CASA has evolved and grown over the years in pursuit of serving every child in foster care in our community. In an effort to serve more children, and in honor of CASA's 30th anniversary, CASA of the South Plains is making an appeal to fill its July training session with 30 community members who are passionate about making a difference in the South Plains. These individuals will help make sure the children in foster care in our community are not forgotten.

A CASA, or Court Appointed Special Advocate, is a volunteer who helps a child in foster care navigate the child welfare system and ensures their needs are being met while working to help find a safe, permanent home for the child. While CASA Volunteers were able to serve over 400 children in foster care in the South Plains last year, there are still over 500

vulnerable children that did not receive the gift of a CASA to advocate for their best interest. To honor its 30 years of serving children, CASA of the South Plains needs the community's help to meet its need for 30 new CASA Volunteers who are committed to making an impact in the lives of children who are desperately seeking a sense of hope and normalcy. Prospective volunteers are urged to attend a CASA 101 Informational Session hosted by CASA of the South Plains in June and July. There are various information sessions available in Lubbock at the CASA office at 4601 S Loop 289, Suite 25. CASA is also heading to Plainview to host two CASA 101's to make it more convenient for Hale County community members!

Information sessions are a great, no-obligation introduction to CASA and its mission. CASA staff and current Advocates will be present to discuss the imperative need for volunteers, what it means to be a CASA, and how community members can help make a life-changing difference in the lives of children in foster care in the South Plains.

Due to soggy and muddy conditions, City refuse trucks aren't able to travel some alleys to pick up residential trash dumpsters as regularly as expected. Due to rain saturation, the city has also had to amend operating hours at the landfills at various times.

We ask citizens to please be patient while City crews work to get trash picked up, and back on the regular schedule.

The scorching temperatures can be uncomfortable, but they can also be deadly. Lubbock's Adult Protective Services is working to keep one of our most vulnerable populations safe: our elderly neighbors.

Stephanie Bolton, the supervisor of Unit 26 for APS, says elderly people are more susceptible to dehydration, fatigue and heat stroke.

Bolton says it is important to use the **Buddy System**:

- Check in on older family, friends and neighbors daily.
- Encourage them to stay hydrated, wear lightweight, loose-fitting clothing, use cool washcloths and turn on the fan.
- If they do not have an air conditioner, remind them they can go to places like the public library or the mall to cool off.

"Just checking on your neighbor, making sure that everyone is safe and hydrated and cool enough is super important," Bolton said.
