Presidential Debates

Program: Perspectiva Nacional (Segment #1, 9:00)

When: October 9, 2016 6:00 AM

We discuss the only debate between the vice-presidential candidates, the Democrat Tim Kaine and Republican Mike Pence. We also talk about what to expect in the second presidential debate between Hillary Clinton and Donald Trump. Luis Quinonez, a member of the Hispanic Advisory Committee for Trump and José Aristimuño, Director of Hispanic Media for the Democratic National Committee talk about this second presidential debate and other electoral issues.

Trump versus GOP and Wiki Leaks versus Clinton
