## Section I. Issues

The stations have identified the following topics as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- A. HEALTH Physical health and disease were our most covered topics as the New Year began. We discussed tackling pathogens, heart health, Alzheimer's, Menthol cigarette's effects on black Americans, COPD, and sleep disorders. We also saluted health care workers.
- B. **FINANCE –** Finance was a big topic. We talked about credit debt, how to achieve good credit, taxes in the new year, proper budgeting, inflation, and medical debt with assistance available.
- C. **CRIME/SECURITY –** We focused on political power and crime, civil rights, civil liberties, cyber security and staying safe online, and building a personal security plan.
- D. **MENTAL HEALTH –** We addressed alcoholism, family care giving and its mental stress, and gaslighting in a marriage and its effects on the family.
- E. **HOUSING –** We covered the city's programs to create more affordable housing and grant programs available to do so.
