Date: July 3, 2016

Issue: How stress at work can affect family bonding. A new survey finds 48% of Americans say work stress negatively impacts their personal life, while 35% stress out about how much their job actually interferes with family time. Issue: Susquehanna Service Dogs. Susquehanna Service Dogs trains dogs to act as helpers to people with disabilities. They are trained by foster parents who go through training and help shape the dog to its owner's needs. Kerry is not only involved in the organization, but is also fostering Breeze. Issue: Men's Health and Chronic Migraines. Dr. Klein talked about men's health and "Bromance Day" coming up in August. This is a day when guys can finally drop the machismo and open up to each other about anything including their health. Health problems such as prostate cancer and erectile dysfunction are common, but are often not a topic of conversation for men. That means many men don't know when they should be screened or other information that could be helpful in treatments. Dr. Ashina and Lauri talked about the difference between a headache and a migraine as well as what treatments are available for people who experience chronic migraines.

Issue: Concussions & Kids. Dr. Osborn spoke about protecting kids from concussions. Many kids play sports and there are tens of thousands of them that sustain concussions. A concussion is a serious, traumatic brain injury, which usually has temporary effects but can lead to permanent damage such as chronic traumatic encephalopathy (CTE), a degenerative brain disease with symptoms similar to Alzheimer's. Issue: Sickle Cell. It's time for the 5th annual golf outing for the South Central PA Sickle Cell Council. Joe talked about the disease and how the Sickle Cell Council is helping to make more people aware of it. The Council works closely with the community to deal with the problems associated with the disease. The Council has a 3 person staff that covers 26 Pennsylvania counties.
