### 1. LAMOILLE HEALTH PARTNERS

"Vermont Country Morning" host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" in studio on January 28 , 2021 (8:20-8:25 AM) with Stuart May, CEO of LAMOILLE HEALTH PARTNERS, about their health care services in the Lamoille Valley, including neurology, pediatrics, family medicine, and dentistry. The operation operates locations in Morrisville and Stowe.

### 2. CAPSTONE COMMUNITY ACTION

"Vermont Country Morning" host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" On January 6, 2021 (8:20-8:25 AM) with Alison Calderara, development director of CAPSTONE COMMUNITY ACTION in Morrisville about the "Fuel Your Neighbors" campaign which helps central Vermonters stay warm during the winter months. The campaign raises funds for those who may not be eligible for state programs that help provide heating and food assistance. The program also assists local food shelves in keeping quality food available to those in need.

### 3. COVID VACCINATIONS/COPLEY HOSPITAL

"Vermont Country Morning" host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" on March 4, 2021 (8:20-8:25 AM) with Ellen Hill (United Way of Lamoille County) and Teresa Snow, (Salvation Farms) about the upcoming "POLAR SPLASH" fundraiser. The money will help fund homegrown nourishment for the community and help complete the renovations to the historic barn that will keep good food from rotting on farms while providing good nutritious home grown food.

6. **Morrisville American Red Cross Blood Drive Campaign:**
