1. 2020 Vermont Farm Show Preview

2. NCVRC/Copley Hospital-"Recovery Coaches" Program

"Vermont Country Morning host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" in studio on February 21, 2020 (8:20-8:25 AM) with Michael Brigati, director of Emergency Services at Copley Hospital, and Daniel Franklin, assistant director of North Central Vermont Recovery Center, about their collaborative program to meet with people who have expressed interest in seeking treatment for addiction at NVRC while receiving medical treatment at Copley Hospital. "Recovery Coaching" is also available to family members or loved one affected by someone else's substance abuse.

3. Lamoille Neighbors

"Vermont Country Morning host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" in studio on February 4, 2020 (8:20-8:25 AM) with Gloria Wing and Joan Greene of the Lamoille County Civic Center about the newly formed "Lamoille Neighbors" program, a grassroots, non-profit membership organization made up of members who help each other access the services they need to stay independent and connected to the community. For example, the organization is able to connect a member to a vetted volunteer who can provide transportation, light home maintenance, technology assistance, friendly visits, meals when ill and other vital services.

4. Lamoille Restorative Center

"Vermont Country Morning host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" in studio on February 8, 2020 (8:20-8:25 AM) with Heather Hobart, executive director of the Lamoille Restorative Center in Hyde Park about upcoming events, including the $40^{\rm th}$ Anniversary celebration of Vermont's Court Diversion Program, and co-hosting the showing and discussion of film "Coming Home", a film about people returning to their community after spending time in prison

5. Healthy Lamoille County: "Bullying: A Family Discussion"

"Vermont Country Morning" host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" in studio on January 14, 2020 (8:20-8:25 AM) with Jessica Bickford, executive director of "Healthy Lamoille County" about the upcoming public event "Bullying: A Family Discussion." The discussion included a panel of local officials from Lamoille County Mental Health, Lamoille Restorative Center and local schools.
