# January 1st through March 31st

This report focuses on the issues and programs facing the listening audience of WLKR-FM during the period of January 1<sup>st</sup>, 2024 through March 31<sup>st</sup>, 2024

WLKR-FM utilizes a mixture of live and pre-recorded programming – and monitors the news developments, local news media broadcasts and publications in Huron County and surrounding areas. #### JANUARY 2024 – WLKR FM

#### 1. <u>SAFETY/CRIME</u>

O1-02-24 A 26-year-old man is in jail for attempted murder following a shooting and standoff in Willard Monday morning. According to Norwalk Ohio News dot-com, Bernabe Ramos surrendered peacefully at a residence on South West Avenue after a near 2-hour standoff with police. It all started when a woman on Fink Street told authorities she had been shot in the leg and the male shooter fled the area and was still armed.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

O1-02-24 A Port Clinton man faces arson charges in connection with an historic school building blaze in November. According to the Sandusky Register, 69-year-old Gary Lisowski is due in court later this month. The fire took place November 23rd on Catawba Island at the historic District 2 school building on the corner of Crogan and East Porter Streets. No one was hurt, as the fire engulfed the building that was currently home to unoccupied apartments.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

01-02-24 The law enforcement task forces organized under the Ohio Organized Crime Investigations Commission confiscated more than \$63 million in illegal drugs in 2023, including a notable increase in cocaine. In 2023, the task forces also seized 400 firearms and \$5.4 million in currency.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

01-03-24 The motive is still unclear in a New Year's Day shooting incident in Willard. According to the Sandusky Register, law enforcement continues to investigate the incident that led to 26-year-old Bernabe Ramos being charged with attempted murder. A female victim on Fink Street was treated and released from the hospital after she reported to authorities that she had been shot in the leg. Ramos was involved in a standoff for around two hours at a residence on South West Avenue...eventually surrendering peacefully.

01-03-24 The State Highway Patrol has released its New Year's Holiday Report.

Six fatal crashes resulted in seven fatalities on Ohio's roadways during the 2023-2024 New Year's holiday. This is a decrease from the four-day reporting period last year when 13 fatalities were reported. This year's four-day reporting period ran Friday through Monday, New Year's Day.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-03-24 The Sandusky County Sheriff's Office will be using a state grant for extra patrol during the month of January. Overtime shifts will be scheduled in an attempt to promote safety among drivers, with an emphasis on impaired driving, speed enforcement, safety belt violations and distracted driving.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

O1-03-24 The state's Bureau of Investigation saw a similar volume of Law Enforcement Officer Use-of-Force Investigations in 2023 compared to a year ago. Local law enforcement agencies requested to investigate 58 incidents in 2023, one fewer than in 2022. In 2023, 40 individual law enforcement agencies submitted requests to investigate officer-involved shootings. While several law enforcement officers were shot, no officers died during officer-involved shootings in 2023.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

01-03-24 Fast times in Erie County...The State Highway Patrol says they pulled over a driver going 106 miles-per-hour in a 70 mile-per-hour speed limit zone. This took place on State Route 2 in Erie County last weekend. According to the Patrol, over 26,500 speed-related crashes happened on Ohio roadways in 2023.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-04-24 Three men are due in court this week after allegedly stealing a dirt bike and four-wheeler and damaging property. According to Norwalk Ohio News dot-com, 20-year-old Owen Kovach of Norwalk, 19-year-old Jeffrey Suto of Norwalk and Justin Reau of Akron all face criminal charges stemming from an apparent dispute over money from the sale of a car at a residence in Monroeville.

01-04-24 Local authorities report that multiple OVI arrests took place in Lorain County around the New Year. According to the State Highway Patrol and Lorain County Sheriff's Office, at least 10 arrests were made for driving while intoxicated. In the last 5 years, troopers have made more than 86,000 OVI arrests statewide.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-05-24 It's 8 to 11 years in prison for an Elyria man after pleading guilty to aggravated vehicular homicide, aggravated vehicular assault and vehicular assault and three counts of DUI. A mother of two, Kaylie Eskins, was killed in an alcohol-related crash involving 24-year-old Logan Townsley, who crashed his car into hers in March of 2022 in Elyria Township.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

O1-08-24 Authorities are looking into a reported breaking and entering at a Huron business. According to the Sandusky Register, it took place on December 29th at the Huron Market on Cleveland Road West. Police say the glass from the front doors was smashed out, with damage done to the cash registers. Nothing was taken from the register though.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-08-24 Six members of a violent crime ring in south Columbus have been indicted on a combined 124 felony charges, including murder and human trafficking, following an investigation. Those indicted range from male to female from 21 to 38 years of age from Columbus and Marysville.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

01-08-24 A dog was shot and killed during an Elyria man's arrest on Friday.

21-year-old Donte Colbert was arrested on an outstanding warrant in connection with an alleged shooting last year in Elyria. It happened on Melvyn Lane. Elyria Police say after the arrest, a neighbor opened their door and a pit bull charged them, with an officer discharging their weapon, killing the dog.

01-09-24 It's five years probation for a Huron man in connection with the theft of sports cards. According to the Sandusky Register, 41-year-old Jason Leibold pleaded guilty to writing multiple bad checks for over \$118,000. Leibold reportedly was provided boxes of sports cards by a Sandusky-based company, which Leibold sold investment stakes to investors, with Leibold's eight checks bouncing.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-09-24 A Wakeman man has been indicted on 71 felony charges, which include sexual crimes involving minors. According to Norwalk Ohio News dot-com, 52-year-old Dave Kodger will go to trial on March 6th in Huron County Common Pleas Court.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

01-09-24 A former Summit County lawmaker has been sentenced to community service and two years of probation. Republican State Representative Bob Young was convicted last fall of causing physical harm to his wife. Young resigned from his seat after being removed as a committee chair.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

01-09-24 26-year-old Bernabe Ramos of Willard has been indicted on multiple charges in connection with the alleged New Year's Day shooting of a woman in the leg that led to a police standoff.

Ramos, according to Norwalk Ohio News dot-com, faces charges including an attempt to commit an offense felony and felonious assault. The accused incident took place at a home on Fink Street, with Ramos later surrendering peacefully at a residence on South West Avenue in Willard.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

O1-10-24 Police in Elyria are looking into a shooting Monday night at Westway Gardens. Police say they found a man with a non-life-threatening gunshot wound after being called to the 1000 block of Melvyn Lane. The man was treated and released from the hospital.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

01-11-24 Vandalism at Edison High School...The school says the music van was vandalized over Christmas break. The school reports that someone with a silver SUV was seen

on camera removing the catalytic converter from the van during a school sporting event. Anyone with information is asked to contact the school or local police.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

O1-12-24 Body cam footage has been released from an incident where Elyria Police shot and killed a dog. In the incident, police had finished carrying out a warrant and arrest of a man at a home on Melvyn Lane when a neighbor opened the door and a pit bull ran towards an officer, with the officer firing multiple shots at the dog. The internal investigation of the incident found the officer's actions were justified in the situation as the officer felt threatened by the dog.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

01-15-24 It's a fourth-degree felony for a Milan woman indicted on a count of grand theft. According to the Sandusky Register, 38-year-old Tara Jones allegedly misused her role as a family member's power of attorney. Authorities say Jones misused the family member's finances for Amazon and Cedar Point purchases for her and her family; with a total of over \$47,000 allegedly stolen altogether.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

One dead, following a standoff in Grafton at Indian Hollow Reservation. It happened Friday night, after SWAT Team members were called to help Lorain County Metro Park Rangers at Sheldon Woods. The Lorain County Sheriff's Office says SWAT members talked to a person in a vehicle for several hours after the person had pointed a gun at a park ranger. According to the Sheriff's Office, the person in the vehicle eventually shot at SWAT members, with SWAT then shooting and killing the person.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

O1-16-24 Council in New London has given their approval to provide fire services to those in Clarksfield Township. The Norwalk Reflector reports that an ordinance was passed for the fire department to respond to emergency calls for non-contracting townships outside of the village. This comes as Clarksfield Township Trustees said they will not agree to fire service because a fire/township levy has been voted down by residents three times, leaving no money in the budget.

01-17-24 25 counts of felony sex offenses involving a minor for a 32-year-old Toledo man...The Sandusky Register reports that Corbin Kirchner will have a court arraignment later this month. The case against Kirchner was filed in Norwalk Municipal Court.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

01-17-24 The suspect in a triple-homicide in Willard was in court on Tuesday for a pre-trial hearing. According to the Norwalk Reflector, 26-year-old Zachary Boster and his attorney have been offered a plea deal, with Boster's attorney submitting a counter-offer. Boster is accused of stabbing to death 31-year-old Brandi Thorton, her unborn child and 13-year-old son in 2022 at a residence on South Myrtle Avenue in Willard.

Another court date has been set for next Tuesday, when we'll find out if the case goes to trial or a plea bargain has been accepted.

News Programming – approx 30 sec

01-17-24 It's life in prison for a 36-year-old Lorain man convicted of killing his ex-girlfriend more than two years ago. James Kimbrough the-third was sentenced yesterday, with a chance of parole after 31 years. Kimbrough was accused of shooting and killing Milenna Lopez as she sat in her car a McDonald's where she was the manager.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

No one was hurt in a house fire in Monroeville on Monday at the home of the Huron County Health Board president. According to Norwalk Ohio News dot-com, Jeremy Loose and his family should be able to return to their home on South Ridge Street after clean-up and restoration work is done. The cause of the blaze was narrowed down to a wood burner in the basement.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-18-24 Two hospitalized after a reported shooting at a bar near Willard on Tuesday...According to Norwalk Ohio News dot-com, the reported incident occurred at The Havana Tavern on Gregory Road. 24-year-old Kyle Vanderpool of Plymouth was sent to the Huron County Jail on two counts of felonious assault and using weapons while intoxicated in connection with the reported shooting. The Huron County Sheriff's Office said the two victims are expected to make a full recovery.

O1-19-24 A fire that killed one person in Bellevue is under investigation by the State Fire Marshal. According to the Sandusky Register, the blaze took place Sunday on County Road 219, with a person's remains found at the site of the fire. Authorities also found a burned job site trailer. A reported \$10,000 in property damage was done.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

O1-22-24 A Castalia man died in a single vehicle crash on Friday. Jeff Bauer was 59. The crash happened on Route 2, east of West Camp Perry in Erie Township in Ottawa County. The State Highway Patrol says Bauer ran off the right side of Route 2 and continued through a farm field, paintball range, and into a tree line. His vehicle struck many paintball range obstacles and two trees before coming to rest. Alcohol and/or drugs are not believed to be a factor in the crash.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

O1-22-24 The leader of a human trafficking ring that operated in central Ohio has been sentenced to 14 years in prison. 40-year-old Marcus Carmon pled guilty to charges of compelling prostitution, having weapons under disability and possession of drugs. Carmon also must register as a Tier II sex offender after his release from prison.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-22-24 The investigation continues into reported thefts and break-ins at the Fremont Airport. The Sandusky County Sheriff's Office says information received led to a search warrant on South Street in Fremont that resulted in the recovery of stolen items from the airport as well as stolen firearms and an ATV. Criminal charges are expected to follow.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-22-24 Bulldog Sports Cafe on Center Ridge Road in North Ridgeville was heavily damaged by a fire on Friday. No one was hurt in the blaze that has left the establishment unable to operate. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

O1-23-24 A Sandusky man was killed in a two-vehicle crash Monday morning in Milan Township. Michael Opfer was 60. According to the State Highway Patrol, Opfer was driving southbound on Route 250, just south of Route 113, and went left-of-center striking a vehicle driven by 36-year-old Shawn Martz of Norwalk. Martz was taken to the hospital with unknown injuries.

O1-23-24 A fire destroyed a home on Parkview Boulevard in Sandusky on Sunday. According to the Sandusky Register, no one was hurt, but a family dog died in the blaze. The cause of the fire is undetermined and is currently under investigation.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

A Sheffield man's appeal of his sentencing for killing his wife two years ago has been rejected by the 9th District Court of Appeals. 75-year-old Ronald Diamond is sentenced to life in prison without parole. Diamond had claimed that he shot his wife, 73-year-old Deborah Diamond, in their home on Preserve Lane to put an end to her pain, as she had a painful chronic illness. Diamond had argued that Lorain County Common Pleas Judge Chris Cook violated the purposes and principles of sentencing under Ohio law and violated Diamond's constitutional rights as well.

News Programming – approx 30 sec

01-23-24 20 people were rescued by the Coast Guard after being stuck on an ice floe Monday morning. It happened off of Catawba Island State Park. Everyone was brought safely ashore. No injuries were reported.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

A Norwalk woman charged in the death of her young son in a fire last June appeared in Huron County Common Pleas Court on Tuesday. According to the Sandusky Register, Dakota Rae Jones, who has pled not guilty, was in court for a pre-trial hearing. 8-year-old Wyatt Duchette died in the blaze at the home on East Main Street. Jones is due back in court for a final pre-trial hearing next month, with a jury trial scheduled to start February 28th.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

01-24-24 The Ohio State Highway Patrol is investigating a one-vehicle fatal crash that occurred last Friday morning. The crash happened on West Strub Road, west of Columbus Avenue, in Perkins Township. 66-year-old Ricardo Trevino was traveling southwest on West Strub Road where he failed to maintain control of his vehicle, went off the left side of the road, overturned, and struck a fire hydrant.

O1-24-24 A reminder to get your dog license from the Huron County Auditor's Office...Dog owners have one week (next Wednesday) to get their license to avoid a penalty charge. The fee per dog is \$18 for one year.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

01-25-24 A 3-year-old boy died in a house fire overnight in Sandusky. According to the Sandusky Register, the child's mother and 3 other children were able to make it out safely in the blaze at the home on Meigs Street. Major damage was also done to the home. The cause of the fire is under investigation.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-25-24

28-year-old Melvin Amaro of Cleveland has been charged with aggravated vehicular assault and other felonies in a fatal crash at Grove Avenue and Homewood Drive in Lorain in May of 2022. 21-year-old Arabella Yungmann of Lorain has also been charged with aggravated vehicular homicide and other felonies in an alleged hit-and-run incident on North Abbe Road in Elyria last July where a pedestrian later died from their injuries.

Two charged in separate Lorain County fatal crashes...

News Programming - approx 25 sec

O1-25-24 An Overdose Spike Alert has been issued for Huron County. The Huron County Board of Mental Health and Addiction Services says that 3 overdose incidents have taken place in the last 24 hours. Free naloxone or 'Narcan' can be picked up at a number of locations including Huron County Public Health and Mercy Health Willard Hospital.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

O1-26-24 A Plymouth man accused of shooting two people at a Willardarea bar is due in court today. According to the Sandusky Register, 24-year-old Kyle Vanderpool faces a preliminary hearing. Authorities say one of the two victims shot at the Havana Tavern 10-days ago is still in the hospital, while the other has been treated and released. Vanderpool has been charged with two counts of felonious assault.

O1-26-24 A Lorain man died in a dirt bike crash Wednesday night. Sandalio Rodriguez was 22. Police say Rodriguez crashed his dirt bike into the side of an unoccupied police cruiser while authorities were serving arrest warrants at Homewood Drive and Meadow Lane in Lorain. The crash marks the first traffic-related fatality of 2024 in Lorain.

O1-27-24 Criminal charges in Erie County for a man from North Olmstead...According to the Sandusky Register, 36-year-old Alex Serrano faces charges of felonious assault, kidnapping, and aggravated burglary. The charges are in connection with a reported incident at a Campbell Street home in Sandusky in 2022. Serrano is accused of holding a knife to a woman and assaulting her.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-29-24 A Sandusky pedestrian was killed after being struck by a train on Saturday. According to the Sandusky Register, the 32-year-old man was hit by the train west of Hayes Avenue and near North Depot Street. The name of the man has not yet been released.

News Programming – approx 15 sec

01-29-24 A 19-year-old Elyria man faces charges after being accused of robbing a gas station at gunpoint a month ago. Jaden Pollard is charged with aggravated robbery, carrying a concealed weapon and obstructing official business. The reported incident took place at the Valero gas station on East Avenue in Elyria. No one was hurt.

News Programming - approx 20 sec

01-29-24 Criminal charges in Erie County for a man from North Olmstead...

According to the Sandusky Register, 36-year-old Alex Serrano faces charges of felonious assault, kidnapping, and aggravated burglary. The charges are in connection with a reported incident at a Campbell Street home in Sandusky in 2022. Serrano is accused of holding a knife to a woman and assaulting her.

01-30-24 The victim of Saturday's fatal train/pedestrian incident in Sandusky has been identified. According to the Sandusky Register, 32-year-old Robert Bagley was struck by a train at the tracks west of Hayes Avenue, near Depot Street. Authorities say Bagley appeared to be walking over the tracks when he was hit.

News Programming – approx 20 sec

01-30-24 A Plymouth man accused of shooting two people in a Willardarea bar has been indicted on multiple charges. The Norwalk Reflector reports that 24-year-old Kyle Vanderpool faces charges including felonious assault and attempting to commit an offense. One victim has been released from the hospital, while the other remains hospitalized. The incident occurred two weeks ago at The Havana Tavern on Gregory Road.

News Programming – approx 25 sec

O1-31-24 A \$900,000 settlement from the Ohio attorney general's office is possibly headed to the family of a Norwalk man who had his murder conviction tossed out by a judge after he spent 20-plus years in prison. The Plain Dealer reports that the settlement is going to the daughters of James Parsons, who was convicted in 1981 of killing his wife. Parsons died in 2017 at the age of 79 after a judge tossed out the conviction, but before a new trial was held. The reason for the lawsuit was due to accused wrongdoing involving forensic analysis. A probate judge in Erie County must still approve the settlement.

O1-31-24 A Monroeville man and former Fremont police officer was back in court this week. The Norwalk Reflector reports that Cage Roby had a pretrial hearing. A jury trial is planned for March in connection with charges of sexual battery and pandering sexually oriented material involving a minor or impaired person, which Roby has pleaded not guilty to. He's due back in court in two weeks.
