Programming frequently deals with more than one issue. In order to meet these issues, WTBV-FM airs two public affairs programs on Sunday mornings as well as weekday news updates.

"Sunday Morning" airs at 6:00am.

WTBV-FM also helps meet community issues through daily programming. As traffic and transportation are often major issues for residents of Tampa Bay, WTBV-FM airs traffic reports four times hourly on weekdays from 6:00 to 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 to 6:00 p.m.

WTBV-FM also runs a heavy schedule of :60 second Public Service Announcements produced by the Florida Association of Broadcasters throughout all hours of the day.
