WQUE-FM provides its listeners with programming and public service announcements that address issues of concern to our local community. Among the issues determined to be of most concern to the community during the preceding calendar quarter were:

- **CHARITABLE:** United Way's annual meeting, which includes a celebration of "wins" and recognition of the area's most generous workplace, highest participation in the work place giving campaign
 - **EDUCATION:** Efforts to increase STEM education across the area, including an event called Stem Fest, which highlights education and carrers in the math and science fields
 - **FAMILY SERVICES:** April is Natl Child Abuse Prevention Month. CASA provides advocates who represent the needs of abused and neglected children in court. Volunteers are always needed
 - **FINANCES:** With the end of tax preparation season approaching the United Way is operating centers offering free tx help around the city called VITA sites. Emphasis on helping filers determine if they qualify for the Earned Income Tax Credit
 - **HOMELESSNESS:** New organization called Make Change NOLA, which stresses helping the city's large homeless population in responsible ways, such as donating to shelters like the New Orleans Mission
 - **POVERTY:** Symposium entitled Economics of Investing in American's Workforce. Event is hosted by the Federal Reserve Bank and includes a panel on poverty's impact on the work force
 - **SAFETY:** The guests are from the New Orleans Recreation Dept and the YMCA. With summer here water safety becomes an important issue. Drowning is the 5th most common cause of accidental death
 - **VOLUNTEERING:** Volunteer campaign in conjunction with city's Tricentennial celebration. This is a major volunteer effort called "3,000 for the next 300". Goal is to get 3,000 volunteers to participate in service projects across the city
