VOTING AND ELECTIONS

January: We started the year talking about new laws that could impact folks. We covered new mayors taking office. We also covered the new poll showing Trump with a lead over Biden. We had a preview of the primary election and what people could expect. We had coverage when Trump got his name back on the Colorado ballot. We covered the lead up to the Iowa Caucus. We also provided coverage on the changes to NC voting law. We provided extension coverage as President Biden made his first visit to North Carolina in a year. We alerted viewers to the beginning of absentee voting. We were live as voting officials discussed changes to the voting laws. We had full covered of the New Hampshire primary. We broke the story when Raleigh's mayor responded to a challenge from the former state treasurer. We covered First Lady Jill Biden's visit to Raleigh for a fundraiser. We also covered challenges to new voting maps.

February: We started off the month with coverage of the South Carolina primary: big wins for Biden and Trump. We had coverage as election officials made a push to register people to vote. We covered the Supreme court hearing on arguments over Trump appearing on certain ballots. We altered viewers to the end of voter registration. We were live as the first votes were cast in the North Carolina primary. We covered Trump's rally in North Carolina. We provided coverage as students marched to the polls. We were live as Kamala Harris made a stop in Raleigh. We had a report on uncommitted voters and who they might be leaning towards.

March: We had an extensive look at key races voters would see on their ballots. We went in depth on Super Tuesday and the impact to the country. We dived into voter turnout and what it means to the results. We had extensive coverage of the hotly contested race for governor. We provided in -depth coverage of the president's state of the union address. We broke a story about the RNC chair stepping down. We were live as President Biden and the VP visited Raleigh together. We had coverage about the shortage of poll workers. We broke the story that Biden and Trump would be their party's nominees.

January: In January we alerted viewers that Hospitals were putting restrictions in place as RSV numbers spiked. We also covered the rise of covid cases right after the New Year. We talked about what people should do if they are diagnosed with RSV. We covered local hospitals as many returned to masking amid higher respiratory viruses. We provided coverage as pediatric RSV cases jumped. We covered a spike in Flu Death in January. We provided context to health crisis, comparing it to the pandemic. We reported on a meeting to highlight responses to any future pandemics. We reported on a spread of measles. We covered a report showing covid spiking in wastewater but not leading to any more hospitalizations.

February: In February, we covered where covid and RSV cases stand after one month into the year. We also covered how children with long form covid are recovering. We alerted viewers to a sudden spike in flu deaths as flu season appeared to be waning. We covered the CDC update that older people should get an additional dose of the vaccine.

March: Big news from the CDC to start the month. They dropped the five-day isolation guidance for positive covid tests. As RSV numbers dropped, local hospitals dropped visitor restrictions. We went in depth on how hospitals have changed 4 years after covid.

January: We alerted viewers to driver's ed changes that require new drivers to have more time behind the wheel. We covered the implementation of a new parents bill of rights. We did a study that showed more parents are letting their kids skip school. We covered a rise in mental health issues for students after the holidays. We did a story on a teacher who had a heart attack in the classroom. We covered the ongoing search for qualified school bus drivers. We alerted viewers to a growing financial crisis at St. Augustine's university. We also covered renovations to Cumberland Co. schools. We covered the centennial celebration of Duke University. We did a story on record enrollment for a local community college. We covered the launch of a new Girls Flag Football league. We had extensive coverage of the departure of UNC's chancellor for Michigan State. We announced the new partnership between a local school district and community college. We also covered a settlement between the state's largest school district and the makers of popular vaping products. We broke the news about a pay dispute between Durham Schools and some employees were overpaid. We did a story when new warrants were released about a murder on UNC's campus. We did a story about the governor going back to his Elementary to announce new education funding. We covered wake county's plan to require clear bags at all sporting events. We did extensive coverage on the impact of bomb threats at local schools. We also covered a spike in hate crimes at local colleges.

February: We covered the first day on the job for new Orange County Superintendent. We covered the ongoing pay dispute in Durham public schools and the impact as employees are not showing up for work. We did a story on a school resource officer that was killed in a car crash. We broke the story as a building on NC state was closed after a dangerous chemical was found. We also covered the announcement of a new superintendent for Wake Schools. We continued

our coverage of financial problems at a local HBCU and the plan to move classes to virtual. We did extensive coverage of a rise of threats against schools on social medial. We did a story on how AI is helping with mental health in schools. We covered changes to private school vouchers. We also covered the nationwide shortage of substitute teachers. We did an in-depth report on unique jazz program at NCCU. We covered the hearings over a 25-year-old case to bring equity to NC schools. We alerted viewers to new rules allowing for Natural hair at schools. We broke the story about DPS employees getting an 11% raise in their fight to keep raises that were made in error. We covered the story involving a popular teacher killed in a car crash. We covered talks to add panic button inside schools. We covered a breaking story about St. Augustine's losing accreditation.

March: We covered the start of Wake County's new policy of clear bags at sporting events. We had extensive coverage as St. Augustine's University continues its fight to regain accreditation. We had information about at job fair for Johnston Co. Schools. We covered a meeting about changes to bell schedule. We also covered the ongoing effort to resolve pay issues in Durham schools. We provided coverage when St. Augustine's alumnae called for resignation of the University's board. We covered the call for gun safety by public school officials.

COMMUNITY EVENTS/PROJECTS

January

ABC11 served as the media sponsor for the MLK Day of Service: Dream Big Book Drive, organized by Book Harvest, a non-profit organization that collects new or gently used books to give to children to build home libraries.

ABC11 led a partnership with the American Red Cross, to host a blood drive to help with the low blood supply and encourage people of color to give to increase the chance of bone marrow donation matches

February

ABC 11 produced and aired a series of Black History Vignettes featuring African American trailblazers.
