7:00/8:00	2-Oct-18	Centra announced a change in leadership at the hospital yesterday. E.W. Tibbs officially resigned as CEO after submitting his resignation last week. Senior Vice President and COO Michael Elliot will serve as interim CEO as the board of directors' searches for new leadership nationwide which should take around 6-9 months.
6:30/7:30/8:30	2-Oct-18	The Virginia Department of Motor Vehicles will start offering residents the option to upgrade their driver's licenses to meet federal requirements that will affect plane travel. Beginning in October 2020, noncompliant IDs won't be sufficient for boarding a plane or entering military bases. You can get the new IDs now, just apply in person. There is a \$10 surcharge, as well as standard fees.

West Virginia was on the top of the list for deer related accidents, and Virginia is ranked 12th out of the 50 states. AAA provides the following safe driving tips for you if you do have to go out.

Watch for black ice which will be a little darker and duller than the rest of the road surface. Drive, turn, and brake slowly. Adjust your speed to the road conditions and leave yourself plenty of room to stop. Control the skid. If you are approaching a patch of ice, brake during your approach. Applying pressure to your brakes while on ice will only throw you into a skid. In the event you find your car is skidding, ease off of the accelerator or brake, and steer in the direction you want the front of the car to go.

Some more tips include guard against SUV overconfidence. Four-wheel-drive vehicles are great for initial traction and avoiding getting stuck, but once they are moving, they have the same difficulty keeping control and stopping as other vehicles. Never use cruise control. Cruise control is not recommended when ice is on the road as the driver should be in full control of the vehicle at every second. Finally Drive in cleared lanes. Changing lanes unnecessarily puts you at greater risk of hitting a patch of ice between lanes that may cause you to lose control of the vehicle.

Governor Northam has declared a state of emergency for Virginia because of the snow storm. The state of emergency ensures that localities and communities have appropriate assistance and allows them to coordinate state response to possible snow and ice accumulations, transportation issues, and potential power outages. The Executive Order for this storm became effective Friday and will stay in effect until January 6, 2019 or until it is amended.

7:00/8:00	10-Dec-18	The latest forecast models also indicate higher snowfall amounts than previously expected for Danville and the southside. A total snow accumulation of 10 to 12 inches is likely but could range as high as 18 inches in spots. You might still be seeing flurries this morning if you have to commute to work.
