THE PROBLEM IS, ALL THESE VICTIMS AREN'T OUT WORKING TRUCK STOPS OR STROLLING ALONG AURORA AVENUE. MORE AND MORE, CUSTOMERS ARE BUYING SEX ... ONLINE.

CRAIGSLIST CLOSED DOWN ITS EROTIC ENCOUNTERS SECTION BECAUSE IT HAD BECOME A CONDUIT FOR SEX TRAFFICKERS. BUT THERE ARE DOZENS OF OTHER SITES WHERE PRICES AND PICTURES ARE POSTED - ALL CLAIM THE GIRLS ARE OVER 18, BUT LT SANO SAYS THAT'S NOT ALWAYS TRUE.

COPS WHO WORK THIS BEAT KNOW ALL TOO WELL HOW HARD IT CAN BE TO CONVINCE THESE YOUNG VICTIMS TO TESTIFY IN COURT - EVEN AFTER THEY'VE BEEN RESCUED. AND THE TRAGFIC REALITY IS, MANY CHILD PROSTITUTES END UP BACK ON THE STREET.
