Quarterly Issues Programs List for Station – WLTL-FM October 1 – December 31, 2023

# Section I. Issues.

The station has identified the following issues as significant issues facing our community in this quarter:

- **A.** WLTL News: WLTL aired multiple news programs that examined issues and current events with an emphasis on the local community.
- **B.** With Good Reason: WLTL aired *With Good Reason*, a program that features scholarly research alongside interviews with experts about a variety of topics.
- **C. Civic Cipher:** WLTL aired *Civic Cipher*, a program that addresses issues impacting the black and brown communities.
- **D. Deutsche Welle:** WLTL aired various Deutsche Welle programs that examined current affairs and relevant topics.
- **E. Public Service Announcements:** WLTL aired public service announcements from various local and national nonprofit organizations.
- F. LTHS Sports: As always, the community asks WLTL to provide live play-by-play coverage of LTHS sports. WLTL was able to meet the community's request by airing football, soccer, and basketball.

### Section II. Responsive Programs.

The station has broadcast programming dealing with each of the issues referenced above. Programming dealing with each issue is detailed below.

A. WLTL News:

**Public affairs program** – WLTL aired five one-hour installments of *WLTL News*. Hosted by Jack Hull, these programs included interviews with Lyons Township High School staff and community members, dialogue with LTHS students, and coverage of LTHS, local, national, and international news. *WLTL News* aired on October 22, November 5, November 19, December 10, and December 17.

# B. With Good Reason:

**Public affairs program** – WLTL aired *With Good Reason* on Saturdays at 6 am. *With Good Reason* is a one-hour program hosted by Sarah McConnell that examines a variety of topics by featuring scholarly research and interviews with experts. *With Good Reason* aired on October 7, October 14, October 21, October 28, November 4, November 11, November 18, December 2, December 9, and December 16.

# C. Civic Cipher:

**Public affairs program** – WLTL aired *Civic Cipher* on Saturdays at 7 am. *Civic Cipher* is a one-hour program hosted by Q Ward and Ramses Ja that addresses issues impacting the black and brown communities through long-form conversations. *Civic Cipher* aired on October 7, October 14, October 21, October 28, November 4, November 11, November 18, December 2, December 9, and December 16.

# D. Deutsche Welle:

**Public affairs/news programs** – WLTL aired Deutsche Welle programs on Sundays at 7 am. WLTL aired various one-hour Deutsche Welle programs that examined current affairs and relevant topics. Deutsche Welle programs aired on October 8, October 15, October 22, October 29, November 5, November 12, November 19, December 3, December 10, and December 17.

### E. Public Service Announcements:

WLTL aired public service announcements for various nonprofit organizations. PSAs aired twice per hour every day from October 1 to November 19 for an approximate total of forty hours of airtime during that period.

**Meet The Need:** In addition to regularly aired PSAs, WLTL conducted a public service campaign for local nonprofit organizations. From November 20 to December 31, WLTL aired two PSAs dedicated to local nonprofits per hour. This totaled over fifty hours of airtime during that period.

### F. LTHS Student Sports:

LTHS community members consistently ask WLTL to provide play-by-play coverage of LTHS sports. WLTL was able to meet this need by broadcasting the following this quarter: **Football:** WLTL aired four football games for a total of twelve hours of airtime. **Soccer:** WLTL aired two soccer games for a total of three hours of airtime. **Basketball:** WLTL aired three basketball games for a total of six hours of airtime.
