MICHELLE TETER CBCO BLOOD DONATIONS

The need for blood is an ongoing situation according to a local blood agency.

Michelle Teter, Community Relations Representative for the Community Blood Center of the Ozarks, says during an interview on KRZK's "Ozarks Now" program that 200 donations are needed per day to help keep the supplies adequate for the 44 area hospitals the CBCO provides blood for in southern Missouri and northern Arkansas.

Teter says that people have been slow to donate blood again and that organizations are just beginning to host drives again after the COVID-19 Pandemic.

Three blood drives are in the region this week, today at Branson Tri-Lakes News office from 11-5, Thursday at Cox Medical Center Branson from 11-5, and Friday at the White River Valley Electric office from 8-2. Other drives will be coming up in both Arkansas and Missouri over the next several weeks.

JASON OUTMAN, CHAMBER MARKETING AGREEMENT

On January 18, 2021, Jason Outman began his tenure as the President/CEO of the Branson Lakes Area Chamber of Commerce/CVB.

On the two-year anniversary of his hire Wednesday, Outman joined KRZK's Ozarks Now program just as he did when that show debut two years ago. Outman talked about the transition of Branson after the COVID-19 Pandemic and how there seems to be no end in sight to visitors wanting to enjoy all of the attractions, shows, outdoors, and other opportunities for vacation in the region.

Outman did talk about recent discussions with the City of Branson, who contracts with the chamber for marketing. Several of those meetings between the two became contentious and intense, though Outman says since those October meetings, both sides had several discussions to clear things up which included a six hour conversation with Branson Mayor Larry Milton. Outman says the new contract with Branson is in place and hope to have a renewed marketing contract with the Tourism Community Enhancement District ready by the time the current contract runs out in April.

The Taney County Health Department is offering a program to equip individuals going through a rough time.

Q.P.R., which stands for Question, Persuade, Refer, is a training program that will help individuals recognize a real crisis that people may be going through that could lead to suicide. Kara Miller and Omar Perez Rivera of the Health Department, during an interview on the "At Your Service" Podcast, describe the program as similar to CPR and applying that principal to a person going through a mental crisis. According to statistics, Suicide is the ninth leading cause of death in Missouri and is the second leading cause for young people ages 10-17. Miller and Rivera say it is those statistics that led the Health Department to make this program available to the community.

LADELLA THOMAS, STONE COUNTY DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES BOARD APRIL 4th BALLOT ISSUE

The Stone County Developmental Disability Board will be asking voters to renew the Tax Levy that funds the services they provide.

Organization Director LaDella Thomas, during a recent interview on KRZK's "Ozarks Now" program, says that the levy was first passed in 2016 which led to the formation of of the board two years later. The original levy is set to expire in 2026 with Thomas saying the board decided to go for the renewal now in order to continue with future planning for programs that is already underway. The renewal will be at the same rate as the current levy.

Thomas says SCDDB has served over 170 individuals with at least 330 more that are needed to be served. The board currently runs or partners with organizations to provide services in 10 different areas.
