Branson Alderman Approve Affordable Housing plan	News	7/24/19	Daily Newscasts	:30 seconds	After a unanimous vote, the Branson Board of Alderman approved an affordable housing plan that would build a new 400 unit affordable housing complex. The homes would be 1,000 to 1,200 square feet, with two bathrooms and an attached one-car garage. Debra Hart, a member

					of Branson Affordable Housing LLC said the tax credit will assist families at or below 60% of the median income and also those up to 80% in what they call workforce units. The goal would be to make the area look like a market-rate housing so that there is no stigma. This would be a mixed-income area with some low income and some market value.
