not* recently traveled internationally... He is believed to have contracted the coronavirus in the community.

3/1 6 year old dead - .this is one of the darkest days you can have as a school employee everything we do as school officials is to first and foremost take care of children and when we see a child get hurt in the community ..everybody feels it and hurts not just school officials but the community at large" >

Officials have not said if the driver will be charged. This is still an active investigation.

The other patient was from Charleston County.

3/22 noda Brewing Changes - the entire process is hurt for sure...it take sting out of it...it's been heartwarming people come out of the way to help stock it... Nice to have the community support the drive thru is open from noon to 7-30 p-m.

3/23 Talk to your kids about Coronavirus - Colleen Rodriguez, CEO of Jewish Community Services: "we're probably safe mommy but grandma and granddad aren't and they're in the two percent that could die" Mom Colleen Rodriguez says she has been fielding worries like that one ... and questions about Coronavirus from her nine year old son. Rodriguez: "parent to parent not even professional to parent I think we all have to again remain calm stay informed inform our children to the best of our ability and look for creative ways to keep our children engaged and active"

Rodriguez isn't just a mom ... but the CEO of Jewish Community Services ... a child expert. We asked her some of *your* questions when it comes to talking to your kids about Coronavirus.

3/24 Coronavirus Set Up - First tonight at 11 ..we're tracking new developments in the coronavirus pandemic. Dozens more cases ..right here in the Carolinas. At last check .. There are now 404 confirmed cases in north Carolina - you see it there right on your screen. There are 298 cases in south Carolina and we just learned Winthrop University student tested positive! We're here to give you the facts, not fear. And help you understand how our community is handling this pandemic. Thanks for staying up with us tonight. I'm sarah french. Here are the *three* big developments you need to know tonight. In Mecklenburg county .. There are *now* 106 positive covid-19 cases. In south Carolina ..governor henry mcmaster delivered a *major* update .. Saying it's now a criminal misdemeanor for anyone who is caught in a gathering of more than 3 people. And back in north Carolina -- schools across the state will be closed through May 15th.

3/25 Laid off Locals - This really speaks to how many people have been impacted by this pandemic...The CLT laid off local's page is only two days old but is already filled with people who say they're out a job and need help. Clicking through pics>

These are all people who are not getting a paycheck right now. Laid off... Because of COVID-19. "we're trying to raise a little bit of money and hopefully get the word out that people are hurting not just big corporations"

Jennifer Withrow and a friend launched the "CLT laid off locals" page this week.

"People will DM us with their picture a little bit about themselves and their current situation and then whatever app allows them to receive donations" For Jennifer, this project is personal. "I work, used to work at common market, I was laid off last week my cofounder worked at Earl's grocery and was also laid off and while we are able to pay our rent and mortgage right now we know a lot of people in the community who aren't able to do that."

3/26 Gaston Presser - Gaston County Board of Commissioners Chairman Tracy Philbeck knows one of those people who contracted COVID-19. "I have a friend in caromont right now who probably won't be here much longer because of this disease. That's hitting home" And home is where Chairman Philbeck wants people to stay.

He signed the stay-at-home order after the number of people in Gaston County testing positive for COVID-19 doubled overnight from five to 11. Chairman Philbeck says there's confirmed community spread. Daimler Truck sent out this letter announcing it shutting down its Gastonia plant for two days after one of its workers tested positive.

UAW Local 5286's president Scott mcallister tells me the worker is a young man...and he's currently on a respirator at caromont. The hospital's chief medical officer Doctor Todd Davis says the hospital is actively testing for the virus and it currently has an adequate supply of protective equipment. Chairman Philbeck says the order is enforceable...but he's hoping people will police themselves. "it's really affecting people's lives and unless people take that serious enough, there's going to be consequences."

3/27 Corona Set Up - first tonight at 11 ..the united states becomes the center of the coronavirus outbreak .. With over 83-thousand cases. In the Carolinas, the situation continues to escalate. Gaston county issues a mandatory stay-at-home order -- joining Mecklenburg and Cabarrus counties. There are more deaths tonight ...a total of 9 in south Carolina, and 2 in north Carolina. Also ..charlotte and Mecklenburg county continue to be the worst hit area in the Carolinas .. With 204 positive cases. We're here to give you the facts, not fear. And help you understand how our community is handling this pandemic. Thanks for staying up with us tonight ..

3/28 UNCC Worker Gets Coronavirus - UNC CHARLOTTE IS ALERTING THE COMMUNITY AFTER A CONTRACT WORKER TESTED POSITIVE FOR CORONAVIRUS. CLASSES WERE ONLINE DURING THE TIME OF THE POSSIBLE EXPOSURE. THE SCHOOL SAYS THE THREAT TO STAFF IS LOW.

3/29 Meck Co First Coronavirus Death - THE PATIENT WAS 60 YEARS OLD. HAD SIGNIFICANT UNDERLYING MEDICAL CONDITIONS. AND LIKELY GOT THE VIRUS THROUGH COMMUNITY SPREAD. HEALTH OFFICIALS ALSO SAY AROUND 20 PERCENT OF THE NEW CASES ARE REQUIRING HOSPITALIZATION. ALSO THAT A HIGH NUMBER OF POSITIVE TESTS ARE STILL COMING FROM THE YOUNGER POPULATION. IN ADDITION, THE COUNTY IS ASKING RESIDENTS TO TAKE THE STAY AT HOME ORDER SERIOUSLY. HEALTH DIRECTOR GIBBIE HARRIS SAYS IF YOU ARE OUTSIDE, YOU NEED TO MAINTAIN SOCIAL DISTANCING AND YESTERDAY THAT WASN'T HAPPENING.

3/30 Child Abuse - Compared to this same time frame last year, Mecklenburg County's received 280 fewer child abuse and neglect referrals...that's 21 fewer every day...now that kids and their guardian angels aren't in the classroom. Their main job is to teach our kids, but educators are also a lifeline for students...teachers account for one out of every five child abuse and neglect referrals nationwide. "They're really on the front lines of identifying child abuse and neglect Charles Bradley is with Mecklenburg County Social Services...he fears now that kids are home with their parents, much like during the summer months, those cases are vastly underreported. (Bradley 1:58) "They're not in school. They're not visible to professionals who would otherwise see concerns."

The number of referrals tells the story. In just the last two weeks, the county's experienced a 40% drop in referrals...just 427 referrals since March 15th...compared to 711 during the same period last year.

3/31 Food Lion Donations - new at noon--- north Carolina based, Food Lion is donating three-point-one million dollars to Address Critical Community Needs Caused by the coronavirus Pandemic the money will be used to help fund medical research at UNC Health and to give food to those in need.

Police say his one-man crime spree started on December 21st on Pineville-Matthews Road -- when he robbed a woman at gunpoint. Officers say mckoy then robbed seven different gas stations, all across Charlotte. He was arrested last night.

01/02 Sumter Ave Shooting - A person rushed to the hospital from a crime scene in west charlotte. This was the scene tonight along sumter avenue -- just off of West trade street. Police are still investigating what happened... They say the victim may have been assaulted or possibly grazed by gunfire. MEDIC says the victim had minor injuries

1/4 Vigil for 13 year old killed at Concord Mills - last night for the first time ... We heard from propst's family as relatives and community members came together for a candlelight vigil to remember the 13 year old whose life was cut short. Dozens of people attending a vigil.

1/3 Keyless Car Thefts - CRIME ALERT NOW "KEYLESS CAR THEFTS" ARE TAKING OFF NATIONWIDE INCLUDING HERE in CHARLOTTE. THIEVES ARE GETTING HELP FROM TECHNOLOGY TO STEAL YOUR CAR IN JUST A MATTER OF MINUTES. N-B-C Charlotte's Bille Jean Shaw joins us with how you can protect your vehicle.

1/5 Propst Funeral - then - we take you to concord - where loved ones said their goodbyes to a 13-year-old girl shot and killed at concord mills mall last weekend. Her family and the community now pushing for change.

1/7 CMPD Homicide Strategy - City leaders learning new details into the deadly year 2019 was... Now, looking ahead -- trying to prevent it from happening again. ((No one thing that in and of itself will make the community safer.)) New numbers show four hotspots that CMPD says accounted for 8-percent of the city's violent crimes. Beatties Ford near lasalle, Nations Ford near Arrowwood, I-85 near Sugar Creek, and Central near Sharon Amity... Crime hitting these areas year after year. ((We Cannot do this ourselves. Law enforcement, policing, CMPD, we cannot do this ourselves. It's why the city is wanting to take a collaborative approach -- digging into data, looking at root causes, and evidence-based solutions. I really think that the neighborhoods are going to step up and help us make good decisions.)) This is a marathon, not a sprint.)) But some are frustrated that it's taken this long...((We have the homicide task force report from 2005, we have the criminal justice report from 2008, they've made all these recommendations and here we are talking

About the same things on a different day. So, when's it going to change?

1/8 Scott Brooks Shooting Video - Police want the public to take a good look at the surveillance video and images they released today. Police say there are two suspects—they are covered head to toe. Police have zeroed in on specific parts of the suspects in the still images—such as the gloves one was wearing. Detectives believe this was a planned robbery and that the suspects had knowledge of the business. Today—Scott Brooks' twin asked for the community's help in finding out who killed his brother.

1/10 CMPD Crime Stats - our problem is we did this in the 90's we took our eye off the ball and here we are again so shame on us. I can tell you from a policing standpoint our people are doing some fantastic work , I highlighted some of the community work, now it's time to fund that work , scale it up and reduce the numbers.

1/14 Teens Stealing - right now - the community on edge after another violent crime at south park mall. This morning - two teenagers are facing serious charges after police say they were caught stealing. Wake up charlotte's billie jean shaw is live - and billie jean - it's what the teens did *after* they got caught that has them in *more* trouble this morning.

1/15 Chester Shooting Investigation - a crime alert to tell you about -- Chester county authorities are investigating a shooting. Police say, it happened yesterday near the intersection of Simpson

and culp roads.. Near the edge-moor community. Officers responded and found one person with a gunshot wound. He was taken to the hospital. Police have not named any suspects.

1/17 Double Murder Vigil - Tonight, a hurting family and community coming together to remember a mother killed, one of two victims in a mysterious double murder. 35-year-old *Siojvon (shuh-VAHN) "Mookie" Joseph* was found alongside *Asa Shannon* in a car early Saturday morning. Police say, both had been shot. Joseph's brother spoke emotionally about what his sister meant.. To those who knew her.

1/18 Serial Killer moves to York Co - also making news in york county... Neighbors in one fort mill community say they're in shock -- after learning a serial killer is living nearby. Catherine wood was convicted 30 years ago in the deaths of five people at a nursing home in Michigan. She's now out of prison -- and arrived at her new home in south Carolina yesterday. This morning NBC charlotte's briana harper has details.

1/21 Violent Crime - Charlotte leaders are looking at an idea other city have used to try to reduce crime called-- a "violence interruption coalition."

The goal -- to break up conflicts before they lead to violence. New Orleans's mayor announced a similar program in 2018 -- treating violence there, as a public health issue. They use violence interrupters... Like Eugene Vessel who spent 17 years behind bars. So far the plan seems to be working.

For a third year in a row the total number of murders in New Orleans has declined. Last year -- hitting a 50 year low. That's enough for Charlotte to take a serious look.

2/12 Huntersville Gun on Bus - Most 7 year old boys can be found playing tag – or kicking a ball. But on board an elementary school bus last week – a boy – just 7 years old was pointing a loaded gun. SOT – This was very heartbreaking to me to know that a student had access to this weapon.

Huntersville police say the school bus was headed to Blythe elementary school in Huntersville the morning of February 6th – when the 7year old boarded the bus with the gun. Police say the

boy then pointed the gun at multiple students while making threats. Police say that gun – a 9mm handgun, loaded with 15 bullets. – About 80 percent of children get their hands on weapons from inside their friend's and family's homes and cars because the weapons are not secured properly. The news a shock to parents – and topic of conversation at Tuesday's Mecklenburg County Board of Education meeting.

2/14 Faye Reax - The community is devastated over the loss of 6 year old Faye Swetlick. The south Carolina girl was found dead in her neighborhood after days of searching. Wake Up Charlotte's Billie Jean Shaw is live in Cayce, south Carolina. Billie Jean- the community is just heartbroken this morning...

2/20 Hickory Student Charge - a hickory high school student facing charges for threatening multiple schools through *snapchat*. Police say 18-year-old 'jaleya allen' threatened hickory high... And west Caldwell high school. Investigators were able to trace the snapchat posts by location -- and found the source in hickory. Allen now faces two counts of making threats towards educational property.

2/26 Sumter Deputy Killed - This morning ... A south Carolina community is mourning a sheriff's deputy. Sumter county corporal 'andrew gillette' was killed when he was ambushed by a suspect yesterday. Officers say he was trying to serve an eviction order at a home when he was shot. Deputies then shot and killed the suspect. Gillette was taken to the hospital where he later died. He was 37-years-old.

2/28 Milwaukee Latest - in Milwaukee - the community is rallying together as they mourn the victims of the Molson Coors shooting. 5 people died when one of their fellow employees opened fire at the brewery- then turned the gun on himself. Still no word from police, on a motive in that shooting.

2/28 Across the Carolinas - 25-year-old 'Jacob lee' is charged with breaking into the home of an elderly couple and severely beating them. The attack happening last weekend in southern pines, north Carolina. Officials say lee is a paratrooper in the 82nd airborne -- and has been in the army for three years. An animal shelter is currently out of service after a break-in. This happening in Anderson county, south Carolina. The robber took more than 20-thousand dollars' worth of vaccines, medication, and equipment. Police arrested 'Russell prady' in connection to the crime. A federal lawsuit wants to change the way sex education is taught in south Carolina. Right now -- it is against state law for public schools to mention anything other than heterosexual relationships -- unless discussing sexually transmitted diseases. The lawsuit says this prevents L-G-B-T-Q students from receiving proper sex education.

3/30 Child Abuse -Compared to this same time frame last year, Mecklenburg County's received 280 fewer child abuse and neglect referrals...that's 21 fewer every day...now that kids and their guardian angels aren't in the classroom. Their main job is to teach our kids, but educators are also a lifeline for students...teachers account for one out of every five child abuse and neglect referrals nationwide. They're really on the front lines of identifying child abuse and neglect Charles Bradley is with Mecklenburg County Social Services...he fears now that kids are home with their parents, much like during the summer months, those cases are vastly underreported. (Bradley 1:58) "They're not in school. They're not visible to professionals who would otherwise see concerns."

The number of referrals tells the story. In just the last two weeks, the county's experienced a 40% drop in referrals...just 427 referrals since March 15th...compared to 711 during the same period last year. (Bradley 5:54) "It does not mean that there has not been abuse and neglect, it's just not been brought to our attention."

When they do that it makes it easier for companies that may be having now difficulty in paying back loans, because the sales are dropping off, cause their losing their customer base due to the virus – that could jeopardize loan repayments. Well if the system is highly liquid and the rates are very low it makes it easier for companies who are in that financial trouble to make good on their loans. Dr. William Van Lear is professor of economics at Belmont Abbey College. He says while the future of the virus and its impact on the economy is uncertain – What he does know – is in the meantime – consumers stand to benefit. With the policy rates so low it means other rates are low, automobile loan rates are low, mortgage rates are low even personal loan rates are low. Homeowners who refinance their mortgages – could lock in new low interest rates. For example – a homeowner with a fixed 15-year mortgage paying roughly 3.75 percent a year ago – could now pay as low as 2.5% -- saving thousands of dollars a year. Credit card holders could also see a drop in interest.

3/5 Allegiant Hub - economy boost. The big announcement from the concord airport -- bringing dozens of jobs to the area.

3/9 Coronavirus Set Up -we continue to follow the latest breaking developments when it comes to the coronavirus. There are two confirmed cases in both north and south Carolina. reason for the drop - a disagreement between Saudi Arabia and Russia. The countries are two of the world's biggest oil producers. And this weekend a long standing deal between them fell through - causing the market to spiral. But the coronavirus is also to blame. People aren't driving or flying as much. And less demand means lower prices. As a result - experts predict gas prices will sink below two dollars a gallon nationwide within the next few months. And that's connecting the dots.

3/11 NC Coronavirus - "anyone can carry the virus to loved ones or friends who could become ill." governor cooper declaring a state of emergency which allows agencies to coordinate from one emergency operations center. It will also make it easier to purchase needed medical supplies and increases county health departments' access to state funds. It also protects consumers from price gouging. "there are bad people who take advantage crises in order to make a cheap buck, and that's what our price gouging law is all about. Keeping people safe. "here it could be something like hand sanitizer or face masks in order to keep the water particles out of your system."

3/24 Trump Economy - this was a medical problem we're not going to let it turn into a long lasting financial problem" president trump promising to reevaluate social distancing practices -- that have brought the booming economy to a grinding halt.

3/25 BAMVO - Breaking overnight- The Senate and the White House have reached an agreement on a 2 *trillion dollar coronavirus relief bill. The full details of the bill have not yet been released-but lawmakers say it would give direct payments to most Americans-and expand unemployment benefits. The bill is also expected to include billions for hospitals.

3/26 NBC - NEARLY 3.3. MILLION AMERICANS FILED JOBLESS CLAIMS LAST WEEK - A DIRE SNAPSHOT OF JUST HOW QUICKLY THE PANDEMIC HAS DEVASTATED THE NATION'S BUSINESSES AND WORKERS. 3/27 Sports Economy - This week alone saw the postponement of major sporting events like the Olympics...the Indy 500 and the U-S Open. With leagues worth billions shutting down all over the country -- the fall out will be tremendous. Glenn Gerstner: "Gameday revenues, plus the media revenues, plus sponsorships, plus merchandising."

Glenn Gerstner is a professor at St. John's University in New York and an active member of the North American Association of Sports Economists. He says just look at Major League Baseball -- a 12 billion dollar league that's entire season is in doubt. Gerstner: "If the players are not being paid they're not spending money. If the people that work at the stadiums are not being paid, their quality of life is truly adversely affected. We then multiply that across the other big four sports." Gerstner points out that sports still represents just a fraction of the world economy, but there's a largescale cultural impact.

3/31 Stimulus Bill - Congress has passed an historic 2 trillion dollar stimulus bill meant to invigorate the economy during the coronavirus pandemic, the biggest relief package in history. There's no denying the virus has taken a toll on the economy. As a result, you may have lost your job. Here's how this bill can help you. First, you'll get a larger unemployment check than normal. For 4 months, the law allows people out of work to get an extra \$600 per week on top of the normal unemployment payment, which is calculated based on your state's benefits and your previous paychecks. The bill also extends this coverage to more workers. These benefits will be available to people normally not covered, like freelancers, the self-employed, part time workers and independent contractors. So even if you don't work 40 hours a week or are a gig economy worker like an Uber driver, you can still claim benefits if you're out of work because of coronavirus.

"I had the opportunity to speak on the floor...my then representative Chris Malone came to me afterwards, after he voted for HB2, he came to me and he says hey Angela wanted to tell you your words and the floor really moved me... and I said yeah...just not enough to change your vote. In that moment I was like I'm going to run against this man." Angela Bridgman recalls the day North Carolina became the first state to sign this type of legislation into law. She says it played a large role in why she's sitting here today – as the first transgender woman to ever run for state senate.

3/13 Whips - our team coverage continues this morning in our nation's capital -- where lawmakers are hammering out a deal to help Americans affected by the coronavirus.

Meanwhile -- a top U-S health official warns that the government is failing on testing for the disease.

3/14 Coronavirus Deal - The house approves a massive aid package to fight the coronavirus-as more cases are confirmed across the U-S. How President Trump is responding.

3/15 Panic Buying - right now on WCNC charlotte. Packed carts and cleared shelves. As stores change their hours to handle the panic buying from the coronavirus. When you can expect to see the changes.

3/16 Delta Capacity - crashing travel demand is moving airlines to pare down operations. Delta slashing passenger capacity by 40-percent. This is a bigger cut than what we saw after 9-11. American airlines said Saturday it will cut 75 percent of its international flights through May 6. United announced flight cuts to the u-k. Southwest moving toward flight cuts as well. Treasury secretary Steve Mnuchin says the government would immediately "start working with congress to support the hard-hit airline and cruise industries.

3/17 Mandatory Quarantine - there is *no mandatory quarantine order from the U-S government. We verify the viral messages you may have seen about the Stafford Act.

3/18 Shelter in Place - Basically—it would mean staying inside and staying put with limited social contact until further notice. San Francisco has already implemented a similar measure--prohibiting anyone from leaving their homes "except for essential needs." Pharmacies, grocery stores, banks, gas stations and essential government services are remaining open there. In Mecklenburg county, the health director is asking people not to panic but to be prepared... but at this rate— she says we're moving in the direction of a shelter-in-place order more quickly than we'd like.

3/19 Snap Benefits - And an important update for people who receive snap benefits. How the government is trying to make things a little easier during the coronavirus outbreak.

3/20 WH Response - and the president is urging states to still do more. After hospitals nationwide ... Say they don't have what they need to protect workers and patients. The president saying it's up to states to get their own masks ... Ventilators ... And testing supplies. "Governors are supposed to be doing a lot of this work, Federal government's not supposed to be out there buying vast amounts of items, and then shipping, you know we're not a shipping clerk." hoping to give some good news ... President trump said therapeutic drugs that are in the early testing stages would be a "game changer". But the f-d-a says not so fast. Those drugs are still being tested to see if they're even safe to use. That could take months.

3/21 Tax Deadline Change - THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT HAS EXTENDED THE DEADLINE TO FILE YOUR FEDERAL TAXES. TAX DAY IS BEING MOVED FROM APRIL 15TH TO JULY 15TH. EARLIER THIS WEEK, GOVERNOR HENRY MCMASTER EXTENDED THE DEADLINE FOR south Carolina STATE TAXES... HE SET THE NEW DUE DATE FOR BOTH FILING AND PAYING TO JUNE FIRST.

3/23 Rumor Control - Welcome back. With so much misinformation going around about the coronavirus --the federal government is on rumor control. Fema has launched a website to dispel some of those claims you have seen out there. Remember -- you can't believe everything you read. Get your information from trusted news sources.

3/24 World Virus - "We'll stop all gatherings of more than two people in public, excluding people you live with. And we'll stop all social events including weddings, baptisms and other ceremonies, but excluding funerals. France's national quarantine, now in week two. The government empowered to extend the restrictions for an extra two months. In the Chinese city of Wuhan where the virus started, officials announcing many restrictions will be lifted in early April. But cases are soaring -- around the world!

3/25 Across the Carolinas - south Carolina congressman 'tom rice' is asking the government for a 100-billion dollar bailout for the state's tourism industry. The congressman sent a letter to federal leaders. He says if the airline industry is getting 50-billion dollars -- the tourism industry deserves double that. Charleston is going under a stay-at-home order. It goes into effect Thursday -- and will last two weeks. People there should not leave their house except for quote 'conducting business' -- or certain recreational activities.

3/26 BAMVO Setup - Breaking overnight- it took almost 24 hours- but the Senate has finally approved that 2-trillion dollar coronavirus aid package. Senate leaders reached an agreement with the White House early Wednesday. The *full Senate passed it unanimously overnight. Now it's headed to the house. Coming up in just minutes- we break down exactly what this means for your family- and when you could *actually see a check in the mail.

3/27 Americans Stuck Abroad - IT'S A TOUGH TIME TO BE ON VACATION. RIGHT now, AMERICANS ARE STRANDED IN DIFFERENT PARTS OF THE WORLD AMID THE CORONAVIRUS OUTBREAK. THAILAND WENT UNDER A STATE OF EMERGENCY THIS WEEK AS THE GOVERNMENT GIVES ITSELF NEW POWERS TO DEAL WITH THE CRISIS. THE COUNTRY ANNOUNCED IT WAS CLOSING ITS BORDERS TO NEARLY ALL FOREIGNERS.

3/28 Get me PPE - WE'VE BEEN REPORTING ON THE LACK OF Personal Protective Equipment for medical professionals who need them. Tonight, clinical leaders, and engineers from Universities across North Carolina are trying to fix that. Using the Hashtag GET-ME-ALT-P-P-E. Anyone working in healthcare can sign up and receive 'face shields.' The shields provide better protection from breathing in the coronavirus while they work. They're made Using 3-D printer technology. Organizers say until enough supplies comes in from the Government-- everyone has to team up together for each other.

3/29 Coronavirus in the Carolinas -breaking right now - the number of cases of covid-19 in north Carolina has now jumped overnight to more than 1-thousand. While the number of cases in south Carolina is just over 650. The very latest numbers and new advisories from the CDC coming up.

1/1 Dry January - a lot of diets and resolutions are kicking off today ... Including so called dry January. Last year ... 20 percent of people participated in the alcohol free month ... Opting for "mock - tails". Experts say health benefits can include weight loss and being in a better mood. It's not bad for your wallet either ... Saving you Money on expensive drinks.

1/2 Smoke Free - BREATHING EASIER HOW TEN YEARS SMOKE FREE HAS HAD A MAJOR IMPACT ON THE HEALTH OF PEOPLE IN NORTH CAROLINA.

1/3 Drug cost hike - more than 250 drugs are more expensive. Six major drug companies pushed the cost of their medications up by about five percent. Everything from cancer treatments to blood thinners were impacted. Experts say you're not likely to pay the cost up front... But it could raise overall healthcare costs ... Which means your insurance premiums might be going up.

1/4 Flu Death - and to give you some perspective on flu season -- take a look at this graph from state health officials. That red line is the current flu season. You can see -- it's far from over. So if you didn't get your vaccine yet -- doctors say you should get it as soon possible.

1/5 Plants work stress - turning now to health news - do you find yourself constantly stressed at work? Turns out - you *may want to get a plant. Researchers in Japan asked workers to take a 3-minute break at their desk when they felt fatigued. Those who had a small plant near their computer-- saw *significant drops in their anxiety levels. Researchers only studied 60-people.

1/6 Virtual Reality Table Rock Mtn - A virtual reality project is letting people experience a tough hike at a South Carolina state park in a matter of minutes-- and all without taking a step. Many people aren't able to make the strenuous three-point-six-mile trek that climbs two-thousand feet to the top of Table Rock Mountain because of mobility or health restrictions. But now they can with a five-minute virtual reality experience. It's the first of its kind for the state's parks.

1/7 Work Health - does it seem like all you do is work? Well -- chances are -- you do! A new survey shows one out of six employees spends more than 11-hours a week on just work. Even off the clock. It includes checking emails and taking phone calls. If you're skipping lunches, working weekends or always leaving late -- you could be a workaholic.

1/9 Middle Age Health - some health news to tell you about -- if you're "middle aged" then eating healthy can come with some major benefits for you. Researchers looked at five factors: smoking status, diet, alcohol intake, exercise and weight -- to calculate a healthy lifestyle score. They found people with the *highest* scores lived 7 to 10 extra years *without* any major diseases ... Than those with the lowest scores.

1/10 Heart Condition - Well two year old Emmet Hichew has Kubaki syndrome. Not only does she need a walker to get around but she also needs oxygen. Well here at mcclintock Middle school students are using 3D printing to make her a holder for her /tank that clips to the walker. 6th grade teacher Ben Davis says he was at Greg Olsen's Hardest Yard 5k – when he noticed little Emmet Hitchew. 15;50;57 I saw the need that someone was chasing her with a backpack holding the tank, and I thought hmm, that's something that 3D printing and 6th

graders could accomplish so her parents don't have to follow her around the house all the time. So Davis invited little Emmet to the classroom – and presented the challenge to the students.

1/11 Deadly Ammonia Spill - this morning - we're still working to learn more about a deadly ammonia spill at lineage logistics. In Statesville Friday afternoon. Where crews are still on scene.... And stayed overnight. Re-capping what we *do know - one person is dead... Another has serious injuries...and 2 paramedics were sent to the hospital. While *no* mandatory evacuations were ordered....the county did distribute health and safety information to people living nearby.

1/13 Statesville Ammonia Death update - new information about a deadly chemical leak AT A PLANT in Iredell county...emergency management officials tell us lineage (LIN-EE-IG) logistics IS STILL closed and crews are still investigating Friday's deadly incident.

1/14 Philippines Volcano Update - a volcano in the Philippines is still spewing ash this morning. The eruption forced more than 20-thousand people to evacuate. The heavy smog is also blowing toward the country's nearby capitol- causing health concerns for children and the elderly.

1/15 Luke Kuechly Retirement - NOW TO NEWS THAT SHOCKED PANTHERS NATION OVERNIGHT. STAR LINEBACKER LUKE KUECHLY HAS RETIRED FROM THE N-F-L AT JUST 28 YEARS OLD. The panthers A 3 and half minute video on twitter last night. KUECHLY SAYS HIS HEALTH IS THE REASON HE'S LEAVING FOOTBALL.

1/16 Powerade new Line - Powerade has a new line of drinks for the first time in over a decade. The new products target everyone -- there's a new zero-sugar, zero-calorie option called "Powerade ultra." there's "Powerade power water" -- which is flavored water that contains electrolytes and vitamins. The new line hopes to move beyond sports drinks... And make a splash in the health and wellness market.

1/16 Binge Drinking - a new report shows binge drinkers are consuming *more* alcohol. According to the c-d-c -- the biggest jump was in adults over 35 Whites... And those with lower education *and* income levels. Wyoming had the most binge drinkers. Binge drinking is defined as having an average of *seven* drinks... On the same occasion.

1/17 MLB First Female Coach - history is being made in major league baseball! The first ever female coach has been hired. *Alyssa nakken* was named the assistant coach for the san Francisco giants. Nakken is a former softball player. Prior to being named assistant coach, she developed, produced and directed a number of the giant's health and wellness initiatives. 1/21 China Outbreak deaths - a fourth death is being blamed on a new virus spreading rampant in china right now. Doctors say the 'coronavirus' is similar to sars -- or 'severe acute respiratory syndrome'. The number of people infected has *tripled* over recent days. We're told the world health organization is holding an emergency meeting tomorrow to discuss the outbreak.

1/22 UNCC Rec Center - today -- NBC charlotte got a look at the new rec center at u-n-c charlotte. The u-rec has new amenities for students and staff. They include pools, weightlifting equipment and floors that are more inclusive for people with disabilities. It's the first and only campus facility dedicated solely to health and recreation.

A new study from the University of Arizona shows faking positivity could hurt your mental health and your relationship with your coworkers. Your fake smile may get you out of an awkward situation or two- but experts say over time people will see right through it and you'll end up exhausted.

1/24 Skin Infection - a health alert for parents ... After a contagious skin infection outbreak at a local middle school. How you can protect your family.

1/25 Nail Salon - and -- getting pampered for a cause. The community coming together to remember a sweet and spunky little girl -- who recently lost her battle with cancer.

1/26 Yoga Class - A Union County school is using yoga to help students manage stress, anger, and fitness. NBC Charlotte's Mike Hanson shows us the benefits being felt inside Sardis Elementary.

1/27 Pineville Bed Tower - The influx of growth in Queen City has forced Atrium Health to expand one of their locations. Leading to price gouging and business raids by police - where people are reportedly attempting to sell *overpriced* face mask. The raid happened yesterday (Friday) after the health department announced the country's first confirmed case of the deadly virus. 2/13 Coronavirus Update - this morning -- more local counties are monitoring people for the coronavirus. Rowan county health officials say a handful of people there recently traveled to china. Union and Mecklenburg counties are also monitoring people. There are *no* confirmed cases of coronavirus in north Carolina.

2/13 Juul targeting kids - A MAJOR LAWSUIT AGAINST E-CIG MAKER JUUL ... SAYING IT BOUGHT ADS ON NETWORKS TARGETING KIDS AND TEENS. ALLEGATIONS IN THE SUIT ... SAY THE COMPANY BOUGHT ADS ON TEEN FOCUES WEBSITES FOR NICKELODEON ... CARTOON NETWORK ... AND SEVERAL EDUCATIONAL SITES. THE Massachusetts ATTORNEY GENERAL ... WHO FILED THE LAWSUIT ... SAYS THE ADS WERE BOUGHT IN 20-15 JUST AFTER THE COMPANY LAUNCHED. JUUL SAYS IT HASN'T REVIEWED THE COMPLAINT BUT WANTS TO WORK WITH REGULATORS TO COMBAT UNDERAGE USE.

2/14 Carolinas flu death - for the first time this flu season -- a child under 5-years-old died from the flu in north Carolina. Nine people in total died last week -- bringing the number of deaths this season to 75 statewide. And there have been 68 flu-related deaths in south Carolina. North Carolina health officials say statewide -- flu numbers are about the same as this time last year.

2/15 Funk on your watch - this time of year it seems germs are everywhere - even where you least expect them. On the other side of the break - the top item health experts say many neglects.

2/16 Cupid Cup 5K - check it out - this was the scene yesterday...as folks bundled up and ran for a good cause. Taking part in charlotte's "cupid cup five-k".... Charlotte today's "colleen Odegaard" and "Eugene Robinson" helped kick things off. The annual run benefits heart health programs at atrium health. Sixteen years and going strong... W-c-n-c charlotte was a proud sponsor this year.

2/17 Teen Apple Watch - And saved by a smartwatch. How the device alerted this teenager to a rare disease- and you can use a smartwatch to check your own health.

2/18 Coronavirus update - right now -- health officials are scrambling to track down passengers from a cruise ship that docked in Cambodia. After being stranded at sea for two weeks -- officials learned an 83-year-old American woman was infected with the coronavirus. There are now more than 71-thousand cases around the world -- and 18-hundred deaths -- including a hospital director in Wuhan. That's your morning rush.

2/19 Eating a big breakfast - now to some health headlines -- eating a hefty breakfast could kickstart your metabolism big for the day. A study had 16 men eat a low-calorie breakfast and high-calorie dinner... And then try the opposite as well. After three days... Researchers found participants burned twice as many calories when they ate the larger meal in the morning! On the other hand... Scientists say eating a low-calorie breakfast sparked an increased appetite... Especially for sweets!

2/20 UNCC Tuberculosis - Mecklenburg county health officials are investigating two possible cases of tuberculosis on u-n-c charlotte's campus. Right now -- they're working with the school's health center to screen any students or staff who may have been exposed. Health officials say the risk to the general public is very low.

2/21 Vacation Heart Health - In Other News- Vacation is good for your heart *and your soul. New research shows taking time off can actually improve your heart health. Doctors say the stress release lowers your risk for conditions like hypertension by more than 20 percent. So the next time your boss tries to deny a vacation-tell them your health is at stake.

2/23 Pet Allergies - let's face it. Allergies can be a big pain. Especially if you're an animal lover and you can't stop sneezing and wheezing when they're around. But there's new hope. Advances in testing are now getting more specific. W-c-n-c charlotte's Carolyn Bruck shows us how a new test can pinpoint the problem.

2/24 Coronavirus and social media - With the spread of the coronavirus comes the spread of something else... misinformation. But some of the biggest names in social media are trying to fight back. Let's connect the dots. There have been some pretty strange claims about this coronavirus on social media... everything from conspiracy theories about where it came from to bizarre cures that could probably kill you. A new study shows we eat less when we are alone- And People who had dinner with a group- Ate up to 50 percent more than if they were eating by themselves. But don't cancel those dinner plans yet. Doctors say overall- eating with friends and family is better for your *mental health.

2/26 Coronavirus Latest - this morning -- a new warning from the c-d-c about the coronavirus. Health officials say Americans should prepare for it to spread in the u-s -- as it

continues to spread from china into Europe. There are currently more than 50 confirmed cases in the u-s. The dow plunged for the second straight day in a row amid coronavirus fears.

2/27 Overtime Health Risks - coming up at five on "wake up charlotte" FOR MANY PEOPLE, WORKING OVERTIME IS ALL PART OF THE JOB. But the impact that could be having on your health... May far outweigh.. The added money you see on your paycheck. We'll explain why.

2/28 Latest Flu Numbers - flu season continues to claim lives in the Carolinas. Health officials say 15 people died from complications of the flu last week -- bringing the total to 115 flu deaths so far this season. The total number of confirmed flu cases *is* dropping -- after peaking the week of February 8th. We're still waiting on the latest numbers from south Carolina. That's your morning rush -- more news in less time.

2/29 WA State Coronavirus - two new cases of coronavirus...announced in Washington state...health officials say the cases are presumptive positives... Meaning the c-d-c will need to confirm the results. One patient is a king county woman in her fifties who recently travelled to south Korea... She is in home isolation. The other patients is a teen who had *not* recently traveled internationally... He is believed to have contracted the coronavirus in the community.

3/1 Lancaster 6 year old dead - a heartbreaking update this morning - officials say six-year-old jerrina horne of heath springs - who was hit Friday near her school bus stop-- died in the hospital. Authorities say she was hit on highway 521 Friday in Lancaster county around 6-30 in the morning. And died later that night at atrium health in charlotte. Troopers say a 39-year-old woman was driving a pickup truck when she hit horne. The first grader was reportedly holding her grandmother's hand and stepped out into the road when the accident happened. The grandmother told us she had bleeding in her stomach. "horne" was a student at heath springs elementary school.

3/2 Coronavirus - South Carolina's Governor will lay out plans to protect the state from the deadly coronavirus. He'll hold a meeting with the state's top health emergency official. They'll address the state's level of preparedness if the virus shows up in south Carolina. That meeting set for ten this morning. So far there have been no confirmed cases of the virus in the Carolinas.

School officials say the decision was made after consulting with health officials and colleagues in higher ed.

3/5 Trebek Update - Alex Trebek giving an update on his health 1 year after being diagnosed with stage 4 pancreatic cancer. He says there have been ups and downs-

But that he is taking his treatment one day at a time and plans to host the show as long as he is still able. Trebek says he is thankful to be alive-because only 18 percent of patients like him make it to the 1-year milestone.

3/6 Sports Medicine Clinic - in other healthcare news...Cotswold is getting a new location for folks to have orthopedic and sports-related health concerns addressed. 3/11 Shooting Investigation - breaking overnight -- c-m-p-d investigating a shooting that left two people injured. Police say two men with gunshot wounds arrived at 'atrium health university city hospital' just before 3 a-m. Officers are working to find out where the shooting happened.

3/12 JCSU Response - Johnson s smith university is working on a coronavirus plan in the event a student or staff member is infected. Enhanced cleaning is underway and additional hand sanitizer and soap dispensers have been installed. 2/28 Across the Carolinas - 25-year-old 'Jacob Lee' is charged with breaking into the home of an elderly couple and severely beating them. The attack happening last weekend in Southern Pines, North Carolina. Officials say Lee is a paratrooper in the 82nd Airborne -- and has been in the Army for three years. An animal shelter is currently out of service after a break-in. This happening in Anderson County, South Carolina. The robber took more than 20-thousand dollars worth of vaccines, medication, and equipment. Police arrested 'Russell Pray' in connection to the crime. A federal lawsuit wants to change the way sex education is taught in South Carolina. Right now -- it is against state law for public schools to mention anything other than heterosexual relationships -- unless discussing sexually transmitted diseases. The lawsuit says this prevents L-G-B-T-Q students from receiving proper sex education.

3/1 Jersey Mikes month of giving- today Jersey Mike's kicks off its '10th annual month of giving' fundraising campaign. Locations across the country are joining forces with 200 local charities... Including hospitals, youth organizations, food banks and more. The campaign culminates in the nationwide event, Day of Giving, on Wednesday, March 25th. 3/27 Meck Stay at home - Now here's a quick rundown of what we learned from officials today. Mecklenburg County's public health director Gibby Harris says: There are now 259 cases of COVID-19 in Mecklenburg County. She says 1 in 5 have been hospitalized. And that half of all reported cases are adults between 20 and 39 years old. She says the county still only has 2 cases in youth under 19 years old. And important to note -- Harris says positive cases are likely much higher. She says the virus is now so widespread -- the county is no longer mapping cases by zip code. She says the county is still NOT conducting widespread testing -- and she admits

there is capacity issues that are leading to delays in how long people are having to wait for their results. So as she's said before – health officials say anyone with mild symptoms should stay home and consult their doctor over the phone. If your symptoms are more severe – Harris is recommending you still call ahead.
