1. CAPSTONE COMMUNITY ACTION

WLVB'S Vermont Country Morning host Roland Lajoie spoke on July 21, 2021 from 8:20-8:25 AM with Greg Stafanksi and Ashley Brown of Capstone Community Action about the latest COVID numbers in Lamoille County, including the COVID vaccination rate, vaccination clinics available in the Lamoille Valley (encouraging listeners to vaccinate, and previewing Capstone information booth displays at the upcoming Lamoille County Field Days.

2. 2022 OLD FARMER'S ALMANAC PREVIEW

WLVB'S Vermont Country Morning host Roland Lajoie spoke on September 14, 2021 from 8:20-8:25 AM with Old Farmer's Almanac assistant editor Ben Kilbride, previewing the 2022 Old Farmer's Almanac. 5. LAMOILLE HEALTH PARTNERS (OVERDOSE AWARENESS MONTH)

WLVB'S Vermont Country Morning host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" in studio on August 31 2021 from 8:20-8:25 AM with Meagan Dewitt, Medication Assisted Treatment Team coordinator at Lamoille Health Partners focusing on "Overdose Awareness Day, the severity of the problem of Opioid overdoses in Vermont (higher than national rate), signs of opioid overdoses and ways to reach out to the MAT team for help.

6. LAMOILLE HOUSING PARTNERSHIP

WLVB'S Vermont Country Morning host Roland Lajoie spoke "live" in studio on August 17, 2021 from 8:20-8:25 AM with Jim Volinsky, executive director of Lamoille Housing Partnership about the Village Center Apartments construction, a 3-week construction projection outlook for folks adjacent to the Hutchins Street job site, where people can obtain additional about this project and information on other housing projects in Lamoille County to help with the current housing shortage.
