Ride the Ducks Boat Tragedy	News	7/21-30/18	Daily Newscasts	:30	The Ride the Ducks boat tragedy that took place on July 19, 2018 was the subject of over a dozen newscasts on KOMC, KRZK and KCAX in July and into August, as well as wall to wall news coverage the morning after, July 20th. The accident was a tragedy that impacted the residents of our area with anguish and sadness. The community united with candlelight vigils, prayer services and a number of benefits for both the families impacted and the men and women in our local emergency management services. Our news stories provided information on the accident itself, the victims and the survivors, interviews with law enforcement and fire departments as well as area agencies providing help and many fund raisers and benefits. Interviews included those with Stone Co. Sheriff Doug Radar and other members of the EMS, as well as survivors and friends of the victims of the tragedy.

This report is on the special annual memorial service hosted by College of the Ozarks to honor those fallen on that day. The victims of the plane crashes, destruction of the Twin Towers as well as our firefighters and law enforcement individuals that gave their lives to help others. This story on the "Lest We Forget 911 Memorial" featured interviews with Branson Fire Chief Ted Martin, as well as C of O President, Dr. Jerry Davis.

Arkansas Minimum Wage Increase	News	7/31/18 8/29/18 9/28/18	Daily Newscasts	:30	A measure to gradually increase the minimum wage in Arkansas passed to make it to the ballot in the general election. Arkansas For a Fair Wage worked on collecting signatures to push the measure to the November ballot. An interview with Kristin Foster, who is part of a coalition heading the measure, is included in the August 29 th story. She tells that one in four Arkansas children go to bed hungry and the increased wage will work to combat this problem.
