Tejano Health 101 Interview: Cervical Health Awareness Month Nearly 14,100 women in the United States received a diagnosis of cervical cancer and nearly 4,300 died from the disease last year. Increasing screening and prevention are key components of the effort to eradicate cervical cancer. Since almost all cases of the disease are caused by human papillomavirus (HPV) infection, vaccines that protect against the virus could prevent the vast majority of cases. Moreover, regular Pap tests can catch – and lead to the treatment of – the disease at the precancerous stage. Cervical cancer is among a number of cancers that can be caused by infections with pathogens – bacteria, viruses, and parasites. Women should start getting Pap tests at age 21. Women ages 30 to 65 years have three options. Talk to your doctor about which testing option is right for you. An HPV test only. If your result is normal, your doctor may tell you that you can wait five years until your next screening test. · An HPV test along with the Pap test. If both of your results are normal, your doctor may tell you that you can wait five years until your next screening test. · A Pap test only. If your result is normal, your doctor may tell you that you can wait three years until your next Pap test. If you're older than 65, your doctor may tell you that you don't need to be screened anymore if you have had normal screening test results for several years and you have not had a cervical precancer in the past, or you have had your cervix removed as part of a

total hysterectomy for non-cancerous conditions, like fibroids. HPV Vaccine The HPV vaccine protects against the types of HPV that most often cause cervical cancers. HPV can also cause other kinds of cancer in both men and women. · HPV vaccination is recommended for preteens aged 11 to 12 years but can be given starting at age 9. · HPV vaccine also is recommended for everyone through age 26 years, if they are not vaccinated already. · HPV vaccination is not recommended for everyone older than age 26 years. However, some adults age 27 through 45 years who are not already vaccinated may decide to get the HPV vaccine after speaking with their doctor about their risk for new HPV infections and the possible benefits of vaccination. HPV vaccination in this age range provides less benefit, as more people have already been exposed to HPV. HPV vaccination prevents new HPV infections but does not treat existing infections or diseases. This is why the HPV vaccine works best when given before any exposure to HPV. You should get screened for cervical cancer regularly, even if you received an HPV vaccine. A heart attack, also known as a myocardial infarction, happens when the flow of blood that brings oxygen to a part of your heart muscle suddenly becomes blocked. Your heart can't get enough oxygen. If blood flow is not restored quickly, the heart muscle will begin to die. 2. Cardiac arrest occurs when the heart suddenly and unexpectedly stops pumping. If this happens, blood stops flowing to the brain and other vital organs. 3. A stroke happens when blood flow to the brain is blocked. This prevents the brain from getting oxygen and nutrients from blood. Without oxygen and nutrients, brain cells begin to die within minutes. A stroke is also called a transient ischemic attack or cerebrovascular accident. Symptoms of Heart Disease · Heart attack: Chest pain or discomfort, upper back or neck pain, indigestion, heartburn, nausea or vomiting, extreme fatigue, upper body discomfort, dizziness, and shortness of breath. Arrhythmia: Fluttering feelings in the chest (palpitations). · Heart failure: Shortness of breath, fatigue, or swelling of the feet, ankles, legs, abdomen, or neck veins. 1. Heart Health Topics a. Move More- You can choose simple activities you really enjoy — or find ways to add more movement to things you have to do anyway. b. Eat Health- You can start with small changes that work for you to experience benefits like boosting your immunity, strengthening your bones, and helping your digestive system function. c. Control Blood Pressure- Get your blood pressure checked and cut back on sodium (salt). d. Manage Cholesterol- A doctor can tell you what your cholesterol levels are, and there are plenty of small steps you can take to keep it in check. e. Manage Blood Sugar- It's important for everyone to be aware of blood sugar and take steps to keep it in a healthy range f. Stress Less-You can't always control the things that stress you out. Tejano Health 101 Interview: Children's Dental Health Month This year's NCDHM campaign slogan is "Brush, Floss, Smile" In their 2021 State of Little Teeth Report, The American Academy of Pediatric Dentistry (AAPD) examined the epidemic of tooth decay among children. Check out the following key stats from the Report: Tooth decay is the NUMBER ONE chronic infectious disease affecting children in the United States and is on the rise, but it is largely preventable. The rate of tooth decay in baby teeth of children aged 2 to 5 years increased nearly 17% from 1988-1994 to 1999-2004. By age 5 about 60% of children will be affected by tooth decay. · Children with oral health problems are THREE TIMES more likely to miss school due to dental pain than children with no oral health problems. · AAPD recommends taking a child for their first dental visit by the age of 1. Delaying dental care to age 2 or 3 can have a negative impact on a child's oral health. 40% of parents and caregivers surveyed are delaying their child's first visit until after age 2. Healthy Smile Tips: 1. Brush your teeth 2 times a day with fluoride toothpaste 2. Clean between your teeth daily 3. Eat Health foods and limit sugary beverages 4. Tejano Health 101 Interview: March is National Kidney Month! Did you know kidney disease is often referred to as a "silent disease," because there are usually no symptoms during its early stages? The federal reserve has hiked interest rates by one-quarter of a point. The move is meant to cool spending and make borrowing more expensive in an effort to bring down inflation.

That was down to 6 percent in February, compared to a 40-year high of 9-percent last June. Federal reserve chairman Jerome Powell says that future increases will depend largely on incoming data. However, the feds projections call for just one more rate hike for the rest of this year.
