A letter sent out by the Central Shenandoah Health District warns that cases of hand, foot and mouth disease have elevated in recent weeks. The viral illness infects children up to age 5, and symptoms include fever, fatigue, a rash in the mouth, or on the palms or soles, and sometimes painful sores
News	7:00/8:00	The federal government is spending \$750,000 to help bring new nonstop flights to the Roanoke-Blacksburg Regional Airport. The new flights would be to Dallas/Ft. Worth, Denver, and/or Detroit. Negotiations will start with three different airlines: American, Delta and United. If the airport is successful in negotiating with these airlines, flights could begin within six months.
News	7:00/8:00	A Virginia-class attack submarine that played a role in Syria back in April is back in Norfolk. The USS John Warner fired six Tomahawk missiles from the Mediterranean Sea during the strikes. While deployed, the John Warner traveled more than 30,000 nautical miles.
News	6:30/7:30/8:30	This last fiscal year Virginia collected \$550 million more than expected. The surplus was due to increases in income tax payments, along with a strong stock market and a boost in federal defense spending. Lawmakers have already set aside the surplus to replenish the state's rainy day fund.

The school announced they received donations and pledges that totaled \$18.4 million. \$13 million of those funds are being used for the current fiscal year. The state has already paid more than \$6 million in legal fees related to the cases. The bacteria can make people ill if they eat raw or under cooked shellfish or if an open cut comes into contact with the contaminated water. Nine people in Virginia have reported illnesses from this bacteria and although it is rare for a serious infection to occur people should take the risk seriously.
News	6:30/7:30/8:30	If you are worried about your child's car seat being installed properly then you can have it checked by the experts. Roanoke Fire-EMS is holding a child safety seat check today. Stop by Fire Station 6 on Jamison Avenue between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. to have yours checked.
News	6:30/7:30/8:30	The Downtown Lynchburg Association is seeking volunteers. The City of Lynchburg is hosting its 10th annual Get Downtown event on September 7 from 6 to 10 p.m. Those who participate will receive a free Downtown Lynchburg Association t-shirt.
News	7:00/8:00	It's been a busy summer for water rescues in Newport News. Officials say so far this year, crews have already responded to 29 calls on the water. Legally, if you go out on a boat you're required to have one life jacket available for every person on board. Officials are urging people even if you know how to swim, you should have a life jacket on in case of an emergency.
News	7:00/8:00	The City of Danville is considering not to fill vacant city positions, like police and fire, along with closing one of the city's seven fire stations in order to save money. According to a recent report the city is facing a projected deficit of \$22 million over the next 5 years. They say closing one fire station alone would save the city \$2.4 million dollars.
	6:30/7:30/8:30	A U.S. guided-missile destroyer that targeted chemical weapons facilities in Syria is returning to its home port in Virginia today. The USS Laboon is scheduled to arrive at Naval Station Norfolk with a crew of more than 300 sailors.
	7:00/8:00	The city of Roanoke wants your opinion as it launches a new comprehensive plan for the future. City leaders want to know what you want to see in the Star City over the next 20 years and want your help to identify Roanoke's strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and challenges. To get feedback, officials are holding public meetings and asking you to complete a survey on their new website.

6:30/7:30/8:30	23-Jul-18	Local officials in a central Virginia county say a giant Confederate flag visible from Interstate 64 has to come down because it violates a zoning ordinance. The Virginia Flaggers, which installed Confederate flags across the state, put the flag up in March. The flaggers said that it was a monument and therefore exempt from the ordinance. However the Louisa County Board of Zoning Appeals denied a petition to leave the flag in place.
6:30/7:30/8:30		By 2020, the open land off route 11 will be the home to the new Pulaski County Middle School. The new school will feature modern, state of the art educational tools and will take students from both Dublin middle and the current Pulaski middle school.
6:30/7:30/8:30		Busch Gardens Williamsburg's Escape From Pompeii ride will be closed indefinitely after a fire on the ride's roof Saturday night. Luckily the ride was not operating at the time of the fire and there were no park guests in the area at the time. There is currently no estimated time for it to reopen.
7:00/8:00	23-Jul-18	As a result of the increase in motorcycle fatalities last year, several Virginia state troopers are working with the Ride to Save Lives program to help lower the numbers. The program offers riders tips on ways to better control their motorcycle in hopes of reducing crashes. Virginia Police said so far, the safety program is working.
7:00/8:00	23-Jul-18	Virginia Private College Week kicks off today. Private colleges across the commonwealth will hold campus tours and information sessions about admissions, financial aid and academic programs. Private College Week runs through Saturday.
7:00/8:00	23-Jul-18	Listen up hikers! Evans Park just opened up to the public in Danville. The trails are three to four miles long and the park sits on over 100 acres of land. The hike takes you through a very secluded area that goes by a creek, visitors to the park have said that it is very peaceful.
6:30/7:30/8:30	24-Jul-18	Pepperidge Farm is voluntarily recalling four varieties of its Goldfish snacks after the company was told that an ingredient in its seasoning may contain salmonella. The products were distributed throughout the country, but no illnesses have been reported yet.

6:30/7:30/8:30	Smithfield Foods is closing the last smokehouse that creates the genuine Smithfield ham, that's been in the Virginia town for over 50 years. State law requires that a Smithfield ham is cured in the town, in order to be called a "genuine Smithfield ham". Well, when Smithfield Foods, was purchased five years ago by the Chinese not all their hams were cured in the town. So whether the company will build a new smokehouse, seek a change in state law, or simply abandon the "genuine Smithfield" name is a matter of local speculation.
6:30/7:30/8:30	The Botetourt County Board of Supervisors holds a public hearing about money for Colonial Elementary School construction. Earlier this year, the county announced it would replace the nearly 80-year-old school. The board could vote to give over \$22 million dollars to the project.
7:00/8:00	Roanoke police arrested the man they say shattered the front door to Senator Mark Warner's downtown Roanoke office. Thankfully, no one was in the office at the time. James Trainor, faces one count of property damage. Congressmen Morgan Griffith and Bob Goodlatte both reached out to Senator Mark Warner offering their support.
7:00/8:00	Boaters in Virginia Beach are having big concerns about the Lynnhaven River. Over the years sand has built up in the channel, creating a dangerous situation. At low tide the water level can drop to about a foot and a half. This winter the Army Corps will spend \$1 million dollars doing a full-scale dredge to put the sand back on the nearby beaches. The hope is to get the water level back to 9 feet.
7:00/8:00	The Virginia Museum of Transportation is holding a volunteer open house tonight. If you are looking for a place to volunteer stop by between 5:30 and 7:30pm and meet the staff to learn about what you can do there.
6:30/7:30/8:30	Virginia Beach and much of the region have been hit hard by on and off rain showers over the past several days. Due to the recent flooding Virginia Beach is opened up a shelter at Landstown High School yesterday. Residents who go there are asked to bring their own food, medicine, bedding and entertainment for children. Bottled water and medical supervision will be provided, pets are not allowed.

The grant requirements have also been modified in an attempt to make hiring officers easier. The maximum amount of funding per job has also increased, from \$50,000 to \$70,000 dollars for school resource officers, that are certified law enforcement officials, and from \$22,000 to \$35,000 for a security officer.

6:30/7:30/8:	30 26-Jul-17	The Virginia zoo is continuing to investigate possible sightings of a red panda that escaped more than a year ago in Norfolk. They have received reports of at least three recent sightings of Sunny. Sunny escaped the zoo in January 2017 and her thick coat of fur would have kept her warm during the winter, while she could have lived off local vegetation. If she is still alive the zoo hopes to get her back soon.

7:00/8:00	An explosion near Martinsville at a Patrick County manufacturing plant sent three people to the hospital. It's still unknown what caused the explosion at Thomas Industrial Fabrication. The Virginia Department of Labor is investigating the cause of the explosion.
7:00/8:00	The aviary at Lynchburg's Miller Park reopens today. It was built in 1902 and recently was renovated to improve the floor structure and increase the amount of weight the building can bare. The aviary has been used for many purposes in the last 116 years, including a library, office space, garden center and wedding venue. A ribbon cutting takes place this morning at 10:30 a.m.
6:30/7:30/8:30	Major upgrades are coming to River Ridge Mall in Lynchburg. Rescue teams have been pleading with people to get out of harm's way and Police officers have gone door to door. Authorities are warning that the Cape Fear River in Cumberland County will crests today at 62 feet and it will threaten to wipe out anything within a mile on either side of it.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/18/2018 The City of Danville has declared a local state of emergency ahead of the potential flooding of the Dan River. The river is expected to crest at about 25 feet this afternoon. Because the flood projections were lowered, Danville is only expecting moderate flooding. The local state of emergency remains in place through the evening as water levels will continue to rise.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/18/2018 As of 4 p.m. yesterday, Roanoke Country is no longer under a local state of emergency. County officials say that while more rainfall is expected, any high water in local rivers and streams should subside. Declaring a state of emergency would have allowed the county to have immediate access to additional resources, such as equipment and personnel, if they were needed.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/18/2018 In the aftermath of Hurricane Florence yesterday, a few areas had tornado warnings. There are thousands of power outages being reported this morning and one person lost their life. The National Weather Service reports at least nine tornadoes were reported in Richmond yesterday. Halifax County, and Charlotte county also experience a warning, but there was not one spotted on the ground.
7:00/8:00	9/18/2018 Many residents are anxious to return to their homes and begin the clean-up process, however the dangers associated with Florence didn't end when the weather cleared. Dangling power lines, flooding and other hazards remain. Survivors should make a cleanup kit that includes rubber gloves, cleaning products, sponges, goggles, rubber boots, trash bags, hydrogen peroxide, bandages, antibiotic ointments and work towels before returning home.
7:00/8:00	9/18/2018 A support team from Sentara Healthcare in Hampton Roads is heading down to Kinston, North Carolina to help staff a mobile, field hospital for Hurricane Florence relief efforts. The team of 21 will split into two teams and work 12-hour shifts before returning to Hampton Roads on Thursday. The group is responding to a request from the North Carolina Department of Emergency Management to relieve exhausted hospital teams in their community.

7:00/8:00	9/18/2018 Authorities are finally got food to the town of Wilmington yesterday, after having been completely cut off by flood waters. 32 people have now lost their lives from Florence, and crews are still using helicopters and boats to rescue people trapped by still-rising rivers. By midday yesterday authorities reopened a single road into the town, but it isn't clear if that the route will remain open as the Cape Fear River keeps swelling.
7:00/8:00	9/18/2018 Two people had to be rescued when their SUV got stuck in rising waters in Virginia Beach. The driver was trying to turn around from a flooded portion of the road when the SUV got stuck in a ditch hidden by the water. Flooding has been reported throughout Virginia Beach and waters are expected to rise as winds continue to blow in around the Back Bay area. They urge drivers to stay off roads around the area until waters subside.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/19/2018 Handouts of food and water began yesterday in the town of Wilmington as items have been brought into the city by big military trucks and helicopters. Residents who were evacuated from the hardest-hit areas have been asked to stay away because of closed roads and flooding that has submerged entire communities. Wilmington's Governor is urging residents to be patient.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/19/2018 Devastating flooding in North Carolina in the aftermath of Hurricane Florence has raised concerns about whether dams across the state, will be able to hold up. 7:00/8:00	9/19/2018 The Governor will be in southside later today. The Martinsville-Henry County Economic Development Corporation says there will be a major announcement. It's this afternoon at 2:30 at the Henry County Administration Building.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/20/2018 President Donald Trump arrived in North Carolina yesterday to take in the devastation left by Florence. While speaking with the people effected he offered comforting words to families. The President also took a moment to assist church volunteers with handing out supplies. President Trump has pledged the complete support of the federal government and his Administration to recovery efforts in North Carolina.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/20/2018 Monogram Food Solutions is investing \$30 million to expand in Henry County. Governor Ralph Northam was in the county and made the announcement yesterday. This investment will create 300 new jobs to expand its manufacturing operation, Monogram Snacks, in Henry County.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/20/2018 Several roads remain closed in Virginia Beach ahead of a wind shift that is expected to recede the floodwaters. Flooding has been an issue this week in areas like Sandbridge. Several major roadways were still closed in the southeastern part of the state, but the high water is expected to slowly subside throughout the day due to a wind shift.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/20/2018 Access has improved to Wilmington, North Carolina which was previously cut off for days by high water. The National Weather Service survey teams confirmed six tornadoes around the Richmond area. The Elon EF-3 tornado was one of the four strongest tornadoes so far in 2018. Virginia has now surpassed Oklahoma for number of tornados to date this year.

	Parks in Danville are beginning to reopen after much of the city flooded. The Riverwalk Trail reopened is open now with signs to warn people of mud hazards. Anglers Park and Dan Daniel Memorial Park are set to reopen at 7:00 a.m. today.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/21/2018 Duke Energy activated a high-level emergency alert at a retired coal-fired power plant in North Carolina as floodwaters from the nearby Cape Fear River overtopped the facility. Coal ash contains arsenic, mercury and other toxic metals, so there is a rick for pollution. However, the company does not believe any coal ash is at risk of spilling from the site amid the current flooding.
6:30/7:30/8:30	9/21/2018 Sailors aboard the guided-missile destroyer USS (MITCH-ER) Mitscher deployed on a 7 month operation yesterday from Naval Station Norfolk. Navy officials say the primary mission is to help with operations in the Middle East and Europe. The Mitscher was one of numerous ships based in Hampton Roads that were ordered to leave port last week ahead of Hurricane Florence.

Department of Environmental Quality said its inspectors have been unable to visit the hardest hit areas or collect samples of the flood water for lab testing. About 3.4 million chickens and turkeys and 5,500 hogs have been killed in flooding from Florence. The main concern is coal ash and animal waste.

In that debate candidates will address foreign policy issues.

North Caroline Governor Roy Cooper said nine of the state's river gauges are at major flood stage and four others are at moderate stage. Parts of Interstates 95 and 40 will remain underwater for another week or more and emergency management officials said residents whose homes were damaged or destroyed will begin moving into hotel rooms next week.
