The second of two national Drug Take Back events are coming up this weekend.

The federal Drug Enforcement Agency promotes events around the country which are spearheaded by local organizations.

Taney County ADAPT will conduct three drop-offs on Saturday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm at Walgreen Pharmacies in both Branson and Hollister as well as Lakeland Pharmacy in Branson. During a recent visit to KRZK's Ozarks Now Program, ADAPT co-chairs Heather Lyons Burney and Marietta Hagan talked about the dangers of keeping unused prescription medications in the house and the possibility of them being used by accident or stolen for illegal use. They also discussed the dangers to the environment if drugs are not disposed of properly.

Meanwhile, Kyle Evatt and Kelly Light of the North Arkansas Partnership for Health Education, discussed the Arkansas event during an interview on KHOZ's "Around the Table" which includes the event taking place at Harrison City Hall this Saturday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm.

Skaggs Foundation Healthcare Grants

The Skaggs Foundation has awarded the Legacy Grants for the upcoming year.

Last week, the foundation awarded a total of 33 grants totaling over \$974,000 to organizations working to improve health and wellness in Stone and Taney counties. These projects, plus four multi-year grants that will continue into the coming grant year, are estimated to impact more than 50,000 lives.

According to a release, access to care continues to be one of the biggest challenges Skaggs Foundation is confronting. Among the grants being awarded to address this concern is a two-year award to the Mark Twain School District fund the hiring of a school nurse and equipment for that position.

The renewal of the Tourism Tax within the Tourism Community Enhancement District that includes the City of Branson, the Village of Indian Point, and other portions of Stone and Taney Counties will be on the ballot. The sales tax is 1% and goes to the marketing of the region and administered by the TCED Board.

The Taney County Partnership is one of the groups advocating for the renewal of the tax which has been in place since 2006. Jonas Arjes, Director of the Partnership, during a recent interview on KRZK's "Ozarks Now" program, said that the tax is separate from the Branson Tourism Tax and that it is important to keep it in place to continue to promote the region amid other vacation destinations also going for the visitor dollars.

Brian Seitz, 156th State Rep, Bills Impacting Lakes Region

Missouri Lakes Area State Representative Brian Seitz is happy with legislation passed in 2023 and hopes to see more in 2024 that will benefit the region.

During Seitz's recent visit to KRZK's "Ozarks Now" program, he talked about the Entertainment Investment Act that will help create incentives for entertainment companies to produce films and television shows in Missouri, similar to what other states like Georgia and Oklahoma already have in place.

Seitz also talked about the Save Women Sports Act also passed and signed by Governor Mike Parson to protect the fairness of competition between men and women.

Seitz also discussed some bills he has pre-filed for 2024 including the Personhood Bill designed to represent life prior to birth. Seitz also has refiled a bill that would proportion distributions of transportation tax funds to come back to areas based on traffic size instead of population size. Seitz says visitor areas like Branson, and Lake of the Ozarks for example have lower base populations than the number of visitors.

College of the Ozarks Grant for Nursing Program

Governor Mike Parson announces \$5 million in grant funding for 20 Missouri colleges and universities to continue enhancing nursing education programs statewide.

These 20 competitive grants were part of a special appropriation to the Missouri State Board of Nursing that was recommended and approved by Governor Parson.

Two of those programs are in the region. The College of the Ozarks Nursing program received a grant totaling \$165,590 while Missouri State University received \$394,772.

The nursing programs that were awarded funds will provide scholarships and tuition assistance for nursing faculty, clinical simulation equipment and staffing, technology enhancements, faculty pay increases, nursing faculty professional development, and graduate nursing program development to educate more nursing faculty.

Branson Airport Hopes for Sun Air Success

The numbers of passengers flying in and out of the Branson Airport are not what was projected when the airport first opened in 2009, but current management hopes the recent success of Sun Country Air will turn the tide.

In a recent investigative feature report by Ozarks First, Airport Director Stan Field says that Sun Country's passenger numbers have been good and he hopes that the momentum will lead to interests from other airlines to provide service. Field adds that though the airport has faced an uphill battle since it opened, things were trending in a positive direction until COVID hit in 2020 and disrupted the airline industry.

The report details the history of airlines that have served the airport and including Airtran, Southwest, and Frontier and tracked numbers of passengers passed on what has been paid to the airport by the City of Branson per an agreement that has the city pay \$8.24 per outbound passenger.
