Tejano Health 101 Interview: Yvonne Gutierrez Carrillo *Case Manager/Health Educator for Community Health Center of Lubbock* Breast Cancer Awareness Month 2023: Fast Facts About Breast Cancer

- Each year in the United States, about 264,000 women get breast cancer and 44,000 women die from the disease.
- Men also get breast cancer, but it is not very common. About 1 out of every 100 breast cancers diagnosed in the United States is found in a man.
- Most breast cancers are found in women who are 50 years old or older, but breast cancer also affects younger women.

What Are the Symptoms?

There are different <u>symptoms of breast cancer</u>, and some people have no symptoms at all. Symptoms can include—

- Any change in the size or the shape of the breast.
- Pain in any area of the breast.
- Nipple discharge other than breast milk (including blood).
- A new lump in the breast or underarm.

If you do not have symptoms, you should not assume that you do not have cancer. Regular screenings are always important. Your <u>doctor can check</u> for breast cancer before you have any noticeable symptoms. During your office visit, your doctor will ask about your personal and family medical history and perform a physical examination. <u>Mammograms</u> are the best way to find breast cancer early, when it is easier to treat and

before it is big enough to feel or cause symptoms. If indicated, a biopsy is the only test that can diagnose breast cancer.

If cancer is diagnosed, treatments include the following:

Surgery, radiation therapy, hormone therapy, and chemotherapy. November is National Diabetes Month, a time when communities across the country seek to bring attention to diabetes. This year's focus is on taking action to prevent diabetes health problems. Diabetes is a disease that occurs when your blood glucose, also called blood sugar, is too high. It affects about 37 million Americans, including adults and youth. Diabetes can damage the eyes, kidneys, nerves, and heart, and it is linked to some types of cancer. There is good news: Taking charge of your health may help you prevent diabetes health problems.

1)Manage your blood glucose, blood pressure, and cholesterol levels.

Diabetes ABCs:

- A is for the <u>A1C test</u> that health care professionals use to measure your average blood glucose levels. Some people with diabetes also use devices to track their blood glucose throughout the day and night.
- B is for blood pressure.
- C is for cholesterol.
- 2) Take small steps toward healthy habits: Planning healthy meals, Being physically active, Getting enough sleep, and Not smoking
 - 3) Take your medicines on time.
 - 4) Reach or maintain a healthy weight.
 - 5) Take care of your mental health.
 - 6) Work with your health care team.

December National Safe Toys and Gifts Month

Safe Toys & Gifts Month focuses on raising awareness about the importance of selecting toys and gifts that meet safety standards and

align with a child's age and developmental stage. Safe Toys & Gifts Month is an annual observance dedicated to promoting the safety of toys and gifts for children, particularly during the holiday season. Follow these guidelines:

- 1. Inspect all toys before purchasing.
- 2. Be diligent about inspecting toys your child has received.
- 3. Look for labels that assure you the toys have passed a safety inspection
- 4. Gifts of sports equipment should always be accompanied by protective gear
- 5. Riding toys, skateboards and in-line skates go fast, and falls could be deadly. Helmets and safety gear should be worn properly at all times and they should be sized to fit.
- 6. Keep kids safe from lead in toys
- 7. Do NOT give toys with small parts, like magnets and "button" batteries, to young children as they tend to put things in their mouths

Once gifts are open:

- Immediately discard plastic wrapping or other toy packaging before the wrapping and packaging become dangerous play things.
- Keep toys appropriate for older children away from younger siblings.
- Battery charging should be supervised by adults. Chargers and adapters can pose thermal burn hazards to young children. Pay attention to instructions and warnings on battery chargers. Some chargers lack any mechanism to prevent overcharging.

The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) closely monitors and regulates toys. Check the CPSC website for the latest information about toy recalls or call their hotline at (800) 638-CPSC to report a toy you think is unsafe.
